Diabetes

Diabetes is very prevalent in our society. The American Diabetes Association (ADA) states that in the United States about one in four people over the age of 60 have diabetes. If your parents have diabetes there is a greater chance of you getting diabetes. Obesity is one of the predominant factors in getting diabetes. Obese individuals make enough insulin but the cells in the body have become resistant to the action of insulin which controls your blood sugar.

Diabetes can affect many different parts of the body especially your eyes, feet, and internal organs. My mother lost both of her legs to diabetes. The reason was that she was not compliant with her medications and diet. Her neighbor was a baker and she loved those sweets. Her nurse son could not even change her habits. It is a tough disease to have and controlling your blood sugar is not an easy task.

A diabetic nurse I knew explained an easy description of the complications of diabetes. She stated, take a 6-oz. glass of water, and add about five tablespoons of sugar to it and mix. Now take a funnel with very small diameter tubing and try to pour the mixture through. It is very slow and may become clogged. The same thing happens to your body when your blood sugar becomes very high. The blood cells cannot go through your very fine capillaries to nourish your eyes and feet. If you have a foot injury it takes a long time (if ever) for the foot to heal. Hence the tissue may die and become gangrenous and, as in my mother's case, the limbs may have to be amputated. Your eyes have very thin one cell capillaries and those can get clogged and eventual blindness may occur. Scary, HUH? You want to keep your fasting blood sugar level in the normal range 80-120 (mg/dl). Your medical practitioner will work with you on medications, diet, and an exercise program to control your blood sugar.

SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

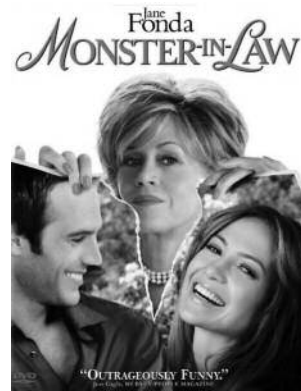

The SAGE July movie is "Monster-in-Law", a 2005 film that showcased a couple of actress divas spanning two generations. Not unlike similar films, it was significantly more popular with the public than with critics. While this may not be Academy Award material, it definitely has its comical moments and is appropriate for the summer season. The film was **directed by Aussie Robert Luketic** ("Legally Blonde").

MIL begins with a young woman, Charlie (played by **Jennifer Lopez**) working several jobs (perhaps) to pay for her pricy condo. While on the beach, walking her clients' dogs, she locks eyes with a jogger, Kevin (**Michael Vartan**, "Alias", "The Arrangement"). They briefly talk, and she finds out he's a doctor.

Charlie doesn't respond to his calls, but all is not lost. They meet again at a cocktail party, where Charlie is waitressing. Just as before, she plays hard to get. When he corners her, she questions his interest due to being told by his ex-girlfriend that he is gay. Kevin assures her this is untrue and they make a date. This leads to a full-fledged romance and a meeting with his mom, Viola Fields (**Jane Fonda**), who was just dumped from her talk show gig. During this encounter, Kevin pops the question to Charlie & Viola conjures up schemes to prevent the nuptials. Throughout this process, Viola enlists the support of her



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assistant, Ruby (**Wanda Sykes**, "Wanda @ Large"). Ruby assures her that Charlie is of fine character, but Viola doesn't accept this assessment and makes certain to stack the deck. After she insists on being the wedding planner amid Charlie's gentle rebuke, Viola has a panic attack (?) that results in going to the hospital, followed by recuperation in the home of the engaged couple. When Kevin departs for a convention, the fur flies between Charlie and Viola.

The remainder of the film shows how both not so subtly inflict insanity on the other. These are exemplified by Viola creating insomnia for Charlie who, in turn, gets revenge through pharmacology slight-of-hand. These antics continue until the time of the wedding, when a guest, Gertrude (**Elaine Stritch**) arrives to alter the course of events.

MIL is rated **PG-13** for sex references and language. It will screen **with subtitles** on Monday, **July 17 at 4pm in Room 204 of the Pride Center**. The **102 minute** running time will allow us the opportunity for discussion as we dine afterwards.
