Dr. David Goldberger Sunday, February 19, 2017, 2-4pm at The Pride Center

David Goldberger was born on July 25, 1925 and passed away on May 27, 2016. He was a Lifetime Member of SAGE of South Florida. Loved and respected by all who knew him, he was a brilliant man, but also an earthy man. Regaling his SAGE Drop-In friends with tales of his world travels, in pursuit of music and art and culture -as well as his "more raucous" times as a member of New York's West Side Discussion Group, a pre-Stonewall Gay Advocacy Group. He was instrumental in forming our own SAGE Concert Series -with "The Four Doctors" (all PhD's) being among our highlights. He performed a *Schubertiade* in honor of his favorite composer, Franz Schubert. And, at the age of 90, he performed a solo piano recital for our community -to a packed house, which was followed by a Birthday Celebration (arranged by SAGE with some donors). To which he said, "OK. But absolutely no gifts. At my age, what do I need?" David held a PhD from Columbia, and was retired from the faculties of Mannes College of Music, Hunter College, and Long Island University. Schubert once said, "It sometimes seems to me as if I did not belong to the world at all." And perhaps the same can be said of David Goldberger when he was playing: There was something beautiful and ethereal about him.

Deric Bownds (one of "The Four Doctors") and a renaissance man in his own right, said: "I will always savor and recall the many hours spent with David... He was an exceptional teacher and friend. I was in awe of his focus, humor, and energy. His amazing piano recital on his 90th birthday was a fitting climax to a life well-lived."

It is in this spirit that SAGE of South Florida is proud to present Dr. Deric Bownds in a musical tribute to his friend.

Deric Bownds is professor emeritus of Molecular Biology and Zoology, University of Wisconsin, Madison. He retired from being chair of the Zoology Department in 2001. In studies spanning 28 years, his laboratory discovered important steps in how light changes into a nerve signal in our eyes. He has been a recital pianist since his youth. More recently he has studied, and lectured on, the biology of the mind, giving talks to both SAGE and Prime Timers groups. In 2005 he began to spend most of the year in Fort Lauderdale, joined SAGE, and partnered with Dr. David Goldberger to do several concerts of pieces written for one keyboard and four hands. He then began to give annual SAGE-sponsored solo recitals, and is dedicating this recital to the memory of David Goldberger, playing pieces from the

early romantic repertoire that David studied and performed.

For the last two pieces on the program, written for four hands, Deric will be joined by **Roger Rundle**. Roger taught and performed in New York City over a period of 20 years before moving to Florida, giving his recital debut in Carnegie Hall in 1977, followed by subsequent recitals there and at Tully Hall at Lincoln Center. He served as musical director of the Bel Canto Opera from 1970-72 and on the faculty of the School for Singers in Katonah, NY from 1974-1988. For 16 years, he directed a classical music program for Cunard Cruise Line, which offered evenings of opera, chamber music, and piano concerts. He now maintains an active performing and teaching schedule in Fort Lauderdale. Please see the enclosed flyer for program and more information.




SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The climax is full of twists & turns, and a surprise result without messing with the camaraderie.


