
### SAGE CAMERA CLUB DECEMBER 2015



# SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES





The SAGE movie for December, 2015 is "Tru". I took liberties with the "movie" part, since it was a stage play about (arguably) the most famous homosexual of his era attempting to do something he was familiar with: Repairing relationships with his rich and famous friends unilaterally broken. Added to the mix is the setting of The Big Apple during the holiday season. Truman "Tru" Capote is in his midtown Manhattan high rise condo during the two days leading up to Christmas. He just received the news that members of his posse, consisting of Gloria Vanderbilt & the wife of TV executive Bill Paley, were not pleased with Tru's portrayal of them from excerpts published in a magazine from his latest book, "Answered Prayers". While mentally processing the fallout through rationalizing, he engaged in a routine of establishing business deals, expressing holiday greetings over the phone & making party preparations. At a certain point, he succumbed to the triple whammy of drink, cocaine & chocolate truffles.

"Tru" was produced several years after Capote's 1984 death. After I attended the play in the early '90s, there was a trickle of media attention about the subject. The mother lode was tapped in 2005 with two critically acclaimed movies ("Capote" & "Infamous") that dealt with the writer's craft. While "Tru" was similar to these motion pictures highlighting Capote's voice inflections and probing nature, it was different in that the audience is exposed to how the people, places & things which influenced his life impacted his literary work. Robert Morse (most widely known for his work in "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying") did a splendid job as "Tru". For this portrayal, he was bestowed numerous acting achievements & was nominated as best actor at the 1990 Tony Awards.

The production is sprinkled with profanity (especially the rectal excrement word). Additional objectionable items may by the plentiful double entendres & nasal snorting (perhaps derived from Morse's take of "Tru's recreational drug use).

"Tru" will screen without subtitles on Monday, December 21 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. The 85 minutes of air time will allow viewers the opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterwards.
