





SAGE Health Tips

Gene Majka, ARNP



Welcome to our first health tips column for you. We are very fortunate to have four health professionals on our SAGE Board. **R.N. Nancy Drennen**, Nurse Practitioners **Ann Smith & Gene Majka**, and physician **Dr. Martin Horowitz**, who will be contributing to this column. What is GoodRx?

A resource to find prescription medications at the lowest possible cost near where you live or your smartphone/computer access point.

What do I have to do?

1. Enter the site on your Smartphone or computer and type in the name of your medication, either the brand name or generic name, dosage, and amount.
2. Voila! Your medication will appear from the lowest cost to the highest cost in your area. You also can print a coupon to take with you to your pharmacist.

Example. I take the drug clopidogrel (Plavix). You can set the milligrams (mg) dosage you are taking and the total amount of tabs, caps, etc. (usually a 30-day supply). The results will show pharmacies near your home or from where you are accessing the **GoodRx** site (i.e. car, office, bar, Sage event, etc.).

GoodRx tells me that Walmart (NOT always the cheapest source for all drugs) is the **cheapest** at **\$8.22** for a month's supply near my home (my access site).

Most expensive for the same amount of medication is **\$91.03** at Rite Aid. OY!!!

GoodRx is a FREE APP for your smart phone or tablet. You can access it on the computer by going into the internet and entering www.goodrx.com. If you do not have access to a computer you can use the computers at The Pride Center or your local library or ask a friend.




SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The SAGE April Movie is "**Callas Forever**" (CF). This 2002 film is a fictional account of the renowned opera diva by **director Franco Zeffirelli**. It is marked by a plethora of pieces sung by Maria Callas in her melodic prime and an intriguing plot full of "what could have been" moments. The viewer is also reminded of the backstory of the subject's life that was a source of fascination, as well as heartache.

Promoter Larry Kelly (**Jeremy Irons**) arrives in Paris, arranging a performance for a rock band. The paparazzi have shown up, not so much to play up this gig, but to speculate if there are other motives for Kelly's visit. Everyone is aware of his association with Callas, including an artist Michael (**Jay Rodan**). Larry invites Michael into a limousine, which prompts Michael to invite Larry to spend the night in his loft. While engaged in painting, Michael plays recordings of Callas, which somehow triggers Larry to give his former client



a call. When Callas (**Fanny Ardant**) repeatedly snubs Larry, he takes it upon himself to make an unannounced visit to her apartment. Initially irate with his intrusion, she agrees to hear him out. At an appropriate juncture, he submits a screenplay, titled "Callas Forever", which would be filmed while synching recordings of her prior performances. She responds that this project "is beneath the dignity of Maria Callas". Thinking all is for naught, Larry meets with a fellow publicist, Sarah (**Joan Plowright**), who tells him that Callas is heavily taking pills and is up all night viewing films of her performances. When Larry sees for himself how Callas is bawling watching her rendition of "Madame Butterfly", he makes an offer that even Callas can't refuse. Eventually, she agrees to film "Carmen" just as it was proposed. She is really enjoying the attention, even the hard work that goes into the production. Larry continues to humor her, agreeing to her suggestion that her voice has returned to its previous robust state. Despite her repeated threats of quitting the film, Callas Forever is ready to be released--OR SO WE THINK!

An earlier production that dealt with her post-operative career was "Master Class". In that account, Callas was portrayed as being a mentor who was brutally honest with her students. In CF, she is portrayed as a bit more multidimensional & introspective. Perhaps the primary message CF conveys is how trying to capture past glory usually ends up disappointing the subjects and audience alike.

The movie is **rated "PG-13"** for some sexual content & strong language. CF will screen with subtitles on **Monday, April 17 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center**. The 108-minute run time will allow viewers an opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterwards.


MEET YOUR NEW BOARD MEMBER




