SAGE Participates in SMART RIDE 9



Once again it's time for the annual SMART RIDE. This year will be the 9th ride to benefit six HIV/AIDS agencies. The ride begins November 15th in South Miami and ends on November 17th in Key West.

Registration has been outstanding, bringing in 500 riders before the July cut-off date. If you would like to volunteer there are still some slots left on the crew and support teams.

As is our tradition, SAGE will sponsor Pit Stop 4 on the first day and assist at Key West High School

on day two.

Our Pit Stop will be located at the Long Key State Park (MM 67.5). Feel free to drop in and say hello if you happen to be down that way on the 16th. Five SAGE members, Ann Smith, Caroline Leto, John Gearrity, John Harris and Ken Goodman will represent our organization. (We will be joined by John Baxter and Chuck Panozzo (bass player for Styx).)

SMART RIDE 8 was very successful last year, raising more than \$680,000 for six agencies. The six

agencies to benefit this year include two from Broward County -- the Children's Diagnostic and Treatment Center and the Pride Center. West Florida's agency will be the Metro Wellness and Community Centers. Miami-Dade will be raising funds for the Positive Connections Support and Research Center; Monroe County will donate to AIDS Help; Central Florida to the Miracle of love; and Palm Beach County will donate to the Comprehensive AIDS Program.

Every dollar pledged to SMART RIDE will go directly to the six agencies. As Crew we have been asked to raise money for these worthwhile organizations. If you would like to donate please send your pledge to the SAGE office and make sure you earmark it for SMART RIDE 9.



Special Announcement Regarding Luggage Tags from Royal Caribbean





The federal Fair Housing Act prohibits housing discrimination based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, disability, and familial status (i.e., presence of children in the household). The Fair Housing Act does not specifically include sexual orientation and gender identity as prohibited bases. However, a lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender (LGBT) person's experience with sexual orientation or gender identity housing discrimination may still be covered by the Fair Housing Act. In addition, housing providers that receive HUD funding, have loans insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA), as well as lenders insured by FHA, may be subject to HUD program regulations intended to ensure equal access of LGBT persons.

Examples:

- A gay man is evicted because his landlord believes he will infect other tenants with HIV/AIDS. That situation may constitute illegal disability discrimination under the Fair Housing Act because the man is perceived to have a disability, HIV/ AIDS.
- 2. A property manager refuses to rent an apartment to a prospective tenant who is transgender. If the housing denial is because of the prospective tenant's non-conformity with gender stereotypes, it may constitute illegal discrimination on the basis of sex under the Fair Housing Act.
- 3. An underwriter for an FHA insured loan is reviewing an application where two male incomes are being used as the basis for the applicants' credit worthiness. The underwriter assumes the applicants are a gay

couple and, as a result, denies the application despite the applicants' glowing credentials. This scenario may violate HUD regulations which prohibit FHA-insured lenders from taking actual or perceived sexual orientation into consideration in determining adequacy of an applicant's income.

If you believe you have experienced (or are about to experience) housing discrimination, you should contact HUD's Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity for help at (800) 669-9777. You may also file a housing discrimination complaint online. HUD will thoroughly review your allegation to determine if the

claims you raise are jurisdictional under the Fair Housing Act.

Additionally you should contact your local HUD office for assistance with alleged violations of HUD programs regulations.

If you have a general question or need information about reporting a violation of HUD program regulations or the Fair Housing Act, please email *LGBTFairhousing@hud.gov*.

Finally, many state, city, and county laws specifically include sexual orientation and gender identity as prohibited bases. You may wish to contact your state or local human rights agency to determine coverage under those laws.
