Thank you for your input.



I want to start this article by first thanking all of our members who took the SAGE Survey. We on the Board hoped for a good response. We mailed our entire active membership the survey and expected a moderate to good return rate. You, our members, gave us much more than we expected. We got a return rate of over 35%. This is fantastic and very much appreciated. Of the responses we received, 20% were from women, 71% from men, and 9% from those who did not fill in the back part of the survey or were received late.

This analysis that I am presenting does not include the comments that we received. The Board has not yet read them. Our next challenge will be to read, categorize and report to you on the comments. This will take some time since we have received such a large amount. We will then implement the suggestions that the Board of Directors believe will enhance our organization.

We attempted to categorize the responses so that we could get a better

understanding of what programs men and women preferred. Your Board would like to create new programs that will suit the entire membership.

HE SAGE

I am so pleased to report that all the programs we currently sponsor received very high responses. The program that overwhelmingly received the highest positive response was the Newsletter. We received a 96% Very Important or Important response for the newsletter. I would like to thank Sharron Demarest our editor and Inez Pasher our associate editor for a job well done. The other programs that received very high positive responses were our Monthly Dinners, Lunch & Learn, the Community Concerts, and our Holiday party. For the women, the Women's Luncheon also received a very positive rating. When we read the comments I hope that you women have suggested other programs you would especially want us to implement. For the men, the Men's Singles Dinner, the Men's Drop-In, the Theater, and the Picnic received high positive ratings. The Board and I would like to thank the incredible volunteers who make all these programs possible.

Also, the following data was received:

The majority of you view SAGE as both an Advocacy & Social group. Very few of you see us as just an Advocacy group. The majority of our members are between 60 and 80 years young.

The respondents, years as a SAGE member, varied across the entire range from 15 for 1 year to 31 for more than 10 years.

The majority of you heard about SAGE from a friend. We appreciate your sharing the positive experience you have with your friends.

The vast majority of our members are retired, but we still have some full- and part-time workers in our membership.

One last thing, which does not have to do with the survey, is that due to the increasing costs of the facility, supplies and food, the price of Lunch & Learn will be raised to \$14.00 beginning with the June event.

The July L&L will also celebrate our country's Independence.

The SAGE movie for June will be *Gilda* which is the movie that rocketed actress **Rita Hay**worth to stardom.

Rita Hayworth was born in Brooklyn, New York (yes!) under the name of Margarita Carmen Casino in 1918. Her father was a dancer and her mother had been a Ziegfeld Follies girl. Her parents shortened her name to Rita Cansino and by the time

she was 12, she was dancing professionally. It was on a stage in Agua Caliente, Mexico, that a Fox Film Company agent spotted the 16 year-old and inked her to a contract.

Rita made ten movies under her original name before it was changed to Rita Hayworth for the movie *Criminals of the Air* in 1937. She made six movies during that year. Her star continued to rise and by 1941 she was starring opposite Cary Grant in *Only Angels Have Wings* and the movie's success earned her the title of *The Great American Love Goddess*.



Occasional Thoughts – A Restrospective on Gay Marriage

If I were 20 years old today, I would probably have come out when I was in high school. I might even have known I was gay when I was a child. There would have been a support group in high school,

and there would be the Pride Center to give me a place to socialize. If I had a partner, I would probably be going somewhere to get married.

But I'm not 20. I was 20 in 1948. I didn't come out in high school; I came out as a senior in college. And I had never heard of homosexuality when I was a child. According to the American Psychiatric Association, I was mentally ill, and I was a criminal in many states. All this stuff happening in such a very short time just blows my mind.

My first lover, Betty, moved in across the hall from me in the dorm. (We didn't use the word "partner" then, and even today when someone introduces me to a partner, I always wonder what business they're in.) She took one look at me and decided that if I wasn't I should be. I wasn't, but 24 hours later I was. After we graduated from college, she and I moved to my hometown of Chicago. All our socializing was done in gay bars. (How did we find them?) The one closest to where we lived was a men's bar, so all our friends were men. We knew only one other couple, two men in their early 20s. (They moved to Hawaii and lived together for more than 50 years.) I had always wanted to live in California, so we headed to Los Angeles. We knew more gay people there, but none of them became close friends, so it was kind of a lonely life. After about ten years Betty got bored and just strolled out.

I met Jean at a bowling alley. (I can't imagine why I was in a bowling alley. Those of you who know anything about me know that I have often had my butch card threatened for my inability to make repairs around the house, play sports, or wear men's clothes.) She was married, living with a husband, four kids, and another woman. I blithely waltzed into this relationship without any thought at all (or any conscience). Four kids, a husband, and a would-be lover! She divorced her husband and made him and the other woman move out. We had no gay friends, and we never did much of anything. After seven years she essentially had five kids, and she kicked me out. (I have never heard from any of her kids.)

Since then I have often felt shame and guilt about that relationship, but at the time I saw nothing wrong. The divorce made no impression upon me. I never thought that I was committing adultery before her divorce—and, apparently, neither did she. Apparently because the law didn't care about me, I didn't care about the law. I gave no thought to what protections that family had that I was taking away from them. The amazing thing about all this is that I didn't even realize most of this until just now.

Shortly after that I met the love of my life. Midge was a widow with two kids, and it was awkward. (As if the previous one hadn't been.) We weren't open, as we should have been, but the kids figured out what was going on anyway. (I am in touch with Midge's surviving son, but I think he still blames me for turning his mother gay.) Midge and I lived together for 37 years until she died in 2007. When you're officially a mental case and a criminal, you don't think about being able to marry. You might make commitments for life; you might exchange rings; you might ask if someone would marry you if it were possible; but you don't actually think about marriage. If Betty and I had been able to marry, we might have hesitated a bit. I was drinking very heavily, and she couldn't decide whether she wanted to be with men or women. (Just for the record, I quit drinking in 1955, and Betty died at 84 as a lesbian.) Jean and I didn't ever talk about marriage, even though she had been married when we met.

Naturally there were people working to get us accepted into society. I remember a few things from my time in Southern California. I remember when the president of the Mattachine Society came out and lost his job. I remember losing a job of my own. I read about Troy Perry's church. One magazine was published, and there was a lot of publicity about that. The Stonewall riots caused us to start hearing about gay activists. I had actually done a little writing for a few underground publications, and I briefly considered becoming a "professional homosexual."

In 1977 Midge and I moved to Florida, where we entered a big gay community. Troy Perry's Metropolitan Community Church, established in 1968, had grown by leaps and bounds. We joined the church and made more gay friends in a month than we had had in all that time in California. Midge and I had a holy union, MCC's commitment ceremony. We weren't married in the eyes of Florida, but we were married in the eyes of God. I started writing a column for the Weekly News during Anita Bryant's Save Our Children campaign. Life was good.

And then came AIDS! I was on the staff at the MCC in Fort Lauderdale, and I spent far too much time visiting people in the hospital. I went to far too many funerals. But I started to see a change in the behavior of gay men. They started to form lots more couples than I had ever seen before. Couples with open relationships started closing them. Whether this was because one is less likely to get AIDS from a regular partner or because misery loves company I don't know. I just know it happened. (Women, of course, had always been in relationships, but that's another matter.)

Then in the early 90s three couples in Hawaii filed suit against the state saying that it violated Hawaii's constitution to limit marriage to heterosexuals. The state actually held a hearing, and we thought that maybe Hawaii was going to allow gays to marriage. What an idea! Nobody I knew had ever thought such a thing could happen. And it didn't happen, but other people also thought it might, so Congress quickly passed the Defense of Marriage Act.

And now the Supreme Court is about to rule on the constitutionality of DOMA. A few months ago I stated that the gay revolution is a success. Now I say that the court will find the Defense of Marriage Act unconstitutional. Once the court makes this ruling, all kinds of problems are going to arise because marriage is defined by states, but there's no going back. Gay marriage is an idea that hardly entered anybody's mind during most of my life, but once it did it became an idea whose time has come.






