AUTUMNAL EQUINOX

THANKSGIVING SURVIVAL GUIDE

Thanksgiving: food, football, and family. If all of the above sound less than fun, perhaps it's time for you to throw your own party and give thanks for being queer. Here are a few suggestions from PlanetOut:

1. Bizarrely enough, it's as easy to cook Thanksgiving dinner for 12 as it is to cook for four. It's a great time to bring together friends from different times and places. Invite anyone you know who's new in town. Be prepared for extra last-minute guests and changes of plans -- someone always decides on Wednesday not to go home for the holidays.

2. The potluck may be an old-school lesbian stereotype, but at Thanksgiving it's a no-brainer. When your guests ask what they can bring, tell them. Be specific. Otherwise you'll end up with eight bottles of wine and no pumpkin pie. (Whether that's a problem is up to you.)

3. It's not too late to plan ahead. Order your turkey (or Tofurkey) ASAP. Buy a Thanksgiving issue of Bon Appetit or Gourmet -- look for the one with the clearest step-by-step instructions. 6. Do yourself a favor and invest in some good-quality paper plates and plastic knives and forks. There'll be so much food on the plates, no one will even notice. Buy a couple of big bouquets of flowers and leave the decorating at that.

7. Don't plan on party games or an after-dinner hike. Everyone will eat a ton and end up capable of nothing but lounging on every free surface of your living room for hours. Let them linger, and leave the dishes until Friday. ■

DID YOU KNOW ABOUT FAMILY PRIDE?

There are many organizations that work for LGBT Rights, both locally, statewide and nationally. One of the lesser known groups is Family Pride, based in Washington DC. With a yearly budget of \$1.5 million this group has a mission to achieve full equality for LGBT headed families in the next 20 years by building community and defeating federal and state anti family legislation.

The organization started out as a support group for gay parents. In 2005 it expanded its mission to include political initiatives aimed at gaining rights for families headed by gays.

One recent initiative was the annual White House Easter Egg Roll, in which gay parents and their children participated wearing rainbow leis. The event cost nothing and resulted in over \$1 million in additional donations for the organization. ■

BOOK BUNCH NEWS:

November already! Holidays around the corner! Make sure you take some time for yourself, and relaxing with a good book is an excellent way to do that. Much of what's written with a gay audience in mind takes place in New York, Los Angeles, or San Francisco. But most of us come from other places and our experiences while similar may not be the same.



There is the small town experience, the rural experience, the Southern experience, the foreign experience (outside the US). One of the most interesting though is the New England experience. Several excellent books have come out in recent years that focus on LGBT's in New England. Of course its home to Provincetown, one of the premier gay resorts in the country. And books like Will Mann's "Men Who Love Men" and Michael Thomas Ford's "Last Summer" have portrayed this experience fully.

Then there is the "Harvard" experience with its focus on the college experience in New England. Works from this group include Christopher Rice's "The Snow Garden," and "Harvard's Secret Court" by William Wright.

One other lesser known experience is the "Boston" experience. This is represented by J D Hayes, "Map of the Harbor Islands," and "Batting for Boston." Our November selection "Boston Boys Club" by Johnny Diaz comes out of this experience. This looks at the contemporary gay scene in Boston from the point of view of three individuals. A first novel, this author adds some local flavor as a Cuban American, to the mix. Join us Saturday, November 1 at Border's Books on Sunrise Blvd. in Ft. Lauderdale. We meet at 2:00 PM. Back to our regular third Monday of the Month timeslot at the GLCC, we are showing the wonderful "Quinceañera". This was "the little movie that could" last year – winning both the 2006 Sundance Audience and Sundance Grand Jury Awards. Directed and written by **Richard Glatzer** and **Wash Westmoreland** (lovers, who previously collaborated on 2001's "The Fluffer"), this is a slice-of-

life film that takes place in the Mexican-American community of Echo Park, California. It is a reinvention of Kitchen Sink drama, fueled by the racial, class, and sexual tensions of a Latino neighborhood in transition. (Not entirely removed from South Florida's own gentrified Hispanic-American neighborhoods.)

As her 15th birthday approaches, Magdalena (played by the luminous **Emily Rios**) finds her simple, care-free life shattered when she discovers that she's pregnant. And still (technically) a virgin! Kicked out of her house by her fundamentalist father, she finds a new family with her hunky, gay gang-member cousin, Carlos (**Jessie Garcia**) and her great-granduncle, Tomas (**Chalo Gonzalez** - in this movie's most haunting role). There are no big names here, only big performances. In English and Spanish (translated on screen), this is a tidy 90 minute film that should not be missed.

"Quinceañera" screens at **4PM, Monday, November 19th**. Followed by dinner. **This is a SAGE sponsored activity.** ■

Coming Out Day ... Taking The Next Step

National Coming Out Day, celebrated each year on October 11, was established in 1988 as a way to encourage LGBT people to take the next step in their coming out process. Some LGBT seniors find themselves coming out for the first time, while others are coming out in new areas and in new ways. For most of us, the process of coming out happens in steps taken throughout our lives. Coming Out Day gives us a chance to think about next steps in our own coming out process. Perhaps friends you had at work before you retired? A distant relative who is coming for a visit? Business professionals you deal with? If you are ready for the next step, these tips from the Human Rights Campaign (www.hrc.com) might help.

Benefits of Coming Out

Everyone should be able to decide for themselves when, how, and how much to come out. Coming out -- to the extent that you are able to -- will make your life richer and fuller. Living a whole and open life will allow you to develop closer and more genuine relationships. You can build self esteem by being known for who you really are. Coming out also allows you to connect with other LGBT people and be a part of a strong and vibrant community.

Risks of Coming Out

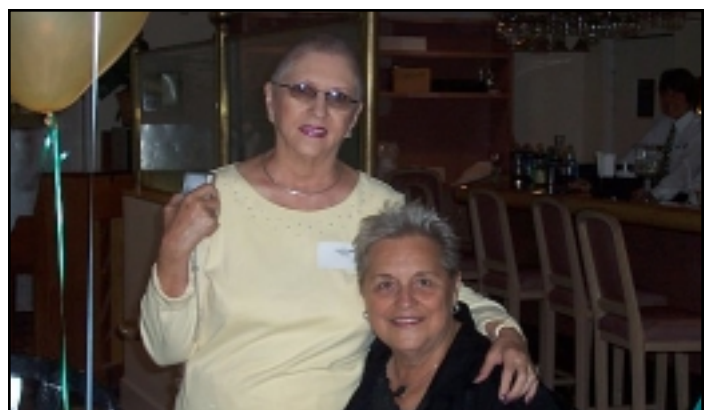
It's important to be realistic about the risks involved. Not everyone will understand or accept it. Some may even be hostile. Some will come around after an initial negative reaction, and others never will. It's possible that you might experience harassment or discrimination. When you weigh the costs and benefits of coming out, it's important to recognize that the person in charge of this journey is you.

Making a Coming Out Plan

When you are ready to take that next step, give yourself time to prepare. You may want to consider these points:

- **What kinds of signals are you getting?** You might be able to get a sense of how accepting people might be by the things they say -- or don't say when LGBT issues come up.
- **Be prepared to face stereotypes.** The reactions of others may be based on misinformation. You may want to be prepared to counter stereotypes with accurate information. For example: ▼ According to the US Census, same-sex couples live in 99.3 % of all US counties with least one million children being raised by same-sex parents. ▼ One million US veterans are gay and lesbian. ▼ In the US, 61% believe in the need for laws protecting transgender people from discrimination. ▼ Nearly half all Fortune 500 companies offer domestic partner benefits. ▼ A 2006 survey done by the Global Strategy Group showed that more than half of all New Yorkers support the right to marry for same sex couples.
- **Do you know what you want to say?** You might want to make a general statement about your sexual orientation or gender identity; you may want to tell someone about a new partner; or maybe you just want to share your feelings. Sometimes writing down what you want to say first helps to get your thoughts organized.
- **Do you have support?** You don't have to do this alone. Lean on trusted friends, other LGBT people, counselors, or supportive clergy.
- **Is this a good time?** Timing can be very important. Be aware of the mood, priorities, stresses, and problems of the people you come out to. For example, holidays may not be the best time if the family is already stressed out.
- **Can you be patient?** It took you a while to get to this point. Give others a little time too.

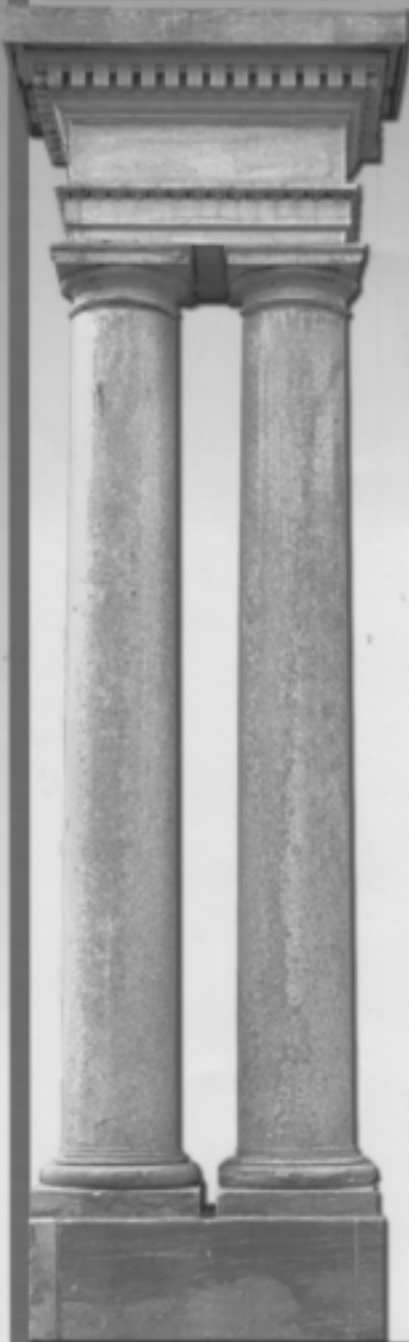

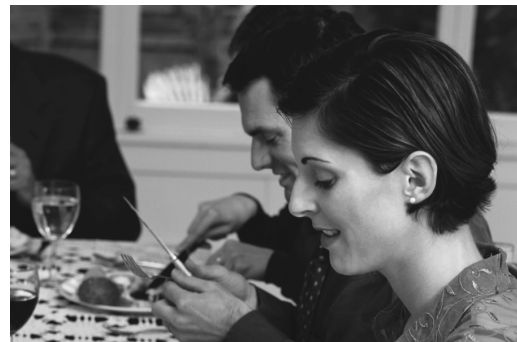
