



# SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

Our selection for **Monday**, **November 16th**, **is Priest**. A 1994 British drama focusing on a Roman Catholic priest as he struggles with two issues that precipitate a crisis of faith. The film stars **Linus Roache and Tom Wilkinson**.

The plot revolves around Father Greg Pilkington (Roache) who is torn between his call as a conservative Catholic priest and his secret life as a homosexual with a gay lover, frowned upon by the Church. While the young protagonist's personal traditional conservatism and religious beliefs are offended by an older priest's (Wilkinson) blatant disregard for his vow of celibacy, he struggles with his own homosexual urges, especially after he meets Graham (played by **Robert Carlyle** – a favorite of the Director) at a local gay hangout and the two embark on a physical relationship.


Directed by the late Antonia Bird, and with a screenplay by Jimmy McGovern, *Priest* received very vocal condemnation from the Church, with the Catholic Church in Ireland in particular calling for a ban on theatrical distribution. This marked the first major disagreement between the Church and the Irish Film Censor Board, which decided to release it anyway. Other Catholic organizations were in an uproar over its release during Easter weekend. (Twenty-one years later same-sex marriage passed in Ireland by a margin of nearly 2-to-1.) Peter Stack of the San Francisco Chronicle called it "an exceptional movie," "powerful drama," and "a curiously inspiring statement

**about faith and morality.**" He added, "This film is extraordinary for the themes it explores—sometimes with delicious humor—beyond the obvious. The movie becomes a fascinating glimpse at a vast subject—intolerance vs. understanding."

The film won the People's Choice Award at the 1994 Toronto International Film Festival. And was named Best New British Feature at the 1994 Edinburgh International Film Festival. It also won the Teddy Award at the 1995 Berlin International Film Festival. (As well as the Audience Choice Award at the Santa Barbara International Film Festival in 1995, upon its US release.)

Linus Roache is married and has appeared on television in *Law and Order* and as Robert Kennedy in *RFK*. He says, "I just love variety. I love being able to do different things. Do period pieces and sci-fi. I love being able to move between genres and be flexible." He is a vegetarian.

The movie runs 105 minutes and is rated R. We will screen it on Monday, November 16th at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. Dinner will follow.

# **About Social Security for Same-Sex Couples**

On June 26, 2015, the Supreme Court issued a decision in <u>Obergefell v. Hodges</u>, holding that same-sex couples have a constitutional right to marry in all states. As a result, more same-sex couples will be recognized as married for purposes of determining entitlement to Social Security benefits or eligibility for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments.



We are working with the Department of Justice to analyze the decision and provide instructions for processing claims. We will update our website as new information becomes available.

If you are a spouse, divorced spouse, or surviving spouse of a same-sex marriage or non-marital legal same-sex relationship ... We encourage you to apply right away for benefits. Applying now will preserve your filing date, which will protect you against the loss of any potential benefits. If you disagree with our decision about your entitlement to benefits, eligibility for benefits, or payment amount, you should appeal.

<u>If you receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI)</u>... We consider same-sex marriages when determining SSI eligibility and payment amount. You must <u>report changes</u> to us, including changes to your marital status and address.

<u>Medicare entitlement and enrollment</u>... If you have questions about how your same-sex relationship may affect Medicare, please refer to CMS at <a href="http://cms.hhs.gov/">http://cms.hhs.gov/</a> or call CMS at 1-800-Medicare.

<u>If you have additional questions</u> ... If you have questions about how a same-sex marriage or non-marital legal relationship may affect your claim or to tell us if you are married, separated or divorced, please call **1-800-772-1213** (TTY 1-800-325-0778) or contact your <u>local Social Security office</u>.

Advocates, members of the media, and others with general questions about same-sex marriage or non-marital legal same-sex relationships and Social Security programs may contact their <u>Regional Communications Director</u>.


