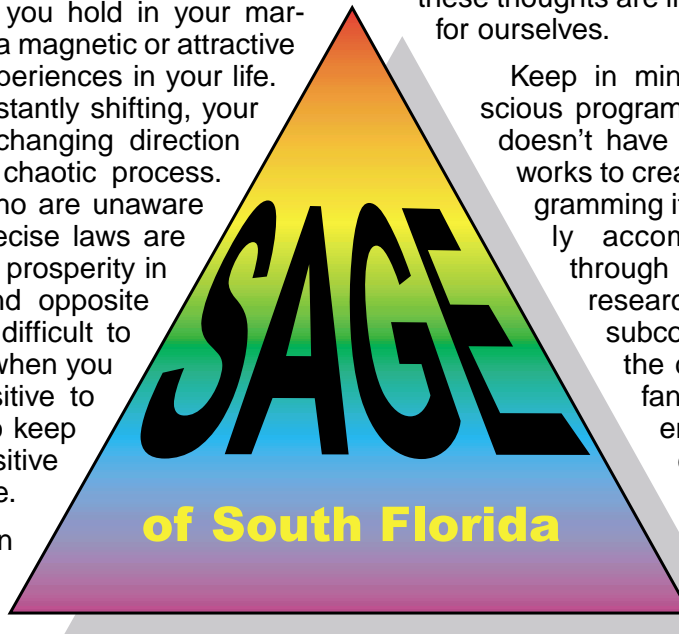

A MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR

The History of New Year's Resolutions

The tradition of the New Year's Resolutions goes all the way back to 153 B.C. Janus, a mythical king of early Rome was placed at the head of the calendar.

With two faces, Janus could look back on past events and forward to the future. Janus became the ancient symbol for resolutions and many Romans looked for forgiveness from their enemies and also exchanged gifts before the beginning of each year.

The New Year has not always begun on January 1, and it doesn't begin on that date everywhere today. It begins on that date only for cultures that use a 365-day solar calendar. January 1 became the beginning of the New Year in 46 B.C., when Julius Caesar developed a calendar that would more accurately reflect the seasons than previous calendars had.

The Romans named the first month of the year after Janus, the god of beginnings and the guardian of doors and entrances. He was always depicted with two faces, one on the front of his head and one on the back. Thus he could look backward and forward at the same time. At midnight on December 31, the Romans imagined Janus looking back at the old year and forward to the new. The Romans began a tradition of exchanging gifts on New Year's Eve by giving one another branches from sacred trees for good fortune. Later, nuts or coins imprinted with the god Janus became more common New Year's gifts.

In the Middle Ages, Christians changed New Year's Day to December 25, the birth of Jesus. Then they changed it to March 25, a holiday called the Annunciation. In the sixteenth century, Pope Gregory XIII revised the Julian calendar, and the celebration of the New Year was returned to January 1.

The Julian and Gregorian calendars are solar calendars. Some cultures have lunar calendars, however. A year in a lunar calendar is less than 365 days because the months are based on the phases of the moon. The Chinese use a lunar calendar. Their new year begins at the time of the first full moon (over the Far East) after the sun enters Aquarius-sometime between January 19 and February 21.

Although the date for New Year's Day is not the same in every culture, it is always a time for celebration and for customs to ensure good luck in the coming year. ■

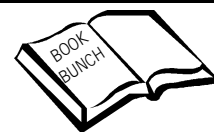
The restaurant is located at: 1219 South Federal Highway, Deerfield Beach, between Sample and SW 10th St, and is across from target.

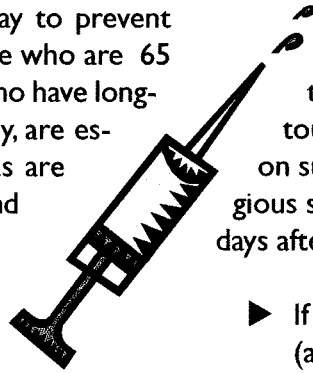

Health and Wellness

The Flu: What You Should Know

Get Vaccinated: The single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get vaccinated. People who are 65 or older, who live in a nursing home, who have long-term illnesses, or who take aspirin daily, are especially encouraged to get flu shots, as are health care workers, infant caretakers, and pregnant women. However, people with egg allergies, those who've had severe reactions, and those with fever should not get flu shots.



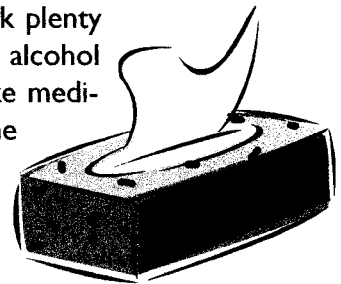
Don't Pass It On: The flu is spread through coughs, sneezes, personal contact, and sometimes touching your mouth or nose after you touch something with germs on it (germs can live on surfaces for 2 hours or more). You are contagious starting one day before you are sick and up to 7 days after you are sick (even if you feel well).

Understand It: The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness and at times can lead to death. In the US, flu season runs roughly from December to March.

Know the difference between a cold and the flu:

	Cold	Flu
Fever	Rare	High, 102+ and can last up to 4 days
Headache	Rare	Sudden onset and can be severe
Aches/pains	Slight	Usual, severe
Fatigue, weakness	Mild	Often extreme, can last 2 - 3 wks
Exhaustion	Never	Sudden onset and can be severe
Stuffy/Runny Nose or Sneezing	Often	Sometimes
Sore Throat	Often	Sometimes
Cough	Mild hacking cough	Usual, and can become severe

- ▶ If you have the flu, avoid close contact with others (and if you don't, avoid people who are sick).
- ▶ Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing -- then throw it away!
- ▶ Wash your hands often with soap and water or an alcohol-based hand cleaner.
- ▶ Avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth -- germs may be spread in this way.
- ▶ Clean surfaces with a germ-killing disinfectant.
- ▶ If you are over 65, seek treatment early. Check with your doctor at the earliest signs of flu -- early treatment can protect you from further complications.
- ▶ Be sure to rest, drink plenty of fluids, avoid using alcohol and tobacco, and take medications to relieve the symptoms. Antibiotics do not work to treat the flu.

I grew up in Windsor, CT which is known for being the very first town settled in CT in 1632. It was an agricultural town - growing lots of tobacco. I spent summers working in the sheds "sewing" the tobacco. It was here where I got my first introduction to Florida, as many young women from Florida came north to work in the sheds to make money for college.

One of my first disappointments in life was when I wasn't allowed to join the Boy's Little League because I was a girl. I was the best tomboy in town and could beat almost anyone at baseball and bike riding and could out-dare them by riding down the hill with my arms folded and my feet on the handle bars. My love for sports has followed me all my life. I played and coached softball for almost 20 years while working for a large Insurance company in Hartford, CT. I was also very involved with golf and bowling, winning a variety of awards in both sports. I also developed a love for women's basketball and became an ardent fan of the UCONN Huskie Women and the New England Blizzards, one of the first women's professional basketball team. I was privileged to go to a "fantasy" camp sponsored by the Blizzards and was able to play center against one of their top stars in a scrimmage game. Of course, to make it as

"fair" for me, the non-pro, the pro had to go to her knees for the toss up (I'm only 4'11" - the pro 6'2").

I was very involved with the creation of the first GLBT community center in the Hartford area and was an active board member for several years. I helped create a senior group called GEMS which was Hartford's version of SAGE. Like SAGE of South Florida, we developed dinner parties, meetings, trips and a variety of projects for the gay senior community. We were able to get a lot of assistance from Sage of NY and were also able to attend some of their workshops.

One of the major influences of deciding where to live in Florida was SAGE of South Florida. It's reputation of being an up-beat, alive organization was already known in New England. So, here I am and have no regrets. ■
