

### The Affordable Care Act and LGBT Americans



On March 23, 2010, President
Obama signed the Affordable Care
Act and set into motion an effort that
will help give all Americans, including
lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender
(LGBT) Americans, more control
over their health care. Through these
new reforms, LGBT Americans will
have better access to stable, affordable
health insurance and high quality
health care.

### **New Coverage Options**

There is some evidence suggesting that at least a portion of the LGBT community is disproportionately uninsured. This makes the new coverage options under the Affordable Care Act that much more important to them. The Affordable Care Act is making new coverage options available to Americans, including those without access to coverage through a domestic

partner or employer and those with pre-existing health conditions: Already, qualifying Americans who are uninsured due to a pre-existing health condition have access to health insurance at an affordable rate through Pre-Existing Condition Insurance Plans. Young adults are able to remain on a parent's health plan until they turn 26 if the plan covers dependent children and if coverage isn't offered to them through their job. In 2014, the Medicaid program will be expanded to cover Americans with income at or below 133% of the federal poverty level. This expansion will increase access to care for low-income adults.

Also in 2014, Affordable Insurance Exchanges, new competitive insurance marketplaces, will be established where millions of Americans and small businesses will be able to purchase affordable coverage and have the same choices of insurance that members of Congress will have. Tax credits will help middle class families afford health insurance.

### **New Patient Protections**

New benefits will make it easier for consumers to get and keep their health coverage. For example, the Affordable Care Act prohibits insurance companies from refusing coverage to, or limiting the benefits of, children (under age 19) because of a pre-existing medical condition. In 2014, discriminating against anyone with a pre-existing condition will be illegal. And the law prohibits insurance plans from canceling an individual's coverage just because of a mistake on his or her paperwork.

LGBT individuals have encountered discrimination in the health care system for decades, and many studies have shown that LGBT people are affected by chronic disease at a higher rate than straight people. The new law has already made significant progress toward ending some of the worst insurance company abuses and helping ensure that LGBT Americans have access to coverage when they need

Our September 17th movie is The War Boys, a 2009 indie which touches on subjects relevant now: Immigration. Bullying. Race and Ethnicity. Prejudice against undocumented aliens. Sexual identity. Older/younger relationships.

First-time director, Ron Daniels, and screenwriters Bruce McLeod and Naomi Wallace

(adapting from her own 1993

play), have crafted a great drama of far-reaching consequences.

While there is a gay subplot, it does not drive this movie. It's just another part of the border that someone must cross. And the end, though haunting, comes a bit abruptly -- leaving some things to our imaginations. It stars a trio of talented actors as "the boys": Benjamin Walker (recently in the title role of Abraham Lincoln, Vampire Hunter; and in the title role, on Broadway, in the Tony-nominated **Bloody Bloody Andrew** Jackson), Brian J. Smith (tv's SGU -- Stargate Universe), and Victor Rasuk. All beautifully supported by veteran actor Peter Gallagher

(currently in tv's Covert Affairs and a multiple award winner

Cheyenne Serano, and the luminous Micaela Nevárez.

On the surface, it is about three young vigilante wannabes who huddle on la linea ready to chase illegals back across the border into Mexico; who think of themselves as fighting the good fight, as though they are at war. But soon they "learn that there are boundaries deep within each one of them that each of them has to cross."

From IMDB.com: "It's hard to believe there aren't tons of reviews

for this film! It handles numerous "taboo" subjects with aplomb, and gives the viewer a whole lot to think about. The three youthful leads give outstanding performances all around, Peter Gallagher does a fine job in support [as the father], and Teresa Yenque [as his maid] ices the cake to perfection. Many other fine performances here... Try on a "thinking" [gay] movie for a change... you'll find this most rewarding.'

it most. For example, the Affordable Care Act ends lifetime dollar limits on key benefits and restricts annual dollar limits until they are ended in 2014, allowing for long-term comprehensive treatment of chronic diseases. In addition, the federal website designed to help all consumers find the health insurance best suited to their needs makes it easy to locate health insurers that cover domestic partners. HealthCare.gov's insurance and coverage finder now includes a "same-sex partner" filter, allowing same sex couples to eliminate plans which would not cover both people from the list of plans available in their area. Consumers looking for information on domestic partner coverage will also have access to HealthCare.gov's regular features, such as the ability to sort based on the enrollment, a plan's out-of-pocket costs or other categories. The same-sex partner filter is also available for small employers looking for information on the small group market.

### Preventive Care for Better Health

The Affordable Care Act is taking significant steps toward improving access to preventive care. Nongrandfathered health plans now must cover recommended preventive care services without charging deductibles, co-payments or co-insurance.

In addition, the Affordable Care Act is funding preventive efforts for communities, including millions of dollars to use evidence-based interventions to address tobacco control, obesity prevention, HIVrelated health disparities, better nutrition and physical activity. The Department of Health and Human Services is working with community centers serving the LGBT community to employ proven prevention strategies. Improving Care and Fighting Disparities

The Affordable Care Act is making other investments that will help address health disparities experienced by the LGBT community. Funding is going toward building a more diverse and culturally competent health care workforce, as well as investing in community health centers to serve up to 20 million more patients. And through increased research and data collection on health disparities, policymakers will have the knowledge and tools they need to continue to address health issues in LGBT communities. Small Business Tax Credits

The Affordable Care Act helps small business and small tax-exempt organizations afford the cost of providing health coverage for their employees. Americans who own a small business with fewer than 25 employees and provide health insurance may qualify for a small business tax credit of up to 35% (up to 25% for non-profits) to offset the cost of the insurance. This will make the cost to small employers of providing insurance much lower.

### **HIV/AIDS**

Historically, people living with HIV and AIDS have had a difficult time obtaining private health insurance and have been particularly vulnerable to insurance industry abuses. Currently, fewer than one in

five (17%) people living with HIV have private insurance and nearly 30% do not have any coverage. The Affordable Care Act makes it easier for people living with HIV/AIDS to get coverage through the Pre-**Existing Condition Insurance** Plans. The ban on pre-existing condition exclusions will extend to all Americans in 2014, along with expanded Medicaid eligibility, the creation of Affordable Insurance Exchanges, and new tax credits for middle class families to help them afford insurance. People with HIV/AIDS also face barriers to obtaining care from qualified providers. Consistent with the goals of the President's National HIV/AIDS Strategy, the Affordable Care Act makes considerable strides in addressing these concerns and advancing equality for people living with HIV and AIDS. Investments in prevention, as well as improving care coordination, will help people living with HIV/AIDS get the treatment they need.





# A Brief History of the LGBT Movement...or... How a Subculture has Managed (almost) to go Mainstream.

Stormé DeLarverie - said to be the cross-dressing lesbian who decked the first cop -- a punch that sparked the Stonewall Rebellion.

The first large activist homophile group in the United States was the Chicago Society for Human Rights founded in 1924. They were followed by the Mattachine Society (meaning little fools) founded by Harry Hays in 1950. Because of secrecy concerns, the left leaning society used the small cell model employed by the American Communist Party. However, by the late 50s, the anti-communist hysteria of Senator Joseph McCarthy, assisted by the closeted homosexuals Roy Cohn and J. Edgar Hoover, caused the Mattachines to move to a more centrist and acceptable civil rights position. In 1954 the Mattachine's magazine One was seized by the post office as obscene material. In a very important decision for the gay rights movement the Supreme Court ruled for the magazine in 1958. The Mattachines were influential in the 50s, but by the 60s, and especially after Stonewall, they were considered too traditional and not confrontational enough; the organization splintered and fell apart.

In 1955 Phyllis Lyon and Del Martin started the Daughters of Bilitis in San Francisco. (The name comes from Song of Bilitis, a book by Pierre Louy that contains love poems between women.) One of the most significant achievements of the DOB was its national magazine, *The Ladder*. (My first lover wrote poetry for *The Ladder*.) The Daughters of Bilitis and the Mattachine Society joined together in common cause for a while, but as the women's movement

grew, it became evident that the men were not interested in women's issues. At the same time, NOW (the National Organization for Women) was afraid the movement was being taken over by lesbians, what they called the Lavender Menace. (Remember the t-shirts?) As a result, the DOB split, one group working for women's rights and one for gay rights. The organization never recovered.

In 1968, Metropolitan Community Church started in Los Angeles. Although it is not generally included in the history of gay rights, I think it should be. (Full disclosure: I am a member.) Troy Perry, a man who had been defrocked by his denomination, was in the Patch bar and started talking to a man named Carlos. Carlos said

nobody, not even God, cared about homosexuals. Troy said that wasn't true and asked God what he should do. God said: "start a church." Troy said "when"? God said "now." So Troy started a church. The first service was October 6, 1968 with 12 congregants. Today, MCC has 43,000 members in 300 churches in 22 countries. During the AIDS epidemic the church had a clinic in Nigeria; at the time it was the only organization in Africa working with AIDS patients. Because of AIDS, most of the male leadership of MCC died, and many of the leaders are now women. Nancy Wilson is the current leader of the denomination and MCC remains the largest continuing organization

for homosexuals in the world.

And then, there was Stonewall. In the 1960s there were few places for LGBT people to gather except the bars. Many of the marginalized lived and socialized in Greenwich Village in New York City. The Stonewall Bar on Christopher Street was popular because it had a dance floor. Police raids were common; people were lined up, asked for identification, and either released or arrested. Generally, it was pretty orderly. But at 1:20AM on Saturday, June 28, 1969, in a riot lead by the drag queens, the people fought back. Bar patrons who had been released, instead of leaving as they usually did, hung around. Pedestrians joined the group; pretty soon there were a couple of hundred people milling about and fighting with the police. The riot could not be contained and for the next three nights the riots continued.

This was the first time bar patrons fought back against the police. The news of the rebellion spread rapidly -- today we would say it went viral. Two people who had been active in the movement for many years, Frank Kameny and Barabara Gittings, realized that times were changing and went on to help form many other gay and lesbian groups, some still somewhat sedate, others violent, but there was never any going back. June 28,1970, was Christopher Street Liberation Day and the first gay pride parade. (When I was young the parades were often called Christopher Street parades.)

Finally, the LGBT community realized that even we become seniors and with that realization came SAGE. When we sit down on the first Saturday of every month for Lunch & Learn we need to remember where we came from. It's been a long and sometimes deadly road. Interestingly, the movement was not looking for a sexual revolution, only tolerance and acceptance. It was straight people who brought the sexual revolution. Ironically, we can probably thank them for the swift progress we're making now. #
