The Survey Results Are In!



The results on the Comment portion of the SAGE Survey have been read and discussed by your Executive Board. We again would like to thank you for your overwhelming response. All the comments were helpful and useful. We applaud your participation. Remember we are an all-volunteer organization and need you to volunteer and make things happen.

SAGE Events:

I want to discuss your input regarding SAGE events. To begin... you told us you would like the events to take place during daytime so you can get to and from the event; at night since some of you still work; at meal times not in the middle of the afternoon and we should have more events outside the Ft. Lauderdale/Wilton Manors area. As you can see, we got many conflicting suggestions on when to have an event. Your SAGE Social Committee tries to offer as many alternatives as possible. We have some luncheon events, some dinner events, and some formal dinners on Sundays usually starting at 1PM or 2PM. We do this so everyone who wants to come to an event can make several of them. Our major events (Valentines, Anniversary, Holiday, etc.) are usually on a Sunday in the afternoon. There are a number of reasons for this:

We want as many of our members to participate... including those who work, can't drive at night, or want the cost kept down. By having major events on Sunday afternoons we allow all our members who can drive or get transportation services to attend. We are aware that the major events are expensive and we do try to keep the price down as much as possible. However, these particular events are special and therefore deserve a nice venue with entertainment. When contracting a catering establishment we use their Luncheon Menu to make our selections to keep the price as reasonable as possible. SAGE makes no money from these events unless there is a fundraiser attached, i.e.,

a Chinese Auction or a 50/50. To keep your costs as low as possible the organization subsidizes many of our main events.

SAGE does its best to accommodate all our members. The July luncheon took place at the 5th Avenue Grill in Delray Beach to encourage our members up north to participate. We are also looking into scheduling some meet-ups and other events down south.

As to the price of the SAGE events... when you eat out you see for yourself that restaurant prices have risen. We are trying to keep our price for monthly events to \$20.00 or less. It's not easy but we will continue to try. We have tried to pick some member favorites that allowed us to contain the price and serve outstanding meals. If you are among the members who attended the Peter Pan dinner party or dinner at Chuck's Steakhouse, you know we were able to accomplish this.

As for activities, you asked for a co-ed group at the Pride Center, dances with more fast dance music, cultural events, a Camera/Photography club, a Current Movies club, Beginners Computer club, Intergenerational events, Board & Card Game nights and outdoor activities.

Some of these we are trying to make operational. SAGE, in collaboration with the Pride Center, hopes to have a co-ed group up and running by the time our snowbirds return. The SAGE Board and Social Committee are trying to schedule a dance for sometime this year. SAGE, with the help of the Pride Center, will be

Saying that it would be his last directorial effort, **Steven Soderbergh** released *Side Effects* in February, 2013 (before his Liberace biopic for HBO *Behind the Candelabra*) to mostly critical praise -- but general public apathy. Written by **Scott Z. Burns** (and nurtured by Soderbergh), the film, at first, appears to be another indictment of "Big Pharma" and the marketing of psychotropic drugs. But this is simply the McGuffin of the plot.

Starring Rooney Mara (The Girl With

The Dragon Tattoo) and Catharine Zeta-Jones (something for the women), and Jude Law and Channing Tatum (something for the men) our August 19th film veers into Hitchcock territory by the second act -- and will keep you guessing through the end.

From IMDb.com: "A crime is committed. It's bad, really bad. But the question is not who did it, the question is, who is guilty? In answering that question the film weaves from deception through twist to deception, never ceasing our questions of what is morally right, what is morally wrong and who is guilty? The screenplay is incredibly well-written, creating characters that amaze us, disappoint us and deceive us all the while being a part of an interesting and complex story...It's more of an edge-of-your-mind thriller... than an edge-of-your- seat thriller...always questioning the moral and psychological



behavior of these characters. The ending takes some strange, sexually-charged turns... but don't worry, you can still question where the line is between right and wrong and when each character crossed it.

"Soderbergh's complete control of atmosphere would not be complete without his usual great cinematography, crisp editing and unnerving music score by Thomas Newman, who conjures up some interesting musical themes... This is extremely skillful filmmaking, and although the plot has been seen and done before, it is exhilarating to see how a master filmmaker commands his given material so strongly and flesh(es) it out with his

signature style."

Side Effects screens on Monday, August 19th, at 4:15PM in Room 204 of the Pride Center. Just nominated for the Golden Bear of the Berlin International Film Festival, the film is Rated "R" for language and Lesbian content; and runs 106 minutes.

DOMA is **DEAD**: Now What

June was a groundbreaking month in the history of LGBT rights, with the Supreme Court of the United States announcing its decision that the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) is unconstitutional. The bottom line of the Supreme Court's decision is that the federal government may no longer refuse to recognize the legal marriages of same-sex couples. However, while the death of DOMA is certainly cause for celebration, the practical impact of this decision will leave Florida same-sex spouses with some new rights, but still lack others.

WHAT IS DOMA, AND WHAT DID THE SUPREME COURT OVERTURN?

In 1996, Congress passed the Defense of Marriage Act. DOMA contained two rules restricting the rights of same-sex couples. DOMA's first rule, which remains valid law even after the recent Supreme Court decision, states that whether individual states recognize gay marriage is solely an issue for each individual state to decide. Under this reasoning, New York may allow gay marriage, while Florida may refuse to recognize gay marriages – even if they are legally performed in a gay marriage state like New York.

DOMA's second rule declared that the federal government could not consider any same-sex couples "married" for the purposes of federal law. This meant that a same-sex couple legally married in New York could not, for example, file federal income taxes jointly as a married couple.

This June, the Supreme Court overturned DOMA's second rule. The practical consequence of this decision is complex: for issues related to the federal government, legally-married same-sex couples now enjoy the same rights as straight couples. However, state governments may still refuse to grant equal rights to gay spouses in programs and laws they administer.

RIGHT'S ONLY COME WITH MARRIAGE

Even after the Supreme Court's DOMA decision, the power to make laws concerning what people can marry each other belongs to the individual states. Only couples who were married in a state permitting gay marriage, such as New York, have access to the rights opposite-sex spouses enjoy. Unfortunately, the Florida Constitution bans same-sex marriage. This means that Florida same-sex couples looking to take advantage of new rights granted under federal law must travel to a state permitting gay marriage to get married and take advantage of the new benefits offered under federal law.

FEDERAL PROGRAMS MEAN MORE RIGHTS FOR SAME-SEX SPOUSES

Now that the federal government must recognize same-sex marriages, gay spouses suddenly have many new rights. The Human Rights Campaign, for example, calculated that federal law grants over 1,100 rights to married couples. An overview of the new rights granted to same-sex spouses includes the following federal programs:

FAMILY MEDICAL AND LEAVE ACT

– Until last month, employers were not required to grant gay employees leave to care for their same-sex spouse. Now that DOMA has been overturned, married couples may take time off from work to care for one another.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS FOR FEDER-AL WORKERS -- Marital status affects over 270 provisions dealing with current and retired federal employees, members of the Armed Forces, elected officials, and judges. Most significantly, under current law, domestic partners of federal employees are now included in the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program

CONTINUED HEALTH COVERAGE (COBRA) -- Federal law requires employers to give their former employees the opportunity to continue their employer-provided health insurance coverage by paying a premium. The Federal COBRA law now

requires employers to provide same-sex spouses the continued medical coverage guaranteed to straight married couples.

SOCIAL SECURITY – Before the recognition of same-sex marriage by the federal government, the surviving spouse in a same-sex marriage could not receive Social Security survivor benefits after the death of their spouse. However, now that federal law recognizes same-sex marriages, same-sex couples may receive Social Security benefits even after the death of their spouse.

IMMIGRATION – Immigrating legally to the United States is a daunting process, with many people waiting years to obtain their green card. However, a shortcut in the process has always existed for Americans to bring their foreign spouses home. Now that the federal government recognizes gay marriage, it is possible for the same-sex spouses of Americans to immigrate legally to the United States.

VETERANS' BENEFITS – The samesex spouses of veterans are now entitled to certain benefits, such as survivor pensions upon the death of their spouse, and the right to be buried beside their spouse.

TAXES – Perhaps the most important right granted to married couples under federal law is the availability of equal treatment under the tax code. Indeed, the case that brought the overturn of DOMA concerned the unequal treatment of estate taxes for gay spouses. An overview of the many tax provisions that gay spouses now enjoy includes the ability to file jointly, lower estate taxes, and the ability to claim deductions for a gay spouse's minor child.

STILL NO RIGHTS UNDER FLORIDA LAW

While the Supreme Court has required the federal government to recognize gay marriages, the individual states are free to refuse recognition of same-sex spouses. Because the Florida Constitution contains an outright prohibition on the recognition of gay marriages, legally married same-sex couples still have limited rights under Florida law. Areas of inequality include:

ESTATE PLANNING -- Opposite-sex spouses are offered numerous protections under Florida law in the event one spouse predeceases the other. This means that the process of estate planning for same-sex couples is much more complex than for opposite-sex couples – but also much more important. Without a will and other key estate planning documents, a same-sex spouse could be denied any inheritance.

HEALTH CARE -- When an oppositesex spouse becomes ill or incapacitated, the well spouse has many rights under Florida law with respect to directing the care of the ill spouse. Additionally, if the sick spouse requires long-term care in a nursing home or other facility, the well spouse is able to keep the couple's pooled savings while the state pays for sick spouse's health care. Not so for same-sex spouses, who do not enjoy such protections. FAMILY LAW -- If an opposite-sex married couple splits up, the courts have the ability to impose an arrangement that is fair for both sides. However, because Florida does not recognize same-sex marriage, Florida courts are powerless to grant same-sex divorces. Resolving issues of child custody and the division of assets following a break up is significantly more challenging for same-sex spouses than for straight couples, with the courts offering fewer protections for the divorcing parties.

starting a program called SAGEWorks to help the older GLBT population get back into the workforce by providing basic computer training. Other plans include a Camera/Photography group and Board & Card night. However, as always, the big IF to accomplish many of these things is we need volunteers to help set them up and lead them. If you are interested in cameras and photography, game night, going to new movies, or getting an intergenerational group started, WE NEED YOU. Please contact me or the SAGE Office and I will work with you to get it going. I look forward in hearing from you and establishing more meaningful groups for our members.

The Social Committee will also be implementing a program of 'Meet-Ups'. A meet-up is when we announce that SAGE members will be somewhere at a set time and location. Everyone will pay for themselves and enjoy the venue. This will allow for things like athletic events, trips to cultural spaces, and varied cost events. Not having a set price at these meet-ups will allow you to pick and choose what you want. Some of the meet-ups SAGE is planning include a Day of Miniature Golf, a visit to a diner with entertainment, a visit to one of the area bar/restaurants, etc.

Services and Advocacy of SAGE

Some of our members want SAGE to be more of an Advocacy and Services group. According to the survey many of you didn't know that SAGE provides a limited 'Friendly Support' program if we are told that a member is ill or simply needs a friendly, supportive ear. We also have a 'Members in Need' program that tries to find the correct referral to help get the proper support. Since we are an allvolunteer organization without the proper credentials to help most of our members directly we refer the member to the proper agency or service needed. The Pride Center also performs this function in a similar way. What SAGE can and will do is gather and provide a list of Service and Advocacy groups who perform the functions needed with their contact information.
