
Nominated for the 2009 Best Feature Award at the Berlin International Film Festival, our July 15th movie is the independent Chinese film *Soundless Wind Chime* (AKA: Mo seng fung ling). Directed by **Kit Hung**, starring **Yulai Lu** as Ricky and **Bernhard Bulling** in the dual roles of Pascal and Ueli, this movie is poetry on screen.

This is a small gem of Chinese film-making. It has been called "poetic

and translucent. A pure, intense journey through emotions, amplified by the gorgeous visual and

music score... Watching this movie will take you on a ride through the poetic quality of a Chinese film, with the intensity of an indie movie, so out of norm, so random, so fragile that in the end, delivers a fascinating, heartfelt, confusing, demanding and touching film..."

From IMDb.com: "When our lovers pass away, we tend to search for connections with them in a number of ways. We may call them and wonder if they will answer the call. We may visit their places and hug their belongings. We may believe a wind chime will ring when the souls come back as moths. Despite our awareness of their death,



it is difficult for us to "let go" and we unconsciously want to get in touch with them. At the end...the film...conveys a message that we have to accept the death of our beloved people, no matter how much we miss them."

## Changes to Medicare...2013 and Beyond

As we all know, from the debate that has been raging, healthcare costs are increasing dramatically every year. Within the next 10 years, national healthcare expenditures are likely to top \$3.6 trillion. Medicare benefits are a very important component in this debate. With 78 million baby boomers poised to become Medicare eligible over the next 15 years, reform is essential to keep Medicare solvent. The Affordable Health Care Act, otherwise known as ObamaCare, which was passed in 2011 and will go into full implementation as of January 2014, has been enacted, in large measure, to address this crucial issue.

Over the next ten years, The ACA will cut Medicare expenditures by \$716 billion. With Medicare currently affecting over 600,000 physicians who care for nearly 100 times as many senior citizens, who are provided for under Original Medicare and Medicare Advantage Programs, the purpose of these cuts is simple: to cut out the parts of the programs that aren't working and use that money to fix the parts that need reform. In essence, ObamaCare will affect how your Medicare dollars are being spent and the government is watching those dollars very closely.

Already, since it was passed, the ACA has helped nearly 18 million individuals with traditional Medicare get at least one preventive service without paying any deductibles or co-payments. Seniors no longer have to put off preventative care and check-ups because of the cost. This reform which has been active since 2011 gives seniors better access to cancer screenings, wellness visits, personalized prevention plans, vaccines and more. The law works to close the "donut hole" that causes many seniors not to be able to afford their prescriptions. Starting in 2012 Medicare beneficiaries received a 50% discount when buying brand name drugs and a 14% discount on generic drugs in this coverage gap. This reform gets stronger every year, increasing coverage and closing the donut hole, until it disappears in 2020. From that point on, seniors will only pay usual drug

The new law looks to increase the number of primary care doctors, nurses and physician assistants in order to provide better access to care through expanding training opportunities, student loan forgiveness and bonus payments. There will be greater support for community health centers around the country allowing them to serve 20 million new patients. Community health teams will provide patient centered care so you won't have to see multiple doctors who don't work together.

Medicare has also proposed paying doctors to coordinate patient care following a discharge from a hospital. The services would include payments for phone calls and other related management activities that are currently not being compensated for. If adopted, the provision would mark the first time Medicare has covered a physician service specifically designed to help patients transition from a hospital or nursing facility and pilot their care as they move back into the community.

The most significant changes will occur in Medicare plans associated with private insurers. A key feature of the Affordable Care Act is that it will reign in excess spending on Medicare Advantage plans, which is currently causing a burden on the taxpayer that is disproportionate to the amount of people that they help. Medicare Advantage plans are run by private insurers and recent government audits have shown that they are costing the American taxpayer about 15% more per enrolled person than Traditional Medicare does. With the adoption of the new law, starting next year, these plans will have to prove that they are using from 80% to 85% of their revenues towards covering medical treatments, rather than administrative costs and insurance company profits. These percentages are called a medical loss ratio. Companies failing to meet this requirement will have to issue rebates to beneficiaries, however, companies can also receive bonuses for outperforming other plans in their geographic area both in medical loss ratio and quality of care. Medicare will be continuing to rate these Medicare Advantage programs with star ratings, based upon beneficiaries staying healthy, managing chronic conditions, plan responsiveness, member complaints and appeals and telephone customer service. Those that attain a 5-Star rating will receive bonus payments so there is a lot of pressure

to increase star ratings.

The cuts outlined in The ACA will mainly effect reimbursement rates for hospitals and private health insurance companies. As of January 1st, ObamaCare's Medicare reform will enact a Value Based Payment Provision. This provision states that hospitals can gain or lose 1% of Medicare funding, as well as gain an additional 1% bonus depending on twenty factors that gauge quality vs. quantity of care. Specifically, the factors include quality measurements related to treatment of patients with heart attacks, heart failure, stroke, pneumonia and certain surgical procedures, as well as patient satisfaction. Penalties are being put in place against hospitals that show inappropriate readmission rates because of premature discharge or infections acquired during a hospital stay. There will also be greater scrutiny on Medicare home health care eligibility to foster greater efficiency, flexibility, payment accuracy and improved quality. Numerous provisions address the issue of Medicare fraud, especially in the area of purchase and rental of durable equipment.

The Affordable Care Act does not address the issue of the premium paid by an enrollee, which is currently \$104.90 per month for an individual earning less than \$85,000 per year. Medicare Part B premiums have always been determined by CMS (Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services) who use a formula that has been in place for years. An increase can only go into effect after a claims loss by Medicare in the prior year. Also, a rise in premium can be put into effect only if there is an increase in the Social Security benefit.

It is no secret that the current Medicare system isn't working. It's bankrupting itself and causing an increased burden on the taxpayer. This isn't to say that ObamaCare lays out the perfect plan for Medicare, simply that the huge \$716 billion in cuts over the next ten years is meant to save Medicare, fix what is wrong with it and ensure that it remains sustainable while providing quality, affordable healthcare to seniors.




