2013: The Year That Was.

When the SAGE membership responded to our survey at the beginning of 2013, they were divided as to whether SAGE is a social or a social and advocacy organization. Your board works hard to accomplish both. This article will review 2013's activities of note that included social and advocacy accomplishments.

Let's start with the first major activity of the year, the Milestone Birthday Party. The board chose to begin this event to celebrate those members who have reached a major birthday milestone. The entertainment included Dr. Bownds's wonderful piano playing and music by the Gay Men's Chorus. This coming year we have extended the eligible ages to include all who are 90 and above. We have at least four members in this group and they're all going strong. Bravo!

The SAGE Survey 2013 also gave birth to other activities: We started a program called Meet-Ups, which are gatherings at specific venues where members do not have to pre-register and when they arrive they can partake of the venue's activities as they wish. This allows for much more flexibility. We had much success at the Lester's meet-up but did not do as well at the Boomer's miniature golf event. The survey also gave life to the Co-Ed Discussion Group and the SAGE Camera Club. Both of these activities are enjoying much success.

The remainder of our social activities for the year included our Annual Meeting, Valentine's Day Dinner Dance, dinner at Zuckerello's, our Annual Picnic this year at Colohatchee Park, our Annual Cruise on the Eurodam, the Broadway Series at the Broward Center, dinner at Peter Pan Diner and many others. We also have many regularly scheduled social activities that include our Men's, Women's and Co-Ed groups, our movie presentation each month,

our Computer Club and others.

We were involved in many advocacy projects to help support our community. SAGE has sponsored a Pit Stop for the full ten years of Smart Ride. We were one of the original sponsors and we continue our support. We are proud the Smart Ride 10 raised over 1 million dollars in 2013. We not only sponsored Pit Stop 4 but our members participated with the registration and the motorcycle groups.

We have continued the tradition of offering the community free concerts in both classical and popular genres. We were sponsors for many of the activities our community supports, including the Health Expo, the Food Drive prior to Thanksgiving, the Toy Drive prior to Christmas, the School Supplies Drive and several Coffee & Conversations during 2013. This is just a sampling of the support that SAGE gives our community.

SAGE and the Pride Center also embarked on a major community project called SAGEWorks. SAGEWorks is supported by AARP and Walmart under the central guidance of SAGE USA. SAGEWorks helps GLBT participants 40-years and older to look and find a job using the AARP Job Search program, a definite help at our age where age discrimination exists. SAGEWorks also offers training in basic Office computer software and presentations on issues to support the job searchers.

Now you have it, a summary of some of the things SAGE has undertaken in 2013. We, your Board of Directors, will continue to fine-tune and add programs and services that will support our community and also enhance our membership's experience.

Also, if you wish, you can join us for dinner after the meeting at a nearby reasonable gay friendly restaurant.







SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The SAGE movie for January will be shown on January 20 at 4:15 pm at the Pride Center in Room 204 on the second floor.



The movie will be *Lifeboat* and is an American war movie from 1944 directed by **Alfred Hitchcock** from a story written by John Steinbeck and stars Tallulah Bankhead (YES!) as well as Hume Cronyn, William Bendix, Walter Slezak and others making a cast of 9 excellent actors

in this exciting story of British and US civilians who are stuck in the North Atlantic Ocean after their

ship and a U-boat sink each other in combat.

The film follows the lifeboat inhabitants as they attempt to organize their rations, set a course for Bermuda and coexist as they try to

The characters start out being good- natured, cooperative and optimistic about being rescued. However, as they get into desperation, dehydration and frustration with each other, the stories of the stories of the characters are examined, and divisions of race, religions, sex, class and nationality are brought to the surface.

It was Hitchcock who came up with the idea for the film. He approached A.J. Cronin, James Hilton, and Ernest Hemingway to help write the script before giving the project to John Steinbeck, who had previously written the screenplay for the 1941 documentary The Forgotten Village but had not written a fictional story for the screen.

Lifeboat was originally planned to be filmed in Technicolor with an all-male cast, many of whom were going to be unknowns. ALFRED HITCHCOCK'S

> While modern critics see the film positively, Lifeboat's portrayal of a German character in what was perceived in a positive fashion, caused considerable controversy at the time of its release.

The film is unique among Hitchcock's American films for having no musical score during the narrations; the Fox studio orchestra was only utilized for the opening and closing credits.

Tallulah Bankhead, never a major player in films, was buoyed by the success of *Lifeboat*. She was nominated for an Oscar She didn't win. She did win in this category by the New York Film Society. Hitchcock won an Oscar as best director.

Once again there is a cameo of Hitchcock. See if you can pick it out. It appears 24 minutes into the film.

DESIGNATE YOUR EMERGENCY CONTACTS ON YOUR FLORIDA DRIVERS LICENSE

You can register two emergency contacts with the State of Florida linked to your driver's license. It's quick, easy and free, and is one way that loved ones can be notified in the case of an emergency. I have done it myself, and I encourage you to take advantage of this service as well.

This service will allow you to provide emergency contact information to law enforcement in the event of an emergency. You can now go online and enter two (2) emergency contacts on your Florida Driver's License (electronically) which can only be retrieved by a police officer through the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) website located at: http://flhsmv.gov.

This information may save crucial time if ever it becomes necessary to contact family members, or other loved ones. This service is only available to those holding a current Florida Driver License or Florida Identification Card. The emergency contact information can only be accessed by a police officer.




