

### SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES



The SAGE March movie is "Victor Victoria", which was a forerunner in productions portraying the LGBT Community in varied and mostly positive ways. Blake Edwards, who produced & directed, took on a number of controversial subjects around this time. As a counterbalance, there were several Hollywood elites in the cast. The film was shot in 1982, still "the dark ages" for the portrayal of alternative lifestyles. This could be an explanation for it gathering only one

Oscar® (for Best Song Score by Leslie Bricusse & Henry Mancini) despite nominations in numerous categories. Victor Victoria takes place in Paris during the 1930's, a hotbed for cabaret shows. Very little of this popularity rubs off on gay producer Toddy, Robert Preston ("The Music Man") who overhears an audition by a vocalist with an operatic background, Victoria Grant (Julie Andrews). As fate would have it, Toddy discovers Victoria in a restaurant & she agrees to buy him dinner. Their limited funds



make them concoct a scheme to get their meals to be "on the house". Their success in this venture leads to Victoria moving in with Toddy and a last-ditch effort to improve upon their fledgling careers. He thinks up the idea to have Victoria become "Victor" in a song and dance routine. He convinces a patron, Andre (John Rhys-Davies from "Indiana Jones" and "The Lord of the Rings" series) to bankroll the project and it becomes a rousing success.

The film takes on a new angle when an American nightclub owner named King Marchand (James Garner) attends the show. He is joined by "one of his blonde bimbos", Norma Cassidy (Lesley Ann Warren), an aspiring actress with an outspoken streak. Marchand tries to pinpoint Victor's gender, a quest that becomes obsessive and hilarious. Eventually, his attraction grows more powerful than his machismo, which allows the relationship to evolve. The movie takes even more twists and turns, concluding in truths being exposed.

As a play, "Victor Victoria" had a two-year run on Broadway during the mid-1990's, which generated a Best Actress Tony Award for Andrews. Two noteworthy items were that she declined to accept the award due to the assertion that the remaining cast members (none of whom were nominated) deserved the honor too and this was the final run of performances for Andrews before her botched vocal cord procedure.

The writer was reacquainted with **Victor Victoria** a few years ago while attending the play in Houston. While the stage version had several tunes not in the film, both productions were equally crisp and humorous.

"Victor Victoria" is rated PG and will screen with subtitles on Monday, March 19th at 4pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center. The 133 minutes of run time will allow viewers the opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterwards.

#### **Darkness in Vision**

A few years ago, I was having poor night vision. I hit curbs while driving at night and started seeing halos around headlights. Dark side streets were becoming very dark and my vison was cloudy. My ophthalmologist diagnosed me with cataracts. Cataracts do not go away, but as time goes by the symptoms will increase. Cataracts can affect one or both eyes. Other symptoms may include faded colors and double or multiple vision in one or both eyes. You may also have frequent eyeglass or contact lens prescription changes.

#### What is a Cataract?

A cataract is a clouding of the lens in the eye that affects vision. The lens is a clear part of the eye that helps to focus light, or an image, on the retina. The retina is the light-sensitive tissue at the back of the eye. The lens must be clear for the retina to receive a sharp image. If the lens is cloudy from a cataract, the image you see will be blurred. The lens is made of mostly water and protein. The protein is arranged in a precise way that keeps the lens clear and let's light pass through it. But as we age, some of the protein may clump together and start to cloud a small area of the lens. This is a cataract. Over time, the cataract may grow larger and cloud more of the lens, making it harder to see.

The term "age-related" is a little misleading when talking about cataracts. You don't have to be a senior citizen to get this type of cataract. In fact, people can have an age-related cataract in their 40s and 50s. But during middle age, most cataracts are small and do not affect vision. It is after age 60 that most cataracts cause problems with a person's vision. Cataracts do not spread from one eye to the other.

Risk factors for cataracts include: certain diseases (for example, diabetes), personal behavior (smoking, alcohol use), and the environment (prolonged exposure to ultraviolet sunlight).

Your ophthalmologist performs a series of tests such as vision acuity, eye dilation, and tonometry (which measures the pressure inside the eye) to determine if you have cataracts.

#### **Treatment for Cataracts**

The symptoms of early cataract may be improved with new eyeglasses, brighter lighting, anti-glare sunglasses, or magnifying lenses. If these measures do not help, surgery is the only effective treatment. Surgery involves removing the cloudy lens and replacing it with an artificial lens.

A cataract needs to be removed only when vision loss interferes with your everyday activities, such as driving, reading, or watching TV. You and your eye care professional can make this decision together. Once you understand the benefits and risks of surgery, you can make an informed decision about whether cataract surgery is right for you. In most cases, delaying cataract surgery will not cause long-term damage to your eye or make the surgery more difficult. You do not have to rush into surgery.

My situation was unique I have been wearing hard/gas permeable contact lenses for 56 years. A contact lens changes the eyeball shape which must return to the original shape prior to surgery. So, for every 10 years I wore my contacts, I had to have them off my eye prior to surgery (6 weeks). Your ophthalmologist will discuss with you the pros and cons of surgery and provide information for any questions you may have.

My surgery was very quick and painless, and I do not need contact lenses anymore to see clear and bright. Colors are more vivid and I am not a curb kisser anymore. Hurray!!
