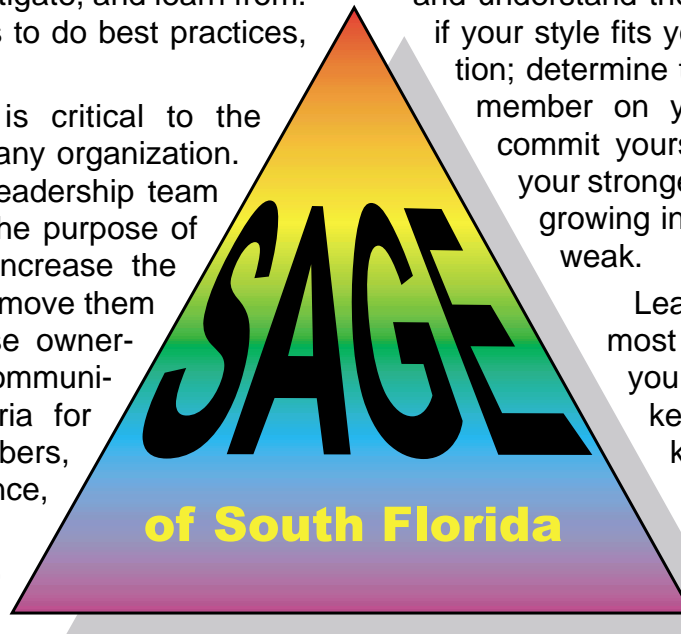
There are a number of leadership styles; visionary; directional; strategic; managing; moti-

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT BROWARD HOUSE?

While it is seldom on the front page these days, the HIV/AIDS crisis is far from over. Many of us remember when during the 1980's and early 1990's seldom a week went by without hearing of the loss of a friend, or acquaintance. It was a time that thankfully is in the past. However, the fight continues and one of the front line agencies continuing the battle is Broward House.

The mission of Broward House is to improve the lives of individuals living with or at risk for HIV/AIDS. They accomplish this work by providing a wide range of programs including community wide case management, substance abuse treatment, supportive and independent housing, intervention, mental health services, outreach/education, and transportation.

These services are provided at several sites throughout the county. Staff and volunteers help to insure the best possible care for the clients. Funding comes from the Ryan White Care Act and the Broward Hospital District, as well as through community contributions.

Many in the LGBT community continue to be at risk for HIV/AIDS. It does not discriminate by age, sex, race or sexual orientation. Everyone should know their HIV status. If you don't get tested! Free testing is readily available if funds are limited. Early treatment is critical to battling this disease.

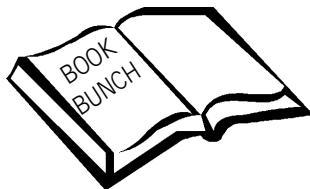

For example in just the last year we have had "**Brokeback Mountain**" based on Annie Proulx's book of the same name. The film was excellent as was the book. Then there was Augusten Burroughs' "**Running with Scissors**", great book, bad film. We also had the "**Painted Veil**", Somerset Maugham's take on a marriage gone wrong. Good book, decent film.

He is best known today for "**We Think the World of You**" a work that was made into a so-so film.

"**My Father and Myself**" is a comparison of a gay son and his probably closeted father (a fact not discovered until after the father's death). It's a look inside an Edwardian English family in the first half of the 20th century.

Our August 20th movie is one of the most acclaimed gay-themed movies of the last 5 years: **"LATTER DAYS"**. Among its first showings was the Fort Lauderdale International Film Festival. It went on to become an instant independent hit; and to moderate mainstream success afterwards.

Written and Directed by C. Jay Cox ("Sweet Home Alabama"), this is a romantic dramedy that shows what can

happen when "opposites attract". Aaron (Steve Sandvoss, "Rumor Has It") is a young, fresh-faced Mormon missionary who is proud of his religious upbringing - and passionate about film. Christian (Wes Ramsey, TV's "Charmed") is a charming but shallow West Hollywood gadabout, whose only concern is bedding someone different each night. That changes after the Mormons move next door. Taking a \$50 bet, Christian sets out to seduce Aaron. As the tagline says: "Aaron prays. Christian plays..."

There is nuance in what could have been simply titillating melodrama. Crises and near catastrophes follow, and there are some Mormon clichés (the excommunication takes place in a dark, cold space; the family's immediate reaction is one of abandonment) - but these are all leavened by good humor and a very humanistic directorial touch.

A wonderful, gay-friendly supporting cast including Amber Benson (the young Lesbian witch from TV's "Buffy..."), Joseph Gordon-Levitt (a gay hustler in "Mysterious Skin"), and the stunning Jacqueline Bisset

(who was able to get investors for this film) are on hand to see if Aaron and Christian can find what each one needs: each other...

Winner of 3 Best Gay Male Feature Audience Awards (L.A.; Toronto; Philadelphia), **"Latter Days"** screens at 4PM at the GLCC. Dinner follows. **This is a SAGE sponsored activity.** ■

Sexuality and Physical Changes With Aging

Sex and sexuality communicate a great deal: affection, love, esteem, warmth, sharing, and bonding, among other things. Age alone is no reason to change the sexual practices you have enjoyed throughout your life. However, you may need to make a few adjustments to accommodate physical changes or the effects of illnesses or medications.

Physical Changes in Women: Most physical changes take place after menopause as a result of decreased estrogen levels. It may take longer to become sexually excited, and skin may feel sensitive making contact less pleasurable. Not all women experience these problems; those who do can experiment to find ways to enjoy sex with the changes.



Physical Changes in Men: Though sexual response may slow down starting at age 50, a man's sexual drive is more likely to be affected by his health and his attitude about sex and intimacy than by his age. Though physiological changes may occur, most men remain physically able to have intercourse throughout their lives.



Cultural/Psychological Factors: A focus on youth in our culture may lead to the view that aging makes a person less of a sexual being. However, almost everyone has the capacity to find lifelong pleasure in sex. Physical and emotional needs change with time and circumstance. The issue here is one of choice. If you freely decide that sex is no longer right for you, then that is the correct decision. It is possible to have a fulfilling life without sex. However, if you choose to continue enjoying sex, you deserve support and encouragement.

Staying Sexual: Just as exercise is the key to maintaining fitness, having sex on a regular basis is the best way to maintain sexual capacity. And, just as it's never too late to start an exercise program, it's never too late to start having sex. Many older people who have been celibate for years develop satisfying sexual practices within new loving relationships. For others, masturbation is common and poses no health risks or side effects.

* The mind is an erogenous zone. Fantasy and imagination help arouse some people.

* Many medications inhibit sexual response. Ask your doctor for advice about side effects.

* For dryness, try a water-based lubricant. A doctor can also prescribe a vaginal cream containing estrogen, which will help reverse the changes in vaginal tissues.

* Depending on the severity of your illness, your doctor may recommend that you abstain from sex for only a brief time following treatment for heart attack. If you have angina, ask your doctor about taking nitroglycerin before you have sex. Do not take sildenafil citrate (Viagra) if you are using nitroglycerin.

* If arthritis is a problem, experiment with different positions. Try placing cushions under the hips. For pain, several home treatments are available that you may wish to explore.

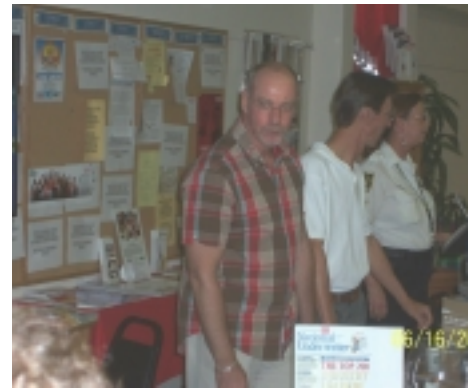
* Drink alcohol only in moderation. Though small amounts may help by lowering inhibitions, larger amounts may actually decrease sexual performance.

* Colostomies, mastectomies, and other procedures that involve changes in physical appearance need not put an end to sexual pleasure. Communicating openly about your fears and expectations can bring you and your partner closer and help you overcome barriers.

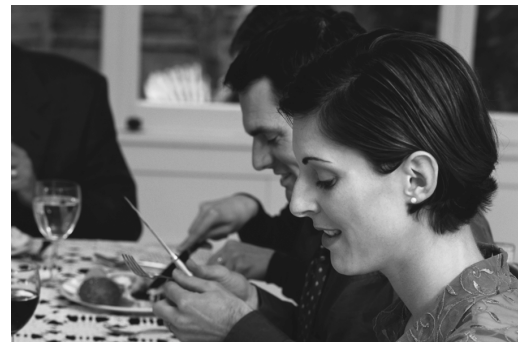
