

Improve Your Ability to Hear! Improve the Quality of Your life

What do you hear when you hear? Are you not understanding when people are talking? Better hearing means improved communication and enhanced interactions between you and the people you love. Stop missing out on the punchlines to the jokes. Stop being exhausted

by having to strain to understand. Do not believe that you must be deaf in order to need help. Most people that wear eyeglasses are not blind! You may have hearing loss only in certain frequencies that would not impact your ability to hear; but if you have hearing loss in the higher frequencies where many consonant sounds occur, you will not be able to <u>understand</u> speech clearly and effectively. If you are asking people to repeat themselves more than once or twice a day you should get your hearing tested by a trained professional. There are many solutions to hearing problems. One solution is hearing aids. Hearing aid usage is positively related to the following quality of life issues:

- -Earning power
- -Communication in relationships
- -Intimacy and warmth in family relationships
- -Ease in communication
- -Emotional stability
- -Sense of control over life events

- -Perception of mental functioning
- -Physical health
- -Group social participation

Maybe you are not ready for hearing aids. Sometimes people just need assistive listening devices; something to make television viewing or phone conversations easier. Maybe you would like to learn how to be able to understand better in noise. Maybe you have tinnitus and would like to know if there is a way to make the noise stop. If you have questions about your hearing an appointment with a hearing professional can provide answers.

Dr. Paula Liebeskind has spent the past 30 years working as an audiologist both in private practice and in ENT practices. She received her Bachelor's degree from SUNY Buffalo; her Master's degree from Adelphi University in Garden City, Long Island; her Doctoral degree from Salus University in Elkins Park, PA. 

and Caicos, San Juan, P. R., St. Thomas, U. S. V. I., and a stop at HAL's private island, Half Moon Cay.




