## MY SOUTHERN PROFILE You Ask - I Listen - I Respond

I was born seventy-three years ago in a 125 acre farm in a moderate size farm house 65 miles north of Jackson, Mississippi. My family knew the doctor quite well so he came to the house to make my delivery. I am one of three children. I have a brother 5 years older who is married and has 6 children, and a brother 5 years younger who is gay. He and his life partner have been together for 38 years. I think my parents counted the years as we are almost exactly 5 years apart. I am very lucky that over the years we have all remained close.

My parents were very hard workers. In the Spring, Summer and Fall my father worked the farm but in the winter he worked carpentry. He was an excellent carpenter. Mother hated to see him go away to work but he wanted our place to be clear of mortgage so he told mother just this last winter of working and it would be paid in full AND IT WAS.

We lost our father in an automobile accident that Christmas Eve as he was on his way home. I was only 9 years old which made my older brother 14, younger brother 5. Mother was strong for us. She gave each of us our special chores to do. She kept the farm. Turned part into a tree farm and part into a fruit orchard. The balance we farmed ourselves.

We had chickens, pigs, horses, raised cotton, corn, cane, potatoes, beans, watermelon, peanuts, squash, okra and much more. Yes, I picked cotton, pulled corn, shelled beans, helped my mother and brothers whenever and wherever I could.

Mother made sure we went to school every day and to church on Sunday. I finished school at age 16, went to Jones County Junior College, served in the Air Force for 3 years, attained my Pilot License with my VA benefits, retired from real estate about seven years ago.

NOW!! I am still enjoying life. It's my honor to be the President of SAGE of South Florida, Inc. It is a challenge which I enjoy. In addition, I have served on several boards of other organizations, and for the last five years I have studied at Light University, located on the campus of Sunshine Cathedral, to be ordained as a deacon.

I am going to achieve that honor June 10, 2007 at the 9:50 AM service. **YOU ARE INVITED!**

## DID YOU KNOW ABOUT THE STONEWALL LIBRARY?

One of the delights of living in a community with a large GLBT population is that it affords us a lot of resources smaller communities could not support. One of these is our Stonewall Library and Archives, housed for now at the GLCC on Andrews Avenue in Fort Lauderdale. The library opened its doors in 1984 on the grounds of the Sunshine Cathedral in Fort Lauderdale. In 2000 it moved to the GLCC building on Andrews Avenue and its mission is to collect, organize for use, and display materials to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender culture and history, support related research, and sponsor educational opportunities for all. The library now houses well over 18,000 volumes as well as 600 DVD's in its circulating collection. It also houses a special collection of 1,000 rare volumes in its "Special Collections." The Stonewall is one of the premier libraries of its type in the world. Membership is only \$25 for an individual and \$40 for a family.

Plans are well under way for the library to move by the end of the year to a larger space in the ArtServe building on Sunrise Boulevard in Fort Lauderdale. The new space will have 4,200 square feet as opposed to the current 2,600. This will allow the library to expand over the foreseeable future. The library is also in the midst of a membership drive to add 100 new members by the end of June. If you aren't a member please consider it. Contact them at 954-763-8565. It's resources like the Stonewall Library that makes this community such a rich and stimulating place to live. ■

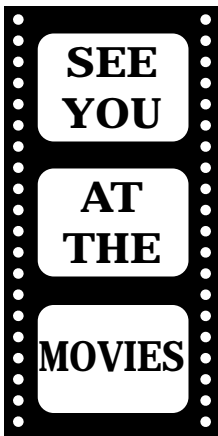

Monday, June 18th SAGE offers the stylized 2004 musical biopic *“De-Lovely.”* The story of gay icon **Cole Porter** (played by gay-friendly **Kevin Kline**) and his marriage to socialite Linda (played by a luminous **Ashley Judd**). Both nominated for Golden Globe Awards. Directed by **Irwin Winkler** and written by **Jay Cocks**, this is the story of a famous and arrogant gay man who loves his wife as much as

he can, and a woman who stays faithful to her husband despite knowing what life with him entails. For this movie the tagline is spot-on: **“A love that would never die - and music that would live forever.”** Sitting at his piano,

preparing to die, Cole Porter is visited by an “angel” (**Jonathan Pryce**, as Gabe) who reviews his life and career with him as though they were acts in a fantastical Broadway musical. Included in the cast: **Peter Polycarpou** as **Louis B. Mayer**; **Allan Corduner** as **Monty Woolley**; **Keith Allen** as **Irving Berlin**; **James Wilby** as **Edward Thomas**; and **Kevin McKiddy** (the hunky **Lucius Vorenus** from HBO’s *“Rome”*) as **Bobby Reed**. This is certainly one filmed musical from which you will come away humming the tunes, even if you can’t quite recall the names of the plays they come from. As far as the movie’s concerned, it’s a little avant-garde, but still near perfect. With a wink and a nod to musical conventions, it does not skimp on plot or character developmet or emotional resonance. *“It’s De-Lightful....It’s De-Licious....It’s De-Lovely...”*

## BOOK BUNCH NEWS:

I can’t believe it’s June already! This is the traditional Gay Pride month and celebrations will be going on in most major cities and even some smaller ones. We’ve come a long way since 1969’s Stonewall Riots. We also have a ways to go, especially in Florida where the Florida legislature has once again adjourned without repealing the ban on gay adoptions.



Stonewall has now receded into “history” for younger gays and lesbians. Individuals under 50 were not even born at the time so it isn’t surprising they have no idea how we arrived and where we are today as a community.

Fortunately, there are a lot of excellent books out there that explore the GLBT community. Here are a few to check out the next time you visit the library or book store. While the history of gay New York has been documented many times with books like *“The Gay Metropolis”* by Charles Kaiser, and *“Stonewall”* by Martin Duberman, the Los Angeles scene gets its full treatment in Lillian Faderman’s new *“Gay L.A.: A History of Sexual Outlaws, Power Politics, and Lipstick Lesbians.”* Author Neil Miller has written *“Out of the Past: Gay and Lesbian History from 1869 to the Present.”* This extensively researched work explores our history from Oscar Wilde to gay marriage.

*“Homosexuality and Civilization”* is Louis Crompton’s exhaustive study of GLBT world history. Then two classic works that still resonate today are Jonathan Ned Katz’s *“Gay American History,”* and John Boswell’s groundbreaking *“Christianity, Social Tolerance, and Homosexuality.”*

George Santayana said “Those who cannot learn from history are doomed to repeat it. Those who do not remember their past are condemned to repeat their mistakes.”

Join us on June 9 at 2 PM at Border’s Books on Sunrise Boulevard for another lively discussion. This month we look at the gay novel, *“The Back Passage”* a murder mystery by James Lear. **This is a SAGE sponsored activity.** ■
