SAGE COMPUTER CLUB

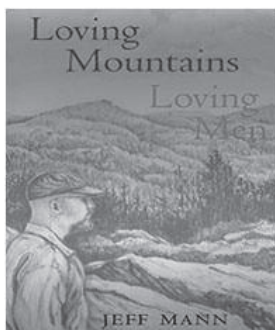

SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

Our January movie is the 2014 drama, **Pride**. Directed by **Matthew Warchus**, with a screenplay by Stephen Beresford, this film tells the true story of a British Gay/Lesbian group and the striking Welsh coal miners they help.

In 1984 20-year-old closet gay Joe (**George MacKay**) hesitantly arrives in London from Bromley for his first Gay Pride march and is taken under the collective wing of a group of gay men and a Lesbian, Steph (**Faye Marsay**), who meet at flamboyant Jonathan and his Welsh partner Gethin's (**Dominic West & Andrew Scott**) Soho bookshop. Not only are gays being threatened by the Thatcher Administration, but the miners are on strike in response to her pit closures, and Northern Irish activist Mark Ashton (**Ben Schmetzer**) believes gays and miners should show solidarity. The LGSM (Lesbians and Gays Support Miners) is formed. (Along with a women-only splinter group, Lesbians Against Pit Closures). Since the National Union was reluctant to accept their help, due to worries of being openly associated with a gay group, the activists decide to support a small Welsh mining town without quite disclosing this to them. Almost by accident a minibus full of gays find themselves in the Welsh village of Onllwyn and, through their sincere fund raising and Jonathan's nifty disco moves, persuade most of the community, including Union leader Cliff Barry (**Bill Nighy**), that they are on the same side. When a bigot tries to sabotage the partnership with a tabloid smear Mark turns it back on her with a hugely successful benefit concert (the "Pits and Perverts Ball" starring **Bronski Beat**) to which most of the villagers, now thoroughly in tune with their gay friends, turn up. The miners are defeated and return to work. But at the Pride march the following year a vast contingent of miners show up to repay their comrades with their show of support. (Excerpted from IMDb.com and Wikipedia.)

With an estimated budget of three million dollars, **Pride** went on to earn almost eight million dollars at the worldwide box office and is now in preproduction as a play. This is a movie of substance and meaning for all of us. The review aggregator **Rotten Tomatoes** reports that 92% of critics surveyed have given the film a positive review. The site's consensus reads: "Earnest without being didactic and uplifting without stooping to sentimentality, **Pride** is a joyous crowd-pleaser that genuinely works." The film won the 2014 Cannes Film Festival "Queer Palm" award, as well as three 2014 British Independent Film Awards for Best Film, and Best Supporting Actor (**Scott**) and Actress (**Imelda Staunton**). It was nominated for the Golden Globe as Best Picture. It is Rated R (itself a subject of controversy, since there is nothing sexual shown) and runs 119 minutes.

Meet Your Newest Board Member

What the Hell Do You Have to Lose?



There are a couple of pop culture references that came to mind the morning of the Wednesday after the election: One is **"A Face in the Crowd"**, Budd Schulberg's prescient 1957 movie, which casts Andy Griffith as just a man of the people whose folksy personality hides an ego and arrogance which take him to the cusp of political power. And Amazon's new series, **"The Man in the High Castle"**, which starts off with a beautifully filmed newsreel, wherein crops are growing, factories are churning out products, and the narrator assures all Americans that they are working and producing and living like never before. Until the shot goes wide and we see young Americans giving the Nazi salute –since this is 1962, and the Reich had conquered America. Jarring to say the least. And fiction. Based on the 1986 Hugo Award-winning Philip K. Dick novel. (Filmed prior to Trump's announcement that he was running for the Presidency.) And then there's the reality of a President Elect who seemed to embrace **the Alt-RIGHT and hired Steve Bannon (of Breitbart)** as his in-house consigliere. Until **Richard Spencer's "Hail, Trump"** speech (to Nazi salutes) forced him to say to the **New York Times: "I don't want to energize the group, and I disavow the group...** And if they are energized I want to look into it and find out why." All the while shielding Bannon: **"I've known Steve Bannon a long time. If I thought he was a racist, or alt-right ...I wouldn't even think about hiring him."** Now this begs several questions: Do I, personally, think that President-Elect Trump is a racist. Or a neo-Nazi? Or a homophobe? No. I do not. But with his vitriolic and intemperate speeches and tweets, and his associations with Bannon and others, he has allowed hate, in all its forms, to foment. According to **"The New Yorker"**: Since Donald Trump won the Presidential election, there has been a dramatic uptick in incidents of racist and xenophobic harassment across the country. **The Southern Poverty Law Center has reported that there were four hundred and thirty-seven incidents of intimidation between the election, on November 8th, and November 14th, targeting blacks and other people of color, Muslims, immigrants, the L.G.B.T. community, and women....** Such harassment occurred throughout Trump's campaign, but now appears to have taken on a new boldness, empowered by the election of a Ku Klux Klan-endorsed candidate who has denigrated women and racial and religious minorities." Yet his most-beloved child, **Ivanka, converted to Orthodox Judaism** in order to marry Jared Kushner (himself a Trump confidant), keeps a Kosher kitchen, and honors the Sabbath. Yet, when he was a reality star, he promoted Omarosa –making her a household name. He hired Clay Aiken, and others from the LGBT Community. So what do we make of our Soon-to-be-President? Is he just so unsophisticated that he does not (cannot) accept that words have consequences. Or is he a true sophist (in the modern sense)? Is he just an opportunist? (Like Andy Griffiths' character.) Is he just not engaged? Does everything have to be "stage managed"? As some talking head on **CNN said: "He's put the theater back in 'political theater.'"** To answer his Question: So far we have lost dignity and graciousness. We have lost "political correctness". We have lost civility. And, perhaps, soon, our civil rights. But as persons, we may lose more. In his picture with Obama, he looks very ill at ease. He was quoted by **Newt Gingrich as saying "He was unaware of the scope of the job."** Let's hope he grows up sooner than later. But in the meanwhile, we, especially in our Community, with so much riding on Supreme Court and Cabinet appointments, must remain vigilant. Must take him to task whenever we see or verify homophobic or racist behavior –and words. He is not an ideologue: He reacts to the public. And we must roll-up our sleeves, and be energized, when the need arises. Speak out, when the need arises. Support those people and groups which support our human rights. And be willing to stand up and be counted.
