Carl M. Galli - our returning SAGE of South Florida (SSF) President has been with SAGE for over a decade. About the time that

Carl was retiring from his public service career with the Social Security Administration, SSF president, Larry Silberhorn recruited Carl to serve as the assistant to the Social Chairman. "I was sort of baptized by fire" Carl notes, explaining that during one of his first events, the Social Chairman fell ill and Carl just had to pick up the pieces and run with it. And run he has...serving as President for four years, taking a two year hiatus from the board and now returning to lend his leadership abilities in forging the future of SAGE of South Florida.

With Carl responsible for my becoming a board member, we recently chatted about his leadership and accomplishments. He noted that he has never chosen to be an 'in your face' advocate but that he prefers a more gentle and subtle means of persuasion. One of the first things that drew me to SSF was Carl's insight of dedicating the cover story of the July, 2011 SSF Newsletter to The Older American's Act (which is so vital to the well-being of



our senior population but Bruce Williams has only recently been recognized as such). Carl has been instrumental in engaging SSF in such endeavors as SAGE on The Border/ Alternatives (a very popular co-ed drop-in/outreach program in Palm Beach County that thrives even in a Community Center that is not strictly for LGBT individuals); the continued involvement with the Noble A. McArtor Senior Day Care Center (of which SAGE was an initial sponsor); raising funds for the Broward County Breast Cancer Coalition; collaborating with the Florida Agency on Aging and AARP to present The CarFit Program; and in initiating such projects as the Assisted Living Project and continuing SAGE's involvement with the Senior Health Expo which have since become pillars of our community's advocacy programs.

The June program will feature **Dominic J Bisignano**. Dominic J. Bisignano, PhD. was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. After high school, he went on to earn a B.A., an M.A. and a PhD. In 1959, he received a Fulbright Grant to Italy, where he wrote his doctoral dissertation, "The Browning's and Their Italian Critics". During that time, he explored the rich cultural life of Italy: its music, its art, its architecture and its literature. He enjoyed especially the world of opera. He attended several performances at La Scala and other venues.

He taught British literature for 25 years at Indiana University in Indianapolis. During that time he was the Italian diction coach for the Indianapolis Opera Company. He also enjoyed going to Bloomington, Indiana, the home of Indiana University, whose school of music is world famous and whose opera productions are internationally known.

Music was always a part of his life. He grew up in a family where music and the arts held a high esteem. Living in New York City, he enjoyed its rich musical world of opera, symphony and ballet. He come to Ft. Lauderdale in 2003 and organized the opera group. Later it was expanded to include the ballet.

At present, the Opera and Ballet Group meets in the Pride Center on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. The group is open to all. Movies

with Carl M. Galli & Marc Flanagan

I've been asked by several members to show a "really gay" film (and not just one with an LGBT



sub-plot) -as well as a "happy" one. To be sure, there are lots of silly gay movies out there. (The "Eating Out" series comes to mind.) And even more dramatic ones. (We've seen plenty of those.) But a quality gay comedy is not easily found.

But I think our **June 15th movie** fits the bill. The 2012 Italian gay comedy "Come non Detto" (or "Never Mind") which was retitled "**Tell No One**" for its U.S. Distribution, is a bubbly and uplifting tale. Of course, it has serious underpinnings. But it does not dwell on these. And by the end (we'll stay for the end-credits) all is resolved to the audience's satisfaction.

Directed by Ivan Silvestrini (who won the 2013 Golden Graal Award* for Best Comedic Director) and written for the screen by Roberto Proia (from his novel), this is similar in tone to this past December's "Make the Yuletide Gay", in which a young gay man is out to everyone but his family, when his boyfriend decides to drop by unexpectedly.

Here we have Matthia (played by a charming, young Timberlake look-alike, Josafat Vagni) planning on moving away from his Italian family (Monica Guerritore, Antonio Bruschetta, Valeria Bilello) to live openly with his boyfiend Eduard (Jose Dammert) in Spain. Until Eduard decides to drop-in on the family's last dinner together -thinking they approve of the relationship. Thank goodness Matthia has a "fairy godmother" in drag queen Alba (played by the usually serious Italian dramatic actor Francesco Montanari -here nominated for Best Comedic Actor) to try to help him out. Especially when the seriousness of homophobic sports-buddy Christian (Alan Cappelli Goetz) rears its ugly head.

From IMDb.com: "I absolutely loved this film. **This film was comical, funny, emotional, romantic,** had family values.... There wasn't a single moment in the film that got me bored.... Everything was right, without over-acting; and subtle."

Since it takes place over the course of one day, a lot of Matthia's past is filled-in pretty much seamlessly via flashbacks, enabling us to get to know him as more than a mere caricature.

This is the key to the movie's success.

We will be screening the unrated U.S. Release, in **Italian with English subtitles.**


In just **97 minutes**, we understand Matthia's back story -and empathize with his fumbling decision to come out.

Carl was also a member of Alan Schubert's "grassroots" group which bravely gathered over two decades ago to create & establish a GLCC which has evolved into The Pride Center. "I can't believe how Alan's dream has blossomed into such a beautiful, world-class campus" Carl said.

Indeed, Ron Catena (Vice President, SAGE of South Florida) remembers our first year at the Pride Center: "I remember very clearly when the powers that be at the GLCC purchased the building in Wilton Manors. The news was met with great excitement by the community and by the SAGE Board of Directors. We immediately started talks with the Center regrading our renting office space. After all, SAGE wanted to be where the action was....

Like any other large construction project, our negotiated space was not ready on time. So we moved into a temporary space (actually a large storage closet in the back building). Nobody complained. Our future was bright. The atmosphere was dynamic. And we were moving from an office in Tamarac! After moving into our current office in the Main Building, bustling with activity and lots of people coming and going, we were home. And what a good move it proved to be.

A short time later, **Robert Boo became C.E.O.** of the Center (followed shortly by Kristopher Fegenbush as C.O.O.) and thus began a friendship between the two organizations. And then one of our Board members (Bruce Williams) became the Senior Services Coordinator. And the rest is history."

"I value the ongoing, effective collabora-

tion between SAGE of South Florida and The Pride Center. At a personal level, Carl has been a faithful partner and supporter in impacting the lives of local older adults. I continue to be amazed by the expansion of Senior Services at The Pride Center under the dynamic leadership of Bruce Williams. Every day, I get to see our work enhance and improve our community...." said Kristopher Fegenbush.

Carl has served on the Senior Advisory Committee of The Pride Center. And during the early years of our Coffee & Conversation gatherings, he urged that the programming be extended to afternoon hours (with a games day and speakers) so that members of the LGBT community could come and spend the entire day among friends in a warm, accepting and welcoming environment. In fact, SAGE donated most of the original games -many of which are still in use today.

Feeling blessed to reside in an area where LGBT rights are accepted, endorsed and furthered as well as realizing that high waters raise all of the boats, Carl is thrilled with the symbiotic relationship that exists between SAGE of South Florida and The Pride Center. This collaboration boasts the highly successful SAGE Men's Drop-In (and recently, the Co-Ed Drop-In), the SAGE monthly movie screening which is open to all, and the SAGEWorks Program which helps LGBT folks over 40 to find work and to stay competitive in the professional world.


