# Living in Your ForeverHome™

According to the US Census Bureau there are 78 million baby boomers retiring during the next 25 years.

Starting January 1, 2011 ten thousand people will turn 65 each day.

What does this translate to in the LGBT community?

75% of LGBT seniors live alone 90% have no children 80% age as a single person

Most Americans say they want to "Age in Place" which means they want to stay in their own home and remain independent for as long as possible. What older adults are able to do and what their homes allow them to do is dependent on remodeling or designing a home using universal design concepts which permit seniors to live in their homes longer safely and independently. As one ages there are likely to be more medical and managed care services required. How are you going to pay for it and how does that impact your wallet?

How can you prepare your home for "aging in place?" It depends upon a person's individual needs as well as the design and conditions of the home. Metlife's Mature Market Institute just released a report on <u>Aging in Place 2.0: Rethinking Solutions to the Home Care Challenge</u> that details the estimated costs of remodeling a home.

- 1. Fall prevention: removing throw rugs, installing grab bars, provide good lighting, securing or removing carpets at stairs and installing soft path lighting for nighttime mobility. Cost: 1,000.00 or less.
- 2. Entryway, easy movement, and use of home features: reducing the number of stairs and increasing the horizontal depth of steps. Installing hand rails. A clear no-step path to the bedroom and bathroom. Rearrangement of interior space for ease of movement. Cost \$4,500-\$30,000.
- 3. Substantial remodeling and equipment: no-step shower or bath lift mechanism, a seated sink and a comfort height toilet. Seated/multi level food preparation area, sun and rain protected outdoor areas. Backup power sources for power outages. Cost \$8,000-\$75,000. These modifications will allow a senior to live independently and safely at home.

From a BBC news story about a shoe factory in Northamptonshire, England to a movie (filmed in a working shoe factory in London) to the 2013 Tony Award winning Best Musical, our October 21st movie is Kinky Boots. It's a 2005 British comedy-dramamusical written by Geoff Deane and

Tim Firth, and directed by Julian Jarrold (best known in the U.S. for 2008's Brideshead **Revisited**). Based on a true story, the film follows a traditional Northampton shoemaker, who turns to producing erotic footwear in order to save the fail-

ing family business and the jobs of his workers.

The movie stars **Joel Edgerton** (long before he became the burlyhandsome leading man of Warrior and Zero Dark Thirty) as Charlie Price; Chiwetel Ejiofor (starring in this month's release of Twelve Years a Slave) in his Golden Globe nominated performance as Simon/Lola; and Sarah-Jane Potts as Lauren.

With a soundtrack including Nina Simone's Wild is the Wind and I Put a Spell on You, It's a Man's World by James Brown, and Lyn Collins' Mister Big Stuff. Ejiofor stands out performing My Heart Belongs to Daddy, Whatever Lola Wants and, of course, These Boots are Made for Walking

From IMDB.com: "Hard to believe for some that a film with drag



entertainers could take its inspiration from Frank Capra. But that's exactly what you have here. Charlie Price...is a 21st century George Bailey, the closest I've ever seen to one portrayed in a long time...He's letting his workers go. One of them, Linda Bassett, tells him to get up and fight. And an inspiration hits him in the form of a spiked heel...Like in the old cartoons, a light bulb

goes on over his head and he realizes there's a market here untapped for feminine footwear for cross-dressers. And who better to design the stuff than the person who knows her needs best...If you've seen any of Frank Capra's populist classics from the Thirties and Forties you already know what the ending will be. Though for the life of me I cannot see James Stewart doing what Edgerton almost has to do to save the situation at the fashion show."
