5th Annual Senior Health Expo at Pride.

The temperature is turning a bit cooler (thank goodness!) and our snowbird friends are beginning to return. Traffic is getting busier and our beaches more crowded. Great SAGE events are being scheduled and The Senior Health Expo at The Pride Center arrives on Saturday, October 18th. This year's event - the fifth, no less – promises to hit it out of the park – Equality Park, that is.

Vendors who have registered for The Expo will be offering valuable information on a wide array of services that are important to our seniors, including wellness and preventative care, senior living facilities, long term care, Medicare, legal issues and home care agencies. With over 50 vendors that have already committed to be a part of this year's event, Bruce Williams, Senior Services coordinator at The Pride Center, tells us that The Expo has been sold out for several weeks now.

The service providers exhibiting at The Expo have shown that they respect and understand our community, says Bruce Williams, Senior Services Coordinator at The Pride Center. "We want the LBGT community to be aware of available local, state and national resources and we want to be sure those resources are sensitive to and supportive of our needs and not just chasing the LBGT dollar."

As in the past Expos, there will also be a number of engaging educational seminars focusing on topics of particular interest to the mature LBGT community, as well as stations offering a variety of medical tests and lots of give-aways and great door prizes. The event is completely free and there will be morning refreshments served and a free lunch at noon for the first 400 attendees.







SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

With a meager budget of \$1,200,000 and no major stars; a virtually untried former-carny as a director; re-used sets, costumes and props from cheap old Hammer and Universal horror films; music taken from a British play (by **Richard O'Brien**, who plays Riff-Raff) -which failed when it was first performed on Broadway (only 49 performances at the Belasco) -and initially scathing reviews, **our October 20**th film had all the earmarks of a flop. And flop

its **first release in 1975**. (As a matter of fact, when the film first opened in traditional release, it bombed. **Meat Loaf** (who plays Eddie) said he attended an opening week performance with **director Jim Sharman** in the Midwest, where the theater was empty except for the two of them.)

But then something strange and miraculous happened. This mash-up of B-movie science fiction/horror/comedy/music caught the zeitgeist (some say it helped create it) and became the most successful "cult film" in history.

"The Rocky Horror Picture Show" is still playing to this day, somewhere in the world, including our own Classic Gateway Theatre. (One Theatre in Muenchen, Germany, The Museum Lichtspiele Cinema has screened the movie every week since June 24, 1977 -earning it a place in the Guinness Book of Records.) According to Wikipedia: "Still in limited release nearly four decades after its premiere, it has the longest-running theatrical release in film history."

To date, it has earned a staggering \$140 million in the U.S. -plus another \$200 million overseas. Making it one of 2**0 Century Fox**'s most successful films.

And it has finally earned some respect: It was selected for preservation in the United States National Film Registry by the Library of Congress in 2005, and also placed in the Science Fiction Hall of Fame (after it was initially denied).

As for the rest of the cast: **Tim Curry** plays the sweet transvestite, Dr. Frank N. Furter. **Patricia Quinn**, Magenta. **Nell Campbell**, Columbia. **Jonathan Adams**, Dr, Everett V. Scott. **Charles Gray**, the Criminologist. (All reprising their London theatrical roles.)

Leads **Susan Sarandon** (as Janet Weiss) and **Barry Bostwick** (as Brad Majors), though not yet stars, were brought in upon Fox's insistence that U.S. Actors be hired.

Peter Hinwood (a former male model) played the perfect Rocky, but he couldn't sing. He mimed the vocals during filming. (In postproduction, Australian actor/singer **Trevor White** was hired to dub the final vocals for the film.)

From IMDb.com: "The movie itself has been described too many times for me to give a synopsis. I will however say that it is really a collage of feelings, ranging from fear, trepidation, excitement, lust, joyous sexual fulfillment, more lust, tragedy, and a strange sadness at the end. Basically, all the emotions that make life worth living, in an hour and a half....Don't go expecting a logical, coherent storyline. Its about experience, not narrative....At the end, there is a message here, hidden under all the seemingly blissful hedonism.... By the way, there is no nudity or actual sex in the entire movie. For


