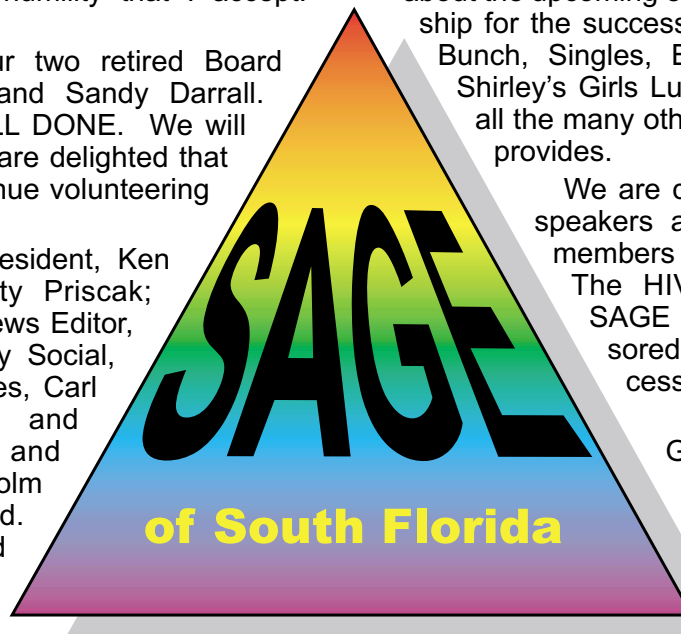

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT?

Most of us grew up in an age where it was not easy to be an out and proud gay person. Many states even had laws making homosexuality illegal and the law enforcement communities as well as the court system were hostile to us.

Today, much of this has changed and we have many legal protections and the attitudes of not only the legal system, but the public in general, have changed. We are not truly full and equal citizens yet in many areas. We still must fight for things like adoption rights (in Florida specifically), job protections, discrimination because of HIV status, and other important legal rights.

We are fortunate to have a national organization that focuses on these issues. Lambda Legal is the oldest national organization pursuing high-impact litigation, public education, and advocacy on behalf of the LGBT community. Lambda works to change policies, laws, and ideas. They offer information and resources to people seeking legal help through a telephone help desk and a wide variety of educational publications. Based in New York, but with four regional offices in Atlanta, Dallas, Chicago and Los Angeles, their legal experts select the cases and issues that will have the greatest impact in protecting and advancing the rights of LGBT people and those with HIV.

Lambda also maintains a national network of volunteer Cooperating Attorneys, which widens the scope of their legal work and allows attorneys, legal workers, and law students to become involved and have access to their legal staff.

Before there was "Mame" the wonderful Broadway Musical (starring Angela Lansbury) or the Miscast Movie Musical (starring Lucille Ball), there was the novel by Edward Everett Tanner (AKA: "Patrick Dennis") who based the character on his own real-life aunt, Marian Tanner; but mostly created his beloved Aunt Mame Dennis from sheer imagination. A play and then a movie followed. Both starred **Rosalind Russell**, in one of her defining roles as the madcap, do-anything love-everyone **Mame** we've all come to adore. With a wonderful supporting cast that includes **Forrest Tucker** (Beauregard Jackson Picket

Burnside), **Coral Brown** (Vera Charles), **Jan Handzlik** (Patrick Dennis - younger), **Roger Smith** (Patrick Dennis - older), and **Peggy Cass** (Agnes Gooch), this is a thoroughly entertaining and captivating film.

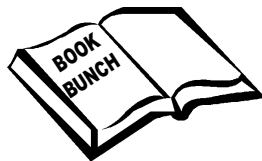
Directed by **Morton DaCosta**, it was **nominated for six 1959 Oscars**, including Best Film, Best Actress and Best Supporting Actress; **winning for Best Art Direction - Set Decoration, by Malcolm C. Bert & George James Hopkins**. It also went on to **win two 1959 Golden Globes: for Best Motion Picture-Comedy and Best Actress - Comedy/Musical**.

Rosalind Russell makes this film her own: From grand dame to low-brow, she is "Auntie Mame" – and anyone who misses it is "just a poor S.O.B. starving to death." (She even incorporated a line from another film into this: "Nuts?" used to interrupt and insult poor Mr. Babcock, was used against her, 20 years earlier, in "The Women".)

BOOK BUNCH NEWS:

May is a wonderful time of year. Spring is in the air, at least in some parts of the country. We who live in South Florida can enjoy the last few bearable days outside before the summer heat arrives in force. Many of us also turn to lighter fare for our "summer" reading. One of the most entertaining and interesting genre is the "gay mystery." Mystery has been popular ever since that first "gay" pair of Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson first graced the page over 100 years ago.



The modern gay mystery follows much the same format that has proved tried and true. Several series are currently available that might peak your interest. I offer a brief sampling of what's out there.

We have the "grande dame" of lesbian mystery writers, Katherine Forrest, who has been turning them out since the early 1980's. Two of note are her "The Beverly Malibu" (1989) and "Murder at the Neighborhood Bar" (1987). she has recently added another to her lengthy body of work, "Hancock Park," featuring her sleuth, Kate Delafield.

Another author of note, Patricia Highsmith, whose series of five books featuring Tom Ripley (think Matt Damon in the film), have enjoyed a new life since the film. Though created in the 1950's, this amoral character still fascinates us.

In the male department we have the ever popular Michael Nava's gay investigator, Henry Rios. This character appears in a series of mysteries ending in 2001 with "Rag & Bone." Then there is R.D. Zimmerman who wrote four books set in Minneapolis and featuring gay TV reporter, Todd Mills.

This month's Book Bunch selection is a classic by Carson McCullers, "Reflection in a Golden Eye." This 1941 work created a scandal at the time for its subject matter, but TIME Magazine called it "a work told with simplicity, insight, and a rare gift of phrase." Join us May 12 at 2:00 PM at Border's Books on Sunrise Blvd. in Ft. Lauderdale. All are welcome. **This is a SAGE sponsored activity.** ■

The May dinner will be held on Monday, May 28. Dinner starts promptly at 6:30PM. Dinner attendees are requested to wear a red shirt.

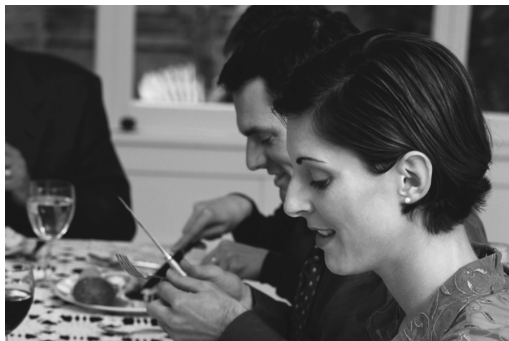
