

The SAGE October Movie is "Cabaret". We chose this to compare with the play that many of us will view at the Broward Center in early 2017. Another reason is to commemorate a piece that showed LGBT life during an era that was slowly transitioning from a world-wide depression to a time of war & even greater upheaval. "Cabaret," released in 1972 and based on a book written by Christopher Isherwood, was made into the 1955 British film "I am a Camera." It began its lengthy Broadway run in 1966 and has since had numerous revivals in the US and around the world. "Cabaret" was awarded 8 Oscars, including Best Actress (Liza Minnelli), Supporting Actor (Joel Grey, who recently came "out") and Director (Bob **Fosse**). It also stars **Michael York** in a pivotal role. The play and movie were made only a generation after Germany was cleared from Nazi control. To produce a satire about a tragic period that was fresh in many individual's minds and have it be entertaining might be its highest compliment. The film demonstrated atrocities from almost the onset, but subsequent scenes showed discordantly uplifting moments. When two male characters go to a beer garden where they encounter a handsome crooner, the scene pans to him wearing a German uniform and swastika while the crowd sings a hymn in powerful unison: Chills run down one's spine.

The song and dance routines occur primarily at "The Kit Kat Club," which becomes a sanctuary to numerous Berliners. The ironic thing was that Nazi troops frequented the place to enjoy (and monitor) the developments. The behavior of the Club's MC (Grey) demonstrates the political decline from one of humorous banter to insult-dancing with a person dressed in a monkey costume where he ut-

ters "If you could see her through my eyes, she wouldn't look Jewish at all".

The movie is rated "PG" with several utterances of profanity and two ménage-a-trois (1 simulated). "Cabaret" will screen with subtitles on Monday, October 17 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center. The 124-minute running time will allow us an opportunity to discuss the film as we dine afterwards.

RETIRING OVERSEAS? THINGS TO KNOW

There are a number of people who choose to live their retirement years in places outside of the United States. Perhaps retirement in Thailand or Portugal is in your plans. Maybe you plan to split your year between Central Europe and Central Asia. In many cases, it's still possible to receive your retirement benefits while living abroad.

Our website can help you navigate your benefit eligibility while living overseas. If you've worked in both the United States and another country, it may be possible for your credits to combine for a larger benefit. Currently, there are 25 countries with such international agreements with the United States. To find out if you have qualifying work in a country with such an agreement, visit www.socialsecurity.gov/international.

You can receive benefits in many countries. To find out whether you can receive your benefits in the country where you are retiring, you should use our Payments Abroad Screening Tool. There are easy ways to get in touch with us and report changes to Social Security if you live overseas. You can contact your local U.S. embassy, write to us by mail, or call us at 1-800-772-1213. You can find other information in regards to living overseas at www.socialsecurity.gov/foreign.
