The SAGE movie for 5 is "Mommio Degreet". This 19

July, 2015 is "Mommie Dearest". This 1981 production details the relationship between Joan Crawford & her adopted daughter, Christina. One of the reasons for the movie's enduring

success is Joan's bipolar-like characterization, displayed by Faye Dunaway.

The film is based primarily on the book by the same name as the movie (published in 1978). Despite embellishments in the movie, the most outrageous scenes were pretty true to what Christina described in her biography. Unfortunately, it was those incidents that prevented "Mommie Dearest" from achieving Academy Award recognition. Regardless, it has endured as a camp classic for over 30 years & remains very popular in GLBT circles. Contributing to the story is the supporting cast. Diana Scarwid (Christina-adult) comes across as rebellious, yet eager to please her ungracious mother. Rutanya Alda's character (Carol Ann) is a combination of several homemakers, nannies, drivers & all around fixer uppers that were employed in the Crawford household. The late Steve Forrest (Gregg) portrayed the lawyer/ agent who brought Christina into Joan's life & Mara Hobel (Christina-child) was impressive by knowing how to push Joan's emotional buttons. This is apparent on the numerous occasions when she looked Joan straight in the eyes. It is notable that the movie sustained some fallout by the important players. Dunaway demanded that perspective interviewers not ask her anything pertaining to "Mommie Dearest". Christina objected to what she perceived as her mother's negative portrayal throughout the film. On the other hand,

the film maintained a genuine quality by employing Joan's wardrobe person and hairdresser, as well as consulting with numerous family friends (including Kirk Douglas).

The production was released PG; however, physical & verbal abuse (mainly by Joan) is prominent throughout the film. While the occasionally racy language is tame by modern standards, there is one profane word uttered for (perhaps) the first time in a movie.

"Mommie Dearest" will screen with subtitles on Monday, July 20 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. The 129 minutes of air time will allow viewers the opportunity to dine afterwards before engaging in their evening plans.



Social Security Defines Policy for Same-Sex Married Couples Agency Extends Benefits Broadly, Subject to Legal Constraints

Social Security has published new instructions

that allow the agency to process more claims in which entitlement or eligibility is affected by a same-sex relationship. These instructions come in response to last year's Supreme Court decision in U.S. vs. Windsor, which found Section 3 of the Defense of Marriage Act unconstitutional. This latest policy development lets the agency recognize some non-marital legal relationships as marriages for determining entitlement to benefits. These instructions also allow Social Security to begin processing many claims in states that do not recognize same-sex marriages or non-marital legal relationships. We have consulted with the Department of Justice and determined that the Social Security Act requires the agency to follow state law in Social Security cases. The new policy also addresses Supplemental Security Income claims based on same-sex relationships.

"As with previous same-sex marriage policies, we worked closely with the Department of Justice," said Carolyn W. Colvin, Acting Commissioner of Social Security. "We are bound by the law within the Social Security Act, and we have to respect state laws. We remain committed to treating all Americans fairly, with dignity, and respect." If a person believes he or she may be entitled to or eligible for benefits, they are encouraged to apply now.




Bill Mullins Founding Member #1




