COLDS AND FLU

The Fall Season has arrived and in South Florida it is not very different than summer. We do have some Fall occurrence though we have high temperatures and humidity. We fall back an hour to standard time and most of all we fall back into bed with colds and flu. Warm weather does not protect us from these illnesses. So what is the difference between a cold and the flu?

COLDS

Colds and the flu are caused by viruses but they are not sisters. Colds occur gradually with a sore throat, running nose, a cough, and rarely a temperature, except with children. Antibiotics do not kill the cold viruses. Colds, however, can be complicated by bacterial infections. In such cases, antibiotic treatment may be indicated. There are many Over the Counter (OTC) treatments for colds. Many of these OTC's can cause major side effects with prescription medications. PLEASE speak to your pharmacist or your health care practitioner before taking any OTC with prescription medications. Remember we are not in our 20's and 30s anymore (I sure know it in my bones when I wake up in the morning). All illnesses take more time to recover at our age. If a cold gets worse, get help. Do not wait. Best prevention of a cold is **washing your hands** frequently. People sneeze and cough into their hands, touch grocery cart handles, store items, handrails, elevator buttons and you touch it and touch your mouth or eyes and BINGO you got the virus.

FLU

Flu hits you all at once. The predominant symptoms of flu are fever, discomfort, and muscle aches. Cold-like respiratory symptoms are usually fairly minor with the flu. However, a dangerous type of pneumonia can develop as a complication of influenza, especially in seniors. Seniors are considered a high risk group for flu. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) states they estimated that 71% to 85% of seasonal flu-related deaths have occurred in people 65 years and older. Contact your health care professional immediately for treatment if you develop flu symptoms. There are prescription anti-viral medications available.

The best treatment is prevention, and that is getting your flu shot early (September/October). There are two vaccines designed specifically for people 65 and older:

- 1.The "high dose vaccine" is designed specifically for people 65 and older and is 4 times stronger than the regular flu shot.
- 2.Fluad, another option, is made with an additive which is designed to help create a stronger immune response to vaccination.

The injection takes about two weeks to become effective. The vaccination has the previous year's type of flu. You cannot get the flu virus from the vaccination. It is a dead virus. People who do get the flu after a vaccination may have contracted the virus before the vaccination became effective. Some have some small side effects from the vaccination or contract a different type of flu virus. The flu shot will protect you a bit more, even if it is a different type of flu virus, than no shot at all.



One of the true gems among the membership of SAGE was the man whom this writer succeeded as movie facilitator. John Gearrity was partial to films that were monochromatic, which included several in the pre-Stonewall era that portrayed gay issues in a more austere fashion than those that followed. A memorable example is the SAGE November movie, "The Children's Hour." Produced in 1961, it was adapted from a play written by



Lillian Hellman, and is an updated, more explicit version of the 1936 film, "These Three." **William Wyler directed both** movies and apparently was more comfortable depicting the true account of Hellman's play in "The Children's Hour." Although the censorship issue had become more lenient during the ensuing years between productions, the finished work resulting from "The Children's Hour" is still considered to be groundbreaking.

Martha (played by Shirley MacLaine) and Karen (played by Audrey Hepburn) operate a boarding school for preadolescent girls. Karen is engaged to Joe (James Garner), the town doctor. Martha is not thrilled by the impending nuptials and lets Karen in on this sentiment in a rather loud argument which gets the attention of Martha's Aunt Lily (Miriam Hopkins). The boarders can't make heads nor tails of this disagreement, but it doesn't stop them from making conjectures. Problem student Mary (Karen Balkin) is disciplined by Karen for stealing flowers. To minimize the infraction, Mary tells her grandmother (Mrs. Tilford, for whom Fav Bainter was nominated for Best Supporting Actress) that the confrontation at the school was about Martha and Karen being lovers. Mrs. Tilford visits the school, hears Aunt Lily confirm this allegation to her satisfaction, and then tells the parents of another student. The gossip spreads and parents begin withdrawing their kids from the school.

A TEAR for VEGAS

It took less than 10 minutes for a disaffected madman to take the lives of 58 innocents at the Route 91 Harvest Festival in Las Vegas, on Sunday, October 1st. The youngest victims were 20, and the eldest was 67. Leaving 489 wounded, who survived. So, it happened again: the Pulse Nightclub Massacre, until now the largest mass murder in U.S. history: Homophobia = Hatred. Except now, there is no LGBT bigotry as motivation. Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C: Racism = Hatred. Except now there is no African-American bigotry as motivation. As of this printing, there is no motive! People listening to country music. People dancing in a club. People praying and singing Gospel music. What is the commonality? People. So, we have to cry for Vegas, just as we cried for Orlando, just as we cried for Charleston. Just as ... how many other times between and before? Our tears are shed for the 58 victims, some of whom died protecting their loved ones. Our hearts go out to their families and friends. And to the 489 wounded, some of whom are civilian heroes, who protected people they did not know. Does it matter that there was at least one gay man* confirmed among the victims? And his partner among the wounded? No. Because any assault on anyone in our Human CommUNITY is an assault on us all.


