





Road-trip and Buddy movies have long been staples of cinema. But, with few exceptions ("Thelma and Louise" most notably) there have not been many featuring female protagonists.

Our **August 18th** movie is one of the

exceptions. "Cloudburst" is an independent feature film released in 2011. (About a year before samesex marriages were legalized in Maine.) Originally staged as a play, it was filmed over seven weeks throughout Nova Scotia.


Funny and bawdy, raunchy and heartfelt: It's a paean to a 31 year-

long love affair between Stella and Dot. And their decision to flee Maine for Canada to codify their relationship.

Directed and written by **Thom Fitzgerald**, the film stars two Academy Award winning actresses in the lead roles: **Olympia Dukakis** and **Brenda Fricker**. Along with hunky **Ryan Doucette** (playing the young male stripper whom they pick up on the road) they anchor the movie -giving it heart and soul. Turning what could easily have been caricatures into real people.

The movie went on to garner rave reviews (100% on aggregator "Rotten Tomatoes") and 27 international film awards.

From IMDb.com: "...an excellent movie. The (three) stars...give outstanding performances and make the characters believable and interesting. Thom Fitzgerald takes a simple story and turns it into a wonderful journey with spectacular backdrops (and) spectacular performances from his cast....he is able to develop each of the main characters so that we really care about each of them. The minor characters are a little cliché at times, but it never takes away from the story or what makes this a great movie.... you will find yourself laughing and crying all within the length of the movie. Do yourself a favour and go see this!"
