NOTES FROM THE MEN'S DROP-IN



SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

To celebrate Gay Pride Month, SAGE of South Florida presents Angels in America: A Gay Fantasia on National **Themes,** by American playwright **Tony Kushner** and starring **Al Pacino** and **Meryl Streep**. The play won numerous awards, including the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, the Tony Award for Best Play, and the Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Play. (The play opened on Broadway in 1993.)

Part One: Millennium Approaches

Set in New York City, the film opens at the end of October 1985, with Louis Ironson, a gay Jew, learning that his lover, WASP Prior Walter, has AIDS. As Prior's illness progresses, Louis becomes unable to cope and moves out, leaving Prior to deal with his abandonment. Prior begins to receive visits from a pair of ghosts who claim to be his own ancestors, and hears an angelic voice telling him to prepare for her arrival. Prior does not know if these visitations are caused by an emotional breakdown or if they are real.

Meanwhile, closeted gay Mormon and Republican Joe Pitt, a law clerk in the same judge's office where Louis holds a clerical job, is offered a position in Washington, D.C., by

his mentor, the McCarthyist lawyer Roy Cohn. Joe hesitates to accept out of concern for his agoraphobic wife Harper, who refuses to move. Harper suspects that Joe does not love her in the same way she loves him, which is confirmed



when Joe confesses his homosexuality. Harper retreats into a drug-fueled escapist fantasy, including a dream where she crosses paths with Prior even though the two of them have never met in the real world. Joe's conservative mother Hannah arrives in New York, where she finds that in reality, Harper has been wandering the streets of the city while Joe begins an affair with Louis. Denying her son's homosexuality, Hannah instead tries to force a reconciliation between Harper and Joe.

Connecting all these characters is Roy Cohn, himself deeply closeted, who has just learned he has AIDS. Cohn uses his political connections to secure a supply of an experimental drug, AZT, at the expense of withholding the drug from participants in a drug trial. Now alone in a hospital, Cohn finds himself judged by his night nurse Belize (a former drag queen and a friend of Prior's) and the ghost of Ethel Rosenberg, who was executed with her husband Julius years before following their conviction at an espionage trial where Cohn served as prosecutor.

Angels in America will be presented on Monday, June 18th at 4:00pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center. Running time is 106 minutes.

Shingles

A man walked into a doctor's office and the receptionist asked him what he had. He replied, "I've got shingles." He completed all the paperwork, the nurse performed all the tests, and the Doctor examined him inside and out. The Doctor said, "I just checked you out thoroughly, and I can't find shingles anywhere." The man replied, "They're outside on the truck. Where do you want them?"

Cause and Effect

Cute joke but Shingles can be very painful. Shingles is a disease that affects your nerves. It can cause burning, shooting pain, tingling, and/or itching, as well as a rash and blisters.

Shingles is caused by the same virus, the varicella-zoster virus (VZV) as chicken pox. If you had chicken pox you have the

virus in your nerve cells and may become active which become Shingles. Half of all shingles cases



are in adults age 60 or older. The chance of getting shingles becomes much greater by age 70. Shingles is not contagious. You can't catch it from someone. But, you can catch chickenpox from someone with shingles. So, if you've never had chickenpox, try to stay away from anyone who has shingles. If you have shingles, try to stay



away from anyone who has not had chickenpox or who might have a weak immune system.

Most cases of shingles last 3 to 5 weeks. The first sign is often burning or tingling pain; sometimes, it includes numbness or itching on one side of the body. Somewhere between 1 and 5 days after the tingling or burning feeling on the skin, a red rash (left picture above) will appear. A few days later, the rash will turn into fluid-filled blisters (right picture). A week to 10 days after that, the blisters dry up and crust over. A couple of weeks later, the scabs clear up. It is possible to get Shingles twice.

It's important to see your Primary Health Practitioner (PHP) no later than 3 days after the rash starts. See your PHP immediately if you notice blisters on your face—this is an urgent problem. Blisters near or in the eye can cause lasting eye damage or blindness.

Prevention

The shingles vaccine is a safe and easy, one-time shot that may keep you from getting shingles. Most people age 60 and older should get vaccinated. You should get the shot even if you have already had shingles or don't remember having chickenpox. However, if you have a weak immune system or allergies to certain medicines, make sure to check with your PHP first. You can get the shingles vaccine at your PHP office and at some pharmacies. All Medicare Part D plans and most private health insurance plans will cover the cost.









