“Administration Releases Final Report for 2015 Conference on Aging”

As 2015 comes to an end, it is time for us to reflect on the events of the last year and to look toward the work still ahead of us. In that spirit, I’m pleased to share the final report for the 2015 White House Conference on Aging that summarizes the work of this eventful year as well as the feedback we have received in the course of carrying it out.

In a year that marked the 50th anniversary of Medicare, Medicaid, and the Older Americans Act, as well as the 80th anniversary of Social Security, the White House Conference on Aging provided an opportunity to reflect on the importance of these programs, highlight new actions to support Americans as we age, and focus on the powerful role that technology can play in lives of seniors in the decade ahead.

The sixth White House Conference on Aging, which President Obama hosted on July 13, was informed by a year of pre-conference activities and conversations that allowed a broad range of stakeholders to provide substantial input.

At the conference, the Administration announced a number of new public actions and initiatives across the government and across the country to help ensure Americans have increased opportunity and ability to retire with dignity; that older adults enjoy the fullest physical, mental, and social well-being; that older adults can maximize their independence and ability to age in place; and that elder abuse and financial exploitation is more fully recognized as a serious public health challenge and addressed accordingly and effectively.

While we accomplished a great deal, we recognize that there is much work still to do. Through a combination of listening sessions, breakout groups, watch parties, regional and topical forums, and written feedback, the White House heard from thousands of Americans about the issues most important to them regarding our aging population. A better informed vision for aging in America emerged from this dialogue: one that recognizes the possibilities, rather than the limitations of aging, so that every American can enjoy a longer, better, more active, and independent life.

Thanks to all of you who engaged with us in this dialogue, shared personal stories, and made commitments to improve the lives of older Americans now and in the future. We look forward to the combined efforts of all of us -- working together in both the public and private sectors – to continue the work to support healthy, active, independent aging in America.

The SAGE movie for February, 2016 is **“Beautiful Thing”** (BT). Originally a stage play, this 1996 production details the relationship between Jamie & Ste, two high school aged lads who are at different points in the acceptance of their homosexuality. Adding to the mix is an ensemble that portrays characters who are trying not to succumb to the tenement environment enveloping them & a soundtrack that showcases Cass Elliot.

Although this is a fabulous film, evidenced by my VHS tape showing wear & tear after at least 100 viewings, here are ten questions that I hope can be clarified by the viewers.

- 1) Why did Sandra treat Tony as a boyfriend & servant at the same time?
- 2) Why did Jamie allow the other boys to use his soccer ball, but wasn't allowed to play with them?
- 3) Why did Sandra obtain a loan to buy her dream pub (that appeared to be “open for business”) despite her impoverished living status?
- 4) Why did Ste modify his brother's tennis shoes by salivating over them?
- 5) What made Ste's brother notice his shoes were altered?
- 6) Why did Ste throw that “item” in the plastic bag when he saw Jamie approach?
- 7) Why didn't the smoke detector go off when Ste overcooked the potatoes (AKA “fried shite”)?

8) How could Rose sleep through the loud volume of the victrola when Leah had her bender?

9) What made Sandra no longer like/love Tony?

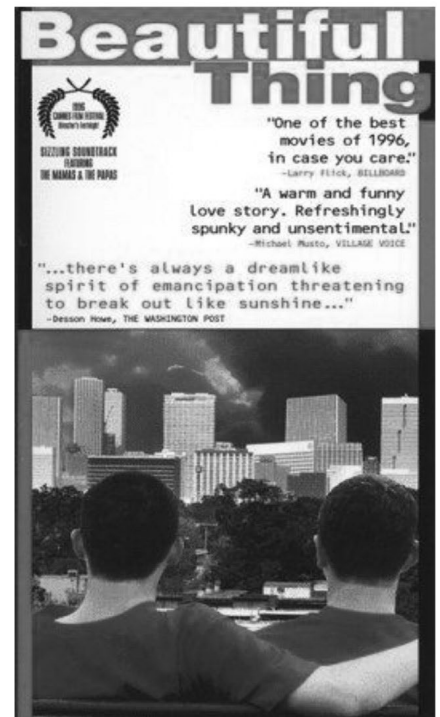
10) What the heck were the characters saying throughout the movie in their cockneyed dialects?

If you have the impression that this is nothing more than a soap opera, you are in for a pleasant surprise. Think of it as the British “Rent”, perhaps BT is a little more raw & blue collar. What makes it work is that everyone's dreams (& their efforts to make them come true) are intertwined & what results is truly a beautiful thing.

The screenplay & script for the play (by the same name) were written by Jonathan Harvey. Linda Henry & Tameka Empson (Sandra & Leah, respectively) now have recurring roles in the British serial “EastEnders”, while Ben Daniels (Tony) has portrayed some interesting characters in numerous movies.

The film contains very little decipherable profanity. While there is no conspicuous drug use, smoking is constant throughout the movie. (This is noted since movie reviews cite them currently.)

“Beautiful Thing” will screen with subtitles on Monday, February 15 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. The 89 minutes of air time will allow viewers the opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterwards.

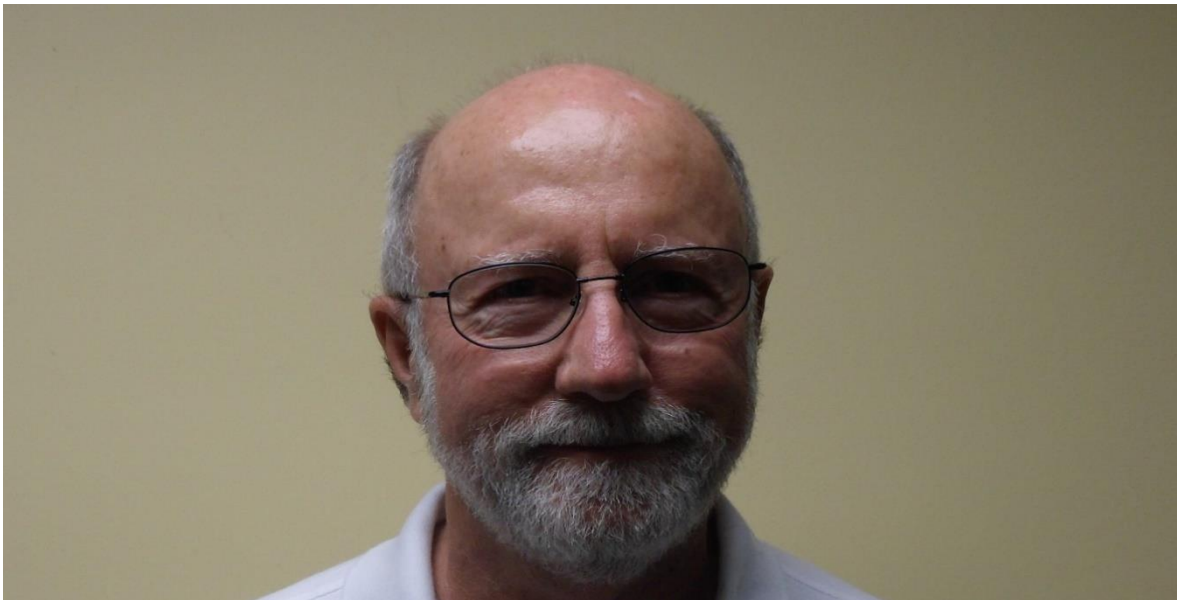
