Celebrating SAGE: Men's Drop-In Group Meets at Pride Center.

Returning regulars often bring friends and acquaintances who so enjoy the experience that they also become enthusiastic regulars.

Not only do we share our recent or past experiences with each other, we discuss current events, future events and sometimes non-events in a casual no pressure environment. Laughter abounds and many warm enduring friendships have been created.

We do keep it interesting. At a recent Drop-In meeting we had a guest speaker: Dr. Eirik Saethre, an anthropologist and professor at the University of Hawaii. Dr. Saethre just returned from Serbia where he lived among and studied the Roma (gypsies) people. His talk included an audio visual presentation so that we could

actually see the primitive living conditions that the people endure. After viewing the video and slides I had to wonder if I, even for a moment, would consider living in the shacks with no running water, no toilets and a healthy rat population.

Dr. Saethre talked about their work ethic and their non-judgmental attitude towards gays. In fact, he told us about a very active LGBT group in nearby Belgrade. It was fascinating topic with a great speaker. One audience member called it a "great presentation," while another said "very interesting, I'm glad I came." A lively question and answer period followed.

A special thank you goes out to Carl Barton for setting up the meeting room and audio visual equipment, to Alan Churchman for being the official event photographer and to Father Lee for his wonderful home-made dessert. Dr. Saethre is the son of Drop-In regular Lee Saethre.

So, now isn't it time you came by to say hello, meet the guys who excel at making everyone feel at home and participate or just listen to some of south Florida's men of significant accomplishment?

OCCASIONAL THOUGHTS

Every Friday afternoon I go to the Pride Center in Wilton Manors and play bridge. Usually there are 15 men and me. One of the men, Tony, was legally married in Massacusetts some time ago. Everyone who mentions Tony and Dan's wedding

invariably adds that both of their families were there. This made an impression on me because it obviously made an impression on them. Unfortunately, we too often hear about parents, especially fathers, who disapprove of their children's homosexuality. I wondered about instances where learning that a child was gay would turn someone from an opponent of gay rights and gay marriage to a supporter. I decided to look in places where you would not expect this to happen—in conservative churches and Republican politics.

In 2007 the Rev. Frank Schaefer, a Methodist minister in Lebanon, Pa., learned that his son was gay. The young man was getting married, and even though he knew that his father's church didn't approve of gay marriage, he wanted to give his father a chance to do the service if he wanted to. Well, Rev. Schaefer did want to, and he presided over the service. He has been in trouble with the church ever since. They have suspended him, punished him, asked him to surrender his credentials and resign. Rev. Schaefer has refused to resign, so the Methodist church has revoked his credentials and defrocked him. All for marrying two people in love. By the way, there are many other Methodist ministers who are likely to get the same treatment because they have supported Rev. Schaefer.

A year ago Charles Cooper, a lawyer who served in the Reagan administration, was arguing for Proposition 8 in California. That's the one-man-one-woman law. Within the last year Cooper found out that his stepdaughter was gay. He now says, "My daughter Ashley's path in life has led her to happiness with a lovely young woman named Casey, and our family and Casey's family are looking forward to celebrating their marriage in just a few weeks." Apparently it's easier to change if you're a Republican than if you're a Methodist.

Here's a different kind of story about a church, New Heart Southern Baptist Church in La Mirada, California. New Heart has always preached standard Southern Baptist beliefs about homosexuality. But during the last year several of his parishioners came to Dennis Cortez, the pastor, and confessed that they were gay. Rev. Cortez's ideas started changing. Finally his own son came out. At that time, Rev. Cortez went to his congregation and told them what had happened, that he had changed his views on homosexuality, and did they want to fire him or what. The church congregation had a meeting and decided to devote themselves to a study of homosexuality and the Bible. After finishing the study, the majority of the congregation decided to embrace their gay members and changed their teaching. I don't think that they are a Southern Baptist church any more.

Rob Portman, a Republican Senator from Ohio, took a couple of years to chinge is mind. Portman was a co-sponsor of the Defense of Marriage Act. He also voted for a measure prohibiting same-sex couples in Washington, D.C., from adopting kids. His son came out in 2011, and Portman announced his support of gay marriage in 2013.

An interesting switch on this father-son relationship is that of Robert DiNiro and his father. His father, an abstract painter, left his family when DiNiro was 3 years old. The actor later learned that his father had left the family because he was gay. After his father died in 1993, DiNiro read his diaries and learned how much his father had struggled with his sexuality. Di Niro says he and his father had difficulty communicating but that his father loved him very much. The actor has kept his father's studio filled with canvases he was working on. His son says, "It was the only way to keep his being, his existence alive. To me, he was always a great artist."

Lest you think that all is well in the area of gaydom, here are a few of the stupid things that are going on. The Texas Republican Party has endorsed a platform that would include reparative therapy for gays. This is the stuff that Exodus used to do, and last year Exodus folded and apologized for messing up people's lives. Both California and New Jersey have made it illegal to perform this kind of therapy on minors.

The Southern Baptist Convention, which last year forbade any of its armed forces chaplains from attending or performing same-sex marriages, has now done an interesting thing. They have decided that there is no such thing as transgender. What you've got is what you are, and that's an end to it. No wonder the New Heart Church parted with them.

And this is one I wrote a letter to the editor about. 

The movie showing will be "BERNIE." This is a moderately crazy story involving a mortician getting convicted of murder, spending 15 years behind bars, having his story told in a movie starring Jack

Black and, ultimately, being released to move in with the acclaimed director of said movie.

Bernie Tiede, a mortician in Carthage, Tex., was sentenced to life in prison in 1999 for shooting a rich, elderly widow named Marjorie Nugent. Tiede and Nugent met when Tiede,

assistant director of a funeral home, helped plan her husband's funeral. They struck up a friendship and he began working for her and traveling with her. But in 1996, he shot her and put her body in a freezer, where her remains sat for months before being discov-


This story was recounted in a Texas Monthly article by Skip Hollandsworth that said the entire tale "was like an East Texas version of 'Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil.'" Hollandsworth found a town that loved Bernie Tiede and didn't seem to care much for the the late Marjorie Nugent. This quote in his article summed up the reaction from people around Carthage: "From the day that deep freeze was opened, you haven't been able to find anyone in town saying, 'Poor Mrs. Nugent,'" said city councilman Olin Joffrion, a respected Carthage insurance agent. "People here are saying, 'Poor Bernie.'"

Hollandsworth's article was the basis for "Bernie," a movie starring Jack Black as the mortician and Shirley MacLaine as Nugent. (Matthew McConaughey played the district attorney who prosecuted Tiede's case.).

The film was given limited release in 2012. It received very good reviews, earning a score of 90 percent. . The movie was not a huge success but even a relatively overlooked movie starring Jack Black, Shirley MacLaine and Matthew McConaughey is a movie starring Jack Black, Shirley MacLaine and Matthew McConaughey. That attracts some attention.

A defense attorney in Austin named Jodi Callaway Cole, who saw the movie at a screening sponsored by Texas Monthly, said the movie raised some issues for her, and she eventually took on Tiede's case. Linklater, who said he believed Tiede was given "an extremely harsh sentence," gave Cole the \$2,000 in prize money the film won at the South by Southwest Festival.

This week, a judge agreed to let Tiede out of prison. Tiede had been sexually abused, something that wasn't brought up during the 1999 trial; psychiatrists now say that the shooting was not premeditated and that he had a "disassociated" episode relating to his earlier abuse. They also say Tiede doesn't present a continuing



danger to society.

Linklater testified on Tiede's behalf this week and even offered to let Tiede live with him in Austin. (This last part is what has caused a surge in new interest in Tiede's story, because Oscar-nominated writer-directors typically don't invite convicted murderers to live in their homes.)

Tiede was released on a \$10,000 personal bond and given several conditions, one of which is that he does indeed have to live with Linklater. (He also has to seek psychological help and he can't have any guns.) The director who made a movie that helped free Tiede said he didn't have any reservations about letting Tiede move in, according to the Texas Tribune.
