

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

As time went on and I became a regular at SAGE events, community icon Jean Johnson became the first female president of SAGE. And were we ever co-ed! Jean had a large and lovely group of ladies who faithfully attended most SAGE events. I would always marvel at the ladies arriving at a major party at a chic venue looking like they arrived on the "red carpet". They greeted everyone with lots of warm hellos and big smiles while mingling and chatting away. I remember one event where the ladies ran a fundraising Chinese Auction. Pinky Luddy and Nancy Drennen coordinated the other volunteers. The event was both enjoyable and fun. Then my friend of 35 years, Carl M Galli, became the President. I was a Director on the SAGE board. Carl and I worked well together and would talk about SAGE and planning various events and programs. One major event that comes to mind is the SAGE talent show produced by longtime SAGE Board member, Sal Orlando. As months went by Sal spent more and more time "in rehearsal". An already slim man, Sal became even slimmer as show time approached. I for one had grave doubts that the talent show was ever going to happen. Well, happen it did with a sold out performance at the Sunshine Cathedral. Sal had rounded up some of the areas most talented acts including the entire Gay Men's Chorus. Because of Sal's hard work we raised a significant amount of money for the SAGE treasury. At the next Board meeting, I told Sal I was a "Doubting Thomas" about how the show would go. Carl continued as President for the next few years bringing several new programs to the organization. Such events as the first SAGE Cruise which drew over 50 members and guests and the annual Milestone Birthday Celebration. These and other events helped increase our membership.

Our current President, Ken Goodman had been SAGE's longtime office manager. He put in place some of the programs and procedures that we continue to use today and which continue to serve the membership well. A Computer professional Ken was instrumental in bringing SAGE Works to our community. Over the years, Ken must have filled every volunteer position and then some. He is hardworking and more of a delegator than some of our other Presidents. Ken has made some outstanding appointments to the SAGE Board of Directors. They include Dr. Frank Piasecki, Carl Barton and Allen Churchman who is now our Assistant Treasurer. Ken implemented the Co-Ed discussion group in cooperation with the Pride Center. Due to Ken's efforts we enjoy a warm and close professional relationship with the Pride Center.

Having said all that, I want to talk about a program near and dear to my heart, the Men's Drop In group. After reading about it in the newsletter, I showed up one Wednesday at the old Pride Center. We met in a windowless room with a thru the wall air conditioner that often leaked on the unlucky person sitting under it. I was immediately impressed by the level of conversation and the friendliness of the guys under the direction of Dr. Norm Peters. I was hooked and have become a Drop In regular and the SAGE Board representative to the group. The group continues to stimulate me and I have become very fond of most of the members. As we celebrate twenty years of service to our elder LGBTQ community join me in staying active, attending our social and cultural events. Happy Anniversary SAGE and thanks to the countless volunteers who make this all happen.

The SAGE movie for November will be "SUNSET BOULEVARD" and will be shown on November 17th at 4PM at the Pride Center in Room 204 on the second floor.



With caustic, bitter wit in a story that blends both fact and fiction and dream and reality, co-writer/director Billy Wilder realistically exposes (with numerous in-jokes) the corruptive, devastating influences of the new Hollywood and the studio system by showing

the decline of old Hollywood legends many years after the coming of sound. The screenplay was based on the story "A Can of Beans" by Wilder and Brackett - this was the last collaborative film effort of Brackett and Wilder who had worked together on many films since 1938.

This classic, tragic film was highly-regarded at its time, honored with eleven Academy Award nominations and the recipient of three Oscars: Best Story and Screenplay (co-authored by Charles Brackett, D.M. Marshman, Jr., and Billy Wilder), Best Black and White Art Direction/Set Decoration, and Best Scoring of a Dramatic or Comedy Picture (Franz Waxman). The eight unsuccessful nominations were for Best Picture, Best Actor (William Holden), Best Actress (Gloria Swanson, who lost to Judy Holliday for Born Yesterday), Best Supporting Actor (Erich von Stroheim), Best Supporting Actress (Nancy Olson), Best Director, Best B/W Cinematography (John Seitz), and Best Film Editing.

The major starring role in the film, an inspired casting choice, was held by legendary silent film diva Gloria Swanson (Mae West was also a possible choice for the role), who "autobiographically" portrayed Norma Desmond - a deluded, tragic, ambitious actress whose career declined with the coming of the talkies. [Her name was a combination of the names of two early Hollywood figures: comedy star Mabel Normand, and silent-film director William Desmond Taylor (Normand's lover), who was murdered in 1922. There was an intensive investigation but his murder case went unsolved.]

The other starring role belonged to a modern day, B-movie hack screenwriter/narrator (William Holden, although Montgomery Clift was once considered for the role) who spoke beyond the grave as a phantom narrator. He recounted how he struggled to produce screenplays to meet the demands of the industry and satisfy the thirsty illusions of immortality of the aging silent film queen in her decaying mansion. After being showered with bribes (clothes, money, flattery and other gifts), he was quickly spoiled and ensnared in her web of delusion - and death trap.

This film was a first, since it mixed fiction with the realities of film-making. Other Hollywood legends, stars, figures, and screen landmarks also appear or are referenced, including:



- Paramount Studios itself.
- silent-screen director Erich von Stroheim (as the faithful, devoted butler, in his last film) of the severely-edited masterpiece Greed (1924).
- famous Hollywood director Cecil B. DeMille (playing himself while directing Samson and Delilah (1949).

Mabel Normand (a comedienne for Mack Sennett - notice the cryptic reshuffling of Norma's name).

- columnist Hedda Hopper in a bit part.
- aging silent era stars as themselves, portraying Norma's 'waxworks' card-playing friends: Buster Keaton, Swedish-born Anna O. Nilsson, and H. B. Warner.


