After all, there's a lot to be said for "quiet advocacy". And, I am proud of our independence and of what we do. Our scheduled* March 21st film is 2015's "Carol". Based on Lesbian author Patricia Highsmith's groundbreaking novel ("The Price of Salt"), with a screenplay by Phyllis Nagy, and direction by Todd Haynes (whose work we last admired in "Far from Heaven") "Carol" is a movie of rare pedigree which delivers on its promise. At the time of this writing, each of its female leads (Cate Blanchett and Rooney Mara) has been nominated for an Academy Award. And the film has been **nominated for** 172 major international cinema awards (including 4 more Oscars); and has another 44 wins.

Winner of the 2016 American Film Institute **Movie of the Year**. whose jury had this to say: "Carol sets the screen aglow with the light of longing as Cate Blanchett and Rooney Mara transform a period piece into a timeless cry from defiant hearts. Todd Haynes serves their romance as a restorative cocktail, adding splashes of color to a repressive Eisenhowerera, when love was often seen in black-andwhite. From luminous performances to sumptuous production, this is cinema's promise fulfilled - a haunting portrait in moving images. painted in the universal hues of heartache and passion."

From IMDb.com:

"It's an inevitability that Carol will face categorization as an LGBT film, but that's not the limits of how it should be considered. It's simply a heartfelt and deeply human love story where the principle couple confronts insurmountable odds. In Carol's case, these obstacles are the prejudices of the time and culture they live in. The film frames this discrimination in a tangible and legal way, as the titular Carol is accused of a morally indecent lifestyle by

her...husband [played by Kyle Chandler] in order to win custody of their daughter. The film isn't interested in being a courtroom drama though, instead focusing on the blossoming relationship between Rooney Mara's Therese and Cate Blanchett's Carol.

[Although] Todd Haynes is known for his heightened style...Carol is a film that feels plucked from the New York streets of the 1950s as the aesthetic here is surprisingly naturalistic... with Edward Lachman's understated and pleasantly grainy cinematography, but it all comes organically and authentically with the elegant fashion of production and costume design and the atmosphere that its cold Christmas setting provides. It's a very restrained film - as there are only two particularly intimate scenes - but the film carries an air of sexual and romantic tension throughout...."


MPAA Rating: R for a scene of sexuality/ nudity and brief language. "Carol" runs 118 minutes.

There were, of course, many Milestones throughout 2015. Among them:

Our own SAGE of South Florida grew up. We became "legal". Turning 21. Which means a lot in the everchanging landscape of LGBT groups in South Florida. Because of a handful of Founders and Original Members who had the foresight and bravery to face the challenges they faced in 1994 when a lot of what we now take for granted was not guaranteed, we are still here today. Giving back to our members. Giving to the Community. And remaining truly diversified in nature: Our LGBT nature remains strong. Across the country, In California, a famous athlete Came Out as a Transgender Female: Caitlyn Jenner emerged from hiding as Bruce. Paving the way for thoughtful and open National discussions of Gender and Identity. And, of course, the Supreme Court legalized Marriage Equality. For which many of us had been fighting for decades.

But among all of this, our Honorees celebrated their Milestone Birthdays. They have seen and experienced some marvelous things during their long lives. Some of what they remember is history to most of us: They remember when Electricity first became Common in most of the U.S. (in mid-1930 – 1940's). When cars were rare – and the highway system, and fast food, as we know it didn't exist. When air-flight became popular among the masses. When travel to the moon was only "science fiction" and cell phones were things of imagination.

Some of our LGBT Honorees served in two just wars – to guarantee rights for all of us: Some of which they could not enjoy, themselves, until recently. Some got married, as society dictated they must, and raised families –and are now loving and nurturing grandparents – and great grandparents.

Those who achieved their Milestone Birthdays last year...who reached 75, 80, 85, and 90 (and above) gathered with us. To be Celebrated and Honored by us. And I salute them - and thank them.
