





# SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES



The SAGE movie for May, 2015 is "Latter Days". This 2003 production details the relationship between Elder Aaron Davis, a young man who is in the process of serving tenure as a Mormon missionary & Christian, a handsome, openly gay party boy who is successful in prolonging his adolescent-like status.

Aaron and his fellow missionaries have arrived for the start of a two year stay in Los Angeles. The characters are forced to deal with significant cultural shock, especially when they discover that their neighbor (Christian) is out & proud. While his partners cope with this conflict in various dysfunctional ways, Aaron finds to opportunity to explore this previously forbidden part of his personhood.

The film definitely has star power, highlighted by Jacqueline Bisset as a worldly, tolerant restauranteur & Joseph Gordon-Levitt as an antagonistic, ambitious missionary. Contributions abound with performances by Steve Sandvoss (Aaron), Wes Ramsey (Christian) and Mary Kay Place ("Mary Hartman, Mary Hartman").

Latter Days director/writer/composer, C. Jay Cox, was raised Mormon & served on a mission prior to coming out. Despite the film being semi-autobiographical, Cox sought consultation from cast members about comedic nuances (displayed throughout the movie) and LGBT Mormons regarding church rituals (including those affecting Aaron &

his character development).

ment).

The production was released unrated due to several nude and kissing scenes. Other than mild profanity, nothing else about the film is objectionable.

"Latter Days" will screen with subtitles on Monday, May 18 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. The 108 minutes of air time will allow viewers the opportunity to dine afterwards before engaging in their evening plans.
