The SAGE movie for September, 2015 is "Brokeback Mountain".

This 2005 production has been the SAGE monthly movie in the past, but perhaps the first time it's shown since the death of Heath Ledger. The film displays the relationship between Ennis Del Mar (Ledger) & Jack Twist (Jake Gyllenhaal) that began in the 1960's and endured despite numerous pitfalls.

This writer does extensive research until I decide to invest time and money to view a film. Not unlike Titanic (the Leo DiCaprio version), there was tremendous publicity leading up to their premiers. Everyone in my social circle saw both Titanic & Brokeback before me. Despite most comments being positive, I continued to have doubts. I'm sorry to say that in both cases, I wish I had seen these flicks sooner.

In the case of Brokeback, the scenery is not the only beautiful feature. Quite a few seasoned GLBT troopers will relate to the challenges of maintaining a liaison such as Ennis & Jack experienced. This point is especially salient considering that the formative years of this connection were in pre-Stonewall America. The societal tug that kept both characters seemingly straight would relent at times which weren't the most convenient. Case in point was when Jack drove across the country to surprise Ennis who, lo & behold was unavailable due to having visitations with his daughters.

We all know how groundbreaking Brokeback was for GLBT causes (specifically) and filmmaking (in general). It bears repeating the film is based on a short story by Annie Proulx. It did quite well at the Academy Awards, winning for Best Director (Ang Lee) & Adapted Screenplay (Larry McMurtry & Diana Ossana). Both Ledger & Gyllenhaal, as well as Michelle Williams (Ennis's wife) were nominated in various acting categories.

The production was released with an R rating for "sexuality, nudity, language & some violence". In my opinion, the weighty material, more than anything else contributed to the rating.

Locally

SAGE of South Florida proudly hosted the White House Conference on Aging Live Stream Watch Party at The Pride Center. This was a five hour commitment on our part, as well as The Pride Center, to the issues facing LGBT Elders.

Several of us raised appropriate questions. Mine being: "Does the Conference recognize that different barriers too financial security may exist for the Elder LGBT Community..." This was echoed by several other SAGE affiliates and was publicly expressed. However, there was no immediate answer. Some of us were disappointed. But **many times we have to understand that getting our issues and concerns made public is half the battle**. With this in mind, it was a very worthwhile and important event. 

In recent months, SAGE USA has prepared diligently to ensure that LGBT voices would be heard at this influential conference, held every ten years. As I listened to an inspiring and impassioned statement to conference leaders from iconic LGBT aging activist Sandy Warshaw...I knew that we had succeeded on that score.


Highlights from the day included a critically important announcement from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) that the federal government will take decisive steps to end discrimination against LGBT elders in all government-assisted housing. Given that housing discrimination against LGBT elders is rampant in senior housing, the HUD announcement was a huge advance. A second important announcement came from the Administration on Aging (AoA), which announced a new partnership with SAGE USA to convene key service providers in the aging sector, collect data on how LGBT elders are being served, and identify action steps AoA can take during the last year of the Obama Administration to make aging services more LGBT-friendly.

Thinking back on the last White House Conference on Aging, held in 2005, I'm truly amazed by how far we've come in ten years. We've moved LGBT issues from fringes of the larger conversation on aging to its very center. As one example, the needs and experiences of LGBT elders were specifically **referenced at the conference by Health and Human Services Secretary Sylvia Mathews Burwell,** Assistant Secretary for Aging Kathy Greenlee, and Ai-Jen Poo of Caring Across Generations. It's inspiring to see that LGBT older people have truly been granted a seat at the table. In the weeks to come, we'll be talking more about what was accomplished...and what SAGE's federal advocacy game plan is moving forward. We did a lot at the White House yesterday. Looking ahead, there is so much more that we




