

The SAGE December Movie is *The Family Stone*. This 2005 film portrays a heterogeneous group who gathers for the holidays. Even though this clan has ample individuals to fully occupy the dinner table (and provide a good time), it's the other invitees that contribute to the compelling storylines.



Among the cast are **Di**ane Keaton (Sybil) who **ILYSTONE** portrays a matriarch who does everything to keep the environment festive, despite harboring a big secret from most of her family. Sarah Jessica Parker (who was nominated for a Golden Globe Award for Best Actress as Meredith) makes an initially negative impression on the family as the fiancé

of Sybil's son (Everett, played by Dermot Mulroney). Completing the roster are Claire Danes ("Homeland"), Craig T. Nelson ("Coach" and "Parenthood"), & Rachel McAdams ("Sherlock Holmes" Trilogy). Ty Giordano plays the gay, hearing impaired "Theo", who provides balance to the offbeat characters.

The Stones abides by a set of rules that run counter to those of Meredith. Despite her and Everett being unmarried, the family just assumed they would be cohabitating. When Meredith doesn't go along with this arrangement, Sybil takes the path of least resistance by telling her to sleep in the room of one of her daughters. Since Meredith is either neurotic or just a malcontent, things get even more haywire. While conflicts are bountiful throughout the production, let's just say that these tiffs and complications are all resolved in a generally positive fashion. After all, it is the Holiday Season!

Many viewers will appreciate how most of the cast, when communicating with Theo, used American Sign Language. While their efforts are a source of humor with malapropisms, this demonstrates their inclusiveness. "The Family Stone" is rated "PG13" with several utterances of profanity. It will screen with subtitles on Monday, December 19 at 4:00 pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center. Its 103 minutes will allow viewers the opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterward.
