TIME FOR SERIOUS CHUTZPAH WE CARE ABOUT YOU!

Being an effective caregiver is a proactive job. It is imperative the caregiver becomes an expert on the disease, particularly when the person with the disease is physically and emotionally drained from the diagnosis and treatment. This means reading the consumer oriented literature from the various relevant organizations such as the National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, The American Cancer Society or the National Institutes of Health, plus reading the professional literature.

Some of this literature is available on the general search engines such as Google or Yahoo, but it is also useful to try the sites medical professionals use such as MEDLINE and MEDLARS. In some instances, relevant articles may only be available as abstracts online so to read the full text it will be necessary to go to a hospital or university library. My experience has been that librarians are exceptionally helpful in assisting you to acquire virtually any article.

Understanding these articles will be a new challenge. Initially many of them will, because of their technical nature, appear to be gibberish. However, within a few weeks of starting this self-education project the articles will start making some sense. A final way to educate yourself is to attend professional meetings or at least obtain the professional meeting abstracts, the reason for this is also to identify,

meet and talk with the cutting edge researchers.

Do not be a passive recipient of care. Ask questions, consider alternative approaches, and get second opinions. When some one you love is receiving care for a serious illness, they are often in a dependent and weakened state and the caregiver is the advocate. Effective advocacy is not about winning a popularity contest for the most compliant patient, but rather always finding out what is in the best interests of the patient.

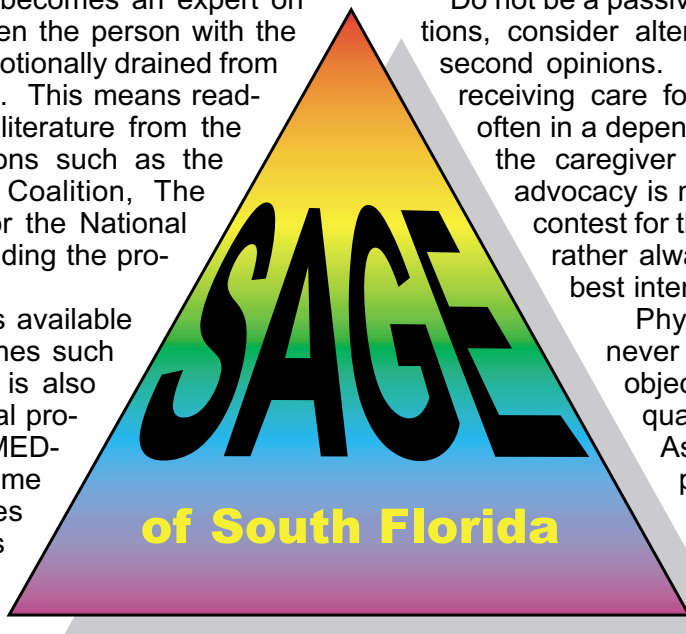
Physician loyalty is good, but never put that ahead of the main objective; that is getting the best quality care for your loved one.

Assertiveness is also making phone calls to strangers, particularly researchers, who maybe working on something you want to know about. I have done this numerous times and

always found that a polite and honest conversation about a loved one's health will be well received. Since time is both your best friend and worst enemy, it is imperative that caregivers be knowledgeable about what is being developed.

Anyone who has a diagnosis of cancer is fearful and often angry. Why me, is a common question? Some people with cancer also blame others; "if there wasn't so much stress in my life, I wouldn't

now be sick." My experiences suggest that all you can do is validate that fear or anger. Trying to be logical or scientific does nothing but add fuel to the fear or anger. If possible, some type of therapy, particularly support groups for the entire family, should be considered.

In most instances, the caregiver is equally fearful and angry. While it is clearly useful to share these emotions with therapists and in a caregiver support group, one should be more circumspect in sharing it with the patient. Frankly, they have enough on their plate dealing with their own issues. As another friend put it simply, "The caregiver has to be the rock, the foundation of the family, and who needs a crumbling foundation?"

Under no circumstances should you become a hermit. Don't be afraid to tell people what you are going through. By opening up to my colleagues and friends, I found them to be an enormous source of support for which I will be eternally grateful.

May each of us "be the change we want to see". ■

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT?

This is the first in a series of articles designed to inform SAGE members about organizations and groups that are out there working toward making life better for the GLBT community. We will also provide contact information if you want more details about the group.

This month we highlight LGAIN! This is part of a much larger group, the American Society on Aging (ASA). As a constituent group within ASA, LGAIN (the Lesbian and Gay Aging Issues Network) works to raise awareness about the concerns of the gay, lesbian, transgender, and bisexual elders, and about the unique barriers they encounter in gaining access to housing, health care, long term care, and other needed services.

Founded in 1994, to serve those 50 plus, LGAIN reaches out to GLBT organizations and to the media to create greater understanding of the needs of GLBT elders.

The group has recently completed the first study of Lesbian and Gay Baby Boomers. With huge numbers of baby boomers reaching their senior years it is important that GLBT concerns are addressed in planning for this population. The group is also addressing the issues of minority GLBT seniors. Through the Network of Multicultural Aging, the SEOC (serving elders of color), and the online multicultural aging network, LGAIN attempts to reach ALL of the many pieces that make the GLBT community such a rich and diverse one.

LGAIN provides opportunities through its publications, web resources, conferences, and networking to open dialogues on GLBT issues in the field of aging. The participation of all concerned individuals without regard to age, sexual orientation, or gender identity is encouraged.

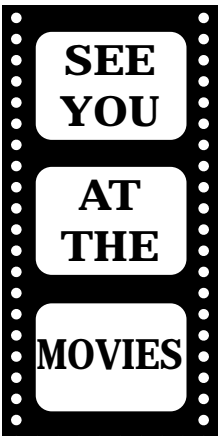

There's no complexity here: Good is good. Bad is bad. And we can all feel good at the end. After all, "Flash...He'll save everyone of us" is the tag line.

Come cheer on the two leads: **Sam Jones** (as Flash, the extremely beautiful, hunky football player turned space warrior) who beat out Kurt Russell for the role; and **Melody Anderson** (as the pretty, petite Dale Arden, who grows stronger as the tale progresses). Come boo the scenery-chewing **Max Von Sydow**, who plays Ming the Merciless, Emperor of the Planet Mongo; and **Ornella Muti** (then voted "Most Beautiful Woman in the World") who plays his daughter, Princess Aura.

With an admittedly silly plot (the quarterback of the New York Jets has one day to save Earth from total annihilation); cartoon violence; fun guest stars (**Timothy Dalton, Brian Blessed, and Topol**); action (the "Football Fight" in Ming's palace; the leather-clad flying Hawkmen archers); PG-13 situations (Princess Aura trying to seduce Flash in her rocket; Ming trying to seduce Dale in his bedroom) this is the very definition of a "popcorn movie".

Directed by **Mike Hodges**, this "Flash" went on to be nominated for 3 **BAFTA Awards**, winning for its fabulous musical score by **"Queen"** (with **Freddie Mercury**). Also a winner of the 1980 British Society of Cinematographers Award for Best Cinematography (**Gil Taylor**), this is a visually stunning movie, and a fun way to jump start spring. 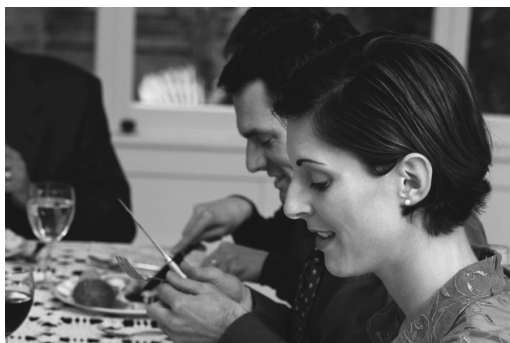

Our **Annual Meeting at "Tropical Acres"** was divine. With **"Electra"** there how could it have been otherwise? She was amazing. And your new Board promises to be equally as amazing.

For those who live here, April brings a respite from chilly weather, and some beautiful days before the heat of summer. It puts us in a more relaxed mood, and gives us a chance to get some fresh air. GAY AND LESBIAN RIGHT PIONEER DIES AT 75!

Barbara Gittings noted gay rights pioneer, died on Saturday, February 18, 2007, after a long battle with breast cancer. Ms. Gittings was one of the earliest lesbian activists in the country. In 1958, she founded the New York chapter of the famed Daughters of Bilitis. She served as its president for three years, and edited their publication "The Ladder" from 1963-66. She was also among a small group of early activists who organized a picket line to protest gay discrimination. The group established the first picket line outside Independence Hall in Philadelphia on July 4, 1965. This was the first of many high profile protests that began the struggle for gay rights in the U.S. The fact that for the first time homosexuals were demanding equal rights was revolutionary at that time. At the time Gittings was quoted as stating "We have cracked the cocoon of invisibility. We are finally stepping forward and saying to the public, 'I'm not going to live in the closet anymore. It's stuffy in there.' And I am not going to continue to live my life under a rock to protect your feelings. I'm going to live the way I want to, openly and proudly as a gay person."

Gittings later played a major role in the American Psychiatric Association's de-listing homosexuality as a mental disorder in 1973. Ms Gittings is survived by her life partner of 46 years, Kay Lahusen. It's individuals like Barbara who led the struggle and to whom we all owe a debt of gratitude! ■
