track of reservations for social events, and more – too numerous to list.

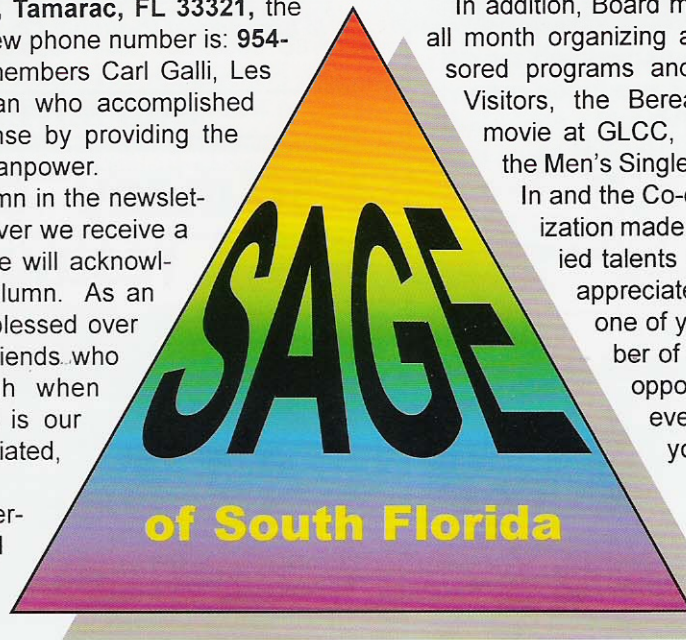
