An active supporter of gay rights, Stephen

Chbosky, based the screenplay for his acclaimed 2012 directorial debut film, *The Perks of Being a Wallflower*, on his epistolary novel of the same name.

Here, instead of the gay high schooler being the outsider, it is the straight kid, 15-year old Charlie (played by **Logan Lerman**) who is befriended by Sam(antha) (*Harry Potter*'s) **Emma Watson**) and her out-

brother Patrick (played by out-actor **Ezra Miller**) who is the "wallflower" of the title.

With a supporting cast which includes **Paul Rudd**, **Kate Walsh**, **Dylan McDermott**, and **Nina Dobrev** (TV's *Vampire Diaries*), the film went on to win the San Diego Film Critics Society Award for Best Ensemble Performance, as well

as the Independent Spirit Award for Best First Feature, the People's Choice Award for Best Drama -- and a host of other awards and nominations, primarily the Boston Society of Film Critics Award to Ezra Miller for Best Supporting Actor.

Released in October, 2012, Perks... was originally rated


R, but was successfully appealed by the producers to finally win a PG-13 rating. Coming at the end of the year, when most of the heavyweight Oscar contenders are released, you may have missed this one.

Occasional Thoughts

This *Occasional Thoughts* contribution to the SAGE newsletter follows up on some questions on our aging brains that I was asked after my February 2nd SAGE Lunch and Learn talk on regulating our stress and calm. I felt very aware of my own aging brain as I prepared for

the SAGE sponsored March 10th piano concert at the Pride Center. The piano practice required was brain training – to increase the strength and endurance of the attention required to remember and play many notes.

The basic reality is that as we grow older there are fewer of those 'little grey cells' between the ears whose circuits and connections run our behavior and store our memories. The good news is that the part of our brain that remembers things can keep growing new cells and connections, if we challenge it to do so by engaging in novel activities, ideas, or movements. For example, if you try to use your non-customary hand to brush your teeth or shave yourself, new nerve connections are forming as you slowly become more proficient. If you are able to use a web browser, you can go to a number of web sites like http://happy-neuron.com, which offer a variety of brain enhancing games and exercises.

There is probably no more important job as we age than maintaining the strength and quality of our ability to pay attention, to attend to what is important without distraction or mind-

wandering. Our ability to do this is strengthened by meditation techniques like 'mindfulness meditation.' You can enter "Mindfulness Meditation" in the search box of your web browser to find many videos and instructions. Here is what I have developed for myself:

Sit in a quiet place where you will not be disturbed. Place your fingers along one side of your neck, let the neck muscles relax into your hand...and see if you can sense your heart beat in your neck's carotid artery and start to count the number of heartbeats that happen while you inhale, and while you exhale. (By the way, it's OK if you can't feel the heartbeats, it just helps a bit with the following instructions.)

Now, close your eyes and just notice your breathing; try to have no internal thoughts. Just pay attention to your breathing (and, if you can, count the heart beats on inhaling and exhaling.) Thoughts will almost surely intrude occasionally, but when you notice this happening, just let them go and return to paying attention to your breathing.

Do this for as long as is comfortable (hopefully at least ten minutes), then see if you feel any different afterwards. Do you find it is easier to pay attention to one thing at a time? Do you feel a bit more quiet? If your answers to these questions change as you continue to do the exercise over a number of days, you are re-wiring your brain!



- Pier assistance on and off the ship can be arranged and notated on the reservation. Let April know if you will need this service.
- Special dietary needs can be arranged and notated on the reservation; there may be some dietary needs that cannot be arranged due to certain cruise line limitations. This is on a case by case basis.
- All guests must be checked in and onboard the Holland Eurodam no later than 3 pm EST on departure date, December 1st, 2013.
- Late arrivals will be denied boarding without refund.
- Passports are highly recommended, but not required if a guest is a US born citizen. Passports must have at least 6 months validity on them from the return date of the cruise (ex: passport expiration must be at least June 2nd, 2014). These ADA staterooms are HCP type-wheelchair accessible and have roll-in shower entry. These sell out fast so please book ASAP if needed. (Medical certification from your doctor may be needed. Please discuss with April.)

Dinner Seating Options


