By popular demand the SAGE Computer Club has returned to the basics. We have begun teaching a



## SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

In honor of Oscar Wilde's birthday (October 16, 1854), SAGE of South Florida presents *The Trials of Oscar Wild* (1960), directed by Ken Hughes, starring Peter Finch.

At the height of his fame (his plays being much celebrated in London in the 1890's), Oscar Wilde angers the Marquis of Queensberry by having what is whispered and gossiped about as a romantic relationship with Queensberry's son, who is twenty years Wilde's junior. When Queensberry slanders Wilde, the arrogant artist decides to take the matter to court and brings about his own downfall.

Oscar Fingal O'Flahertie Wills Wilde was an Irish playwright, novelist, essayist, and poet. He became one of London's most popular playwrights in the early 1890s. He is remembered for his epigrams, his novel The Picture of Dorian Gray, his plays, as well as the circumstances of his imprisonment and early death. He became known for his involvement in the rising philosophy of aestheticism. After university, Wilde moved to London into fashionable cultural and social circles. Known for his biting wit, flamboyant dress and glittering conversation, Wilde became one of the best-known personalities of his day.



At the turn of the 1890s, he refined his ideas about the supremacy of art in a series of dialogues and essays and incorporated themes of decadence, duplicity, and beauty into his only novel, The Picture of Dorian Gray (1890). He produced four society comedies in the

early 1890s, which made him one of the most successful playwrights of late Victorian London.

At the height of his fame and success, while his masterpiece, The Importance of Being Earnest (1895), was still on stage in London, Wilde had the Marquis of Queensberry prosecuted for libel. The Marguis was the father of Wilde's lover, Lord Alfred Douglas. The trial unearthed evidence that caused Wilde to drop his charges and led to his own arrest and trial for gross indecency with men. After two more trials, he was convicted and imprisoned for two years' hard labor. In 1897, in prison, he wrote *De Profundis*, which was published in 1905, a long letter which discusses his spiritual journey through his trials, forming a dark counterpoint to his earlier philosophy of pleasure. Upon his release he left immediately for France, never to return to Ireland or Britain. There he wrote his last work, The Ballad of Reading Gaol (1898), a long poem commemorating the harsh rhythms of prison life. He died destitute in Paris at the age of 46 on November 30, 1900.



#### Glaucoma

What do Whoopi Goldberg, Bono, Andrea Bocelli and little old me have in common? We all have Glaucoma. Glaucoma is a group of diseases that damage the eye's optic nerve and can result in vision loss and blindness. However, with early detection and treatment, you can often protect your eyes against serious vision loss. Open angle glaucoma is the most common but there are other types too. Andrea Bocelli had congenital glaucoma which left him partially blind but a head injury when he was 12 caused his total blindness.



#### Cause of Glaucoma

A clear fluid passes through your eye and nourishes it. There is a small drainage hole for the fluid to exit the eye on an angle. When the fluid drains too slowly and does not all drain the pressure builds inside the eye and damages your optic nerve. When the optic nerve is damaged from this increased pressure open angle pressure glaucoma develops and blindness can occur. Go to your eye care professional once a year to measure your eye pressure, which is a painless procedure. Those who are at high risk for glaucoma are African Americans over age 40; everyone over age 60, especially Mexican Americans; and people with a family history of the disease.

#### **Symptoms**

Open-angle glaucoma has no symptoms. It causes no pain. Vision stays normal. Glaucoma can develop in one or both eyes. Without treatment, people with glaucoma will slowly lose their peripheral (side) vision. As glaucoma remains untreated, people may miss objects to the side and out of the corner of their eye. They seem to be looking through a tunnel. Over time, straight-ahead (central) vision may decrease until no vision remains. There is no cure for glaucoma. Vision lost from the disease cannot be restored.

#### **Treatment**

Medicines in the form of eye drops or pills are the most common early treatment for glaucoma. Taken regularly, these eye drops lower eye pressure. Some medicines cause the eye to make less fluid. Others lower pressure by helping fluid drain from the eye. You cannot stop taking the medicines. There is also laser and conventional surgery to create a new opening for drainage. These are performed on an outpatient setting. When I had my cataract surgery earlier this year my surgeon also placed stents in both eyes for drainage and for now I do not have to take eye drops.

Please take care of your eyes because here at SAGE we only have eyes for you.
