
Come and enjoy this early entry into the world of successful gay cinema.

SENIOR LIVING. Several people have asked me to write something about living in a retirement home. So I will.

According to everything I read, most seniors want to live out their days in

their homes. And I think this is probably true. But when you start passing 80 or 85, or when you start having trouble walking or hearing or seeing, or when you have to stop driving, or when you're tired of cleaning and cooking and home repairs, it's nice to think of living where you don't have to worry about these things. And that's when you can think of living in a retirement home.

I live at the Horizon Club in Deerfield Beach.

There are two levels of living here, independent and assisted. I live in independent living. That means that I have an apartment with a balcony, and I have my cats. I come and go as I please.

My rent includes breakfast and dinner. (I don't do breakfast because it's too early.) We have three entrees every night, and there are hamburgers and other things that are always available. We have several soups, salads, and desserts. I expected institutional food, but it is better than that.

On Wednesday afternoons my housekeeper comes in and cleans my apartment, changes my bed, and washes my linens. I have a washer and dryer in my apartment. I also have a DISHWASHER. (That's capitalized because I washed dishes by hand from 1977 to 2010, and I hated every minute of it.)

If there are things that I can't do...ranging from moving heavy furniture to opening a recalcitrant bottle, someone will come in and do it for me. If my lights burn out, someone else replaces the bulb. I have my car, and because many people no longer drive, there are no parking problems.

Do it for 60 minutes and maybe you can call yourself a roller derby queen.
