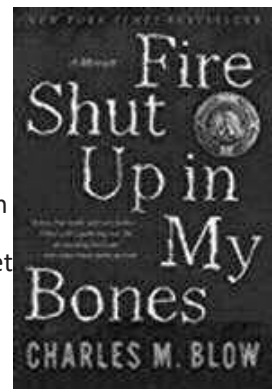
The SAGE Computer Club has changed!

SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

Charles M. Blow's exquisite memoir – *Fire Shut Up in My Bones* – is a meditation on the moments, the larcenies small and grand, that strip innocence from childhood. Blow, a Louisiana native and op-ed columnist for the New York Times, has rendered a portrait of the small-town South at a liminal moment, the 1970s and '80s – close enough to a turbulent past for change to be apparent yet in some ways fundamentally the same place it has always been. The epithet that most scars Blow's young life is not the one most hurled at black Louisianans. That word falls from the mouths of people exiled to the periphery of the world Blow inhabits, but he is teased, challenged, ridiculed as a "punk" – the local aspersion for gays – by those close enough to do damage. Blow's book is as much about his navigation of the rough, unyielding boundaries of masculinity in a distinctly black, Southern, rural world as it is about the social forces that produced that world in the first place. That he achieves some modicum of reconciliation is a signal achievement of both his life and the book.

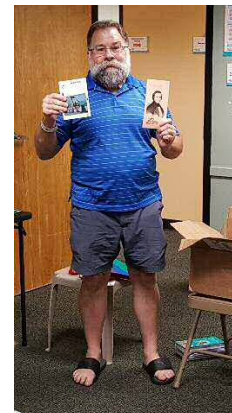

SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The SAGE November movie is ***Sunday Bloody Sunday***, a 1971 British production that showcased a veteran actor, an actress with ascending popularity and an actor whom some believed would have meteoric fame. This trio was provided with a thrilling script which mixed in some evolving themes, flashbacks and other material that garnered interest from audiences domestically and abroad.

The film starts out as subdued, where the characters are introduced as either engaging in their work responsibilities or preparing for such. Alex (played by **Glenda Jackson**, "A Touch of Class") and Bob (**Murray Head**) work for a wealthy family as caretakers. The kids are subjected to their offbeat behavior, including smoking marijuana while half-clothed.

This is in stark contrast to the lifestyle of their conservative parents.

After having a disagreement, Bob leaves Alex. He then is comforted by Daniel (a doctor portrayed by **Peter Finch**, who was nominated for Best Actor). They greet each other with a smooch on the lips. It is at that point that the audience realizes this may have been one of the inaugural episodes for this display of affection in a motion picture.

Eventually, Bob returns to Alex. One of these reunions occurs on a weekend when they're in charge of the kids. They spend part of it playing in a park with the children and their dog. A tragic incident ensues (which suggests the movie title), that triggers Alex to recall a similar predicament in her childhood. Now that she has reached her middle age, Alex contemplates making changes in her work and domestic life. After a visit with her parents, the generation gap rears its not so pretty head. The interaction between Alex and her mother (Mrs. Greville, **Dame Peggy Ashcroft**) makes this decision even dicier.

Subsequently, Bob connects with Daniel. Both question if they should make life adjustments, but only one verbalizes this to the other. Bob reveals he is considering moving to a different country to open a business. Daniel chooses to deal with his midlife crisis in a more private fashion. This comes to the fore while attending the bar mitzvah of a family member. Despite being content with his sexual orientation, Daniel's kin inquire about his matrimonial intentions.

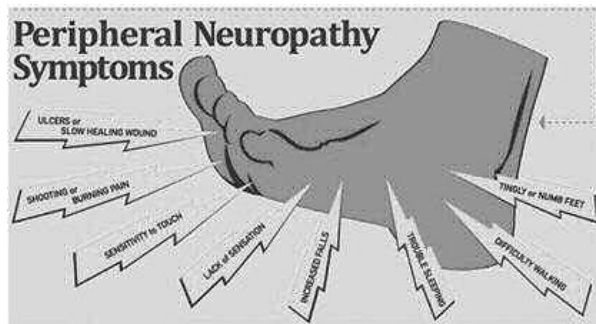

A Tingle that won't let you Tango

"I have pins and needles and shooting pains in my hands and feet" so describes our own SAGE member and the retired Broadway star Michael Vita. This is the same description more than 30 million American say what peripheral neuropathy (PN) feels like. What Is Peripheral Neuropathy? Peripheral means beyond (in this case, beyond the brain and the spinal cord.) Neuro is related to the nerves and pathy to disease. Your peripheral nervous system sends information from your brain and spinal cord (central nervous system) to the rest of your body. A disturbance in sending these messages causes peripheral neuropathy.

Causes

This is not a single disease; peripheral neuropathy is nerve damage caused by a number of conditions. Causes include: alcoholism, autoimmune diseases such as rheumatoid arthritis, diabetes (more than 60% of diabetics develop some type of neuropathy), exposure to poisons as heavy metals or chemicals, medications especially cancer chemotherapy, infections. viral (HIV) or bacterial infections, including Lyme disease, shingles, hepatitis C, injuries or pressure on a nerve, tumors, vitamin deficiencies as B-1, B-6 and B-12. Other diseases that can cause PN are kidney disease, liver disease, connective tissue disorders and an under-active thyroid (hypothyroidism). They may also be caused by idiopathic means (30%) which is a fancy medical word for "we have no idea of the cause."



Diagnosis

A physical exam is required which may include blood tests. A full medical history which includes your symptoms, your lifestyle, exposure to toxins, drinking habits and a family history of nervous system (neurological) diseases. A neurological examination which would include checking your tendon reflexes, muscle strength, tone, ability to feel certain sensations, and your posture and coordination. Your health practitioner may also order CT, MRI, nerve function tests, and nerve or skin biopsy.

Treatment

Treatment goals are to manage the condition causing your neuropathy and to relieve symptoms. Medication as pain relievers (prescribed and over the counter), anti-seizures medications, creams and anti-depressants. ANTI- DEPRESSANTS? Yes, many medications are used for other conditions than the primary reason they were originally prescribed. Therapies may be prescribed as physical therapy, Transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulation aka TENS (Electrodes placed on the skin deliver a gentle electric current at varying frequencies) and surgery. Home remedies can also help especially if you are diabetic by taking care of your feet and watching your glucose levels. Exercise, healthy meals, avoiding excessive alcohol, and quitting smoking can also be of assistance to prevent further damage.

Early diagnosis and treatment offer the best chance for controlling your symptoms and preventing further damage to your peripheral nerves.

While on a party line, Alex discovers that Bob has not only been unfaithful to her but with someone of his own gender. Acquainted from a previous business relationship, Daniel and Alex meet and laugh about being involved in this triangle, while both wait for Bob to make the next move.

As one can imagine, ***Sunday Bloody Sunday*** was difficult to cast because of the unorthodox plot. Several renowned performers believed that many of the behaviors demonstrated were too risqué. This may have been a blessing in disguise since the cast was stellar from beginning to end. Add to this the soundtrack of a piece from Mozart's "Cosi Fan Tutte" and other nuances by the director, **John Schlesinger** ("Midnight Cowboy"), the viewers will have their expectations exceeded.

Sunday Bloody Sunday is rated R for sparse obscenity, but primarily for situations that were out of the mainstream for its time. It will screen with subtitles on **Monday, November 19 at 4pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center**. The 110 -minute running time will allow viewers the opportunity to discuss the proceedings as we dine afterwards.

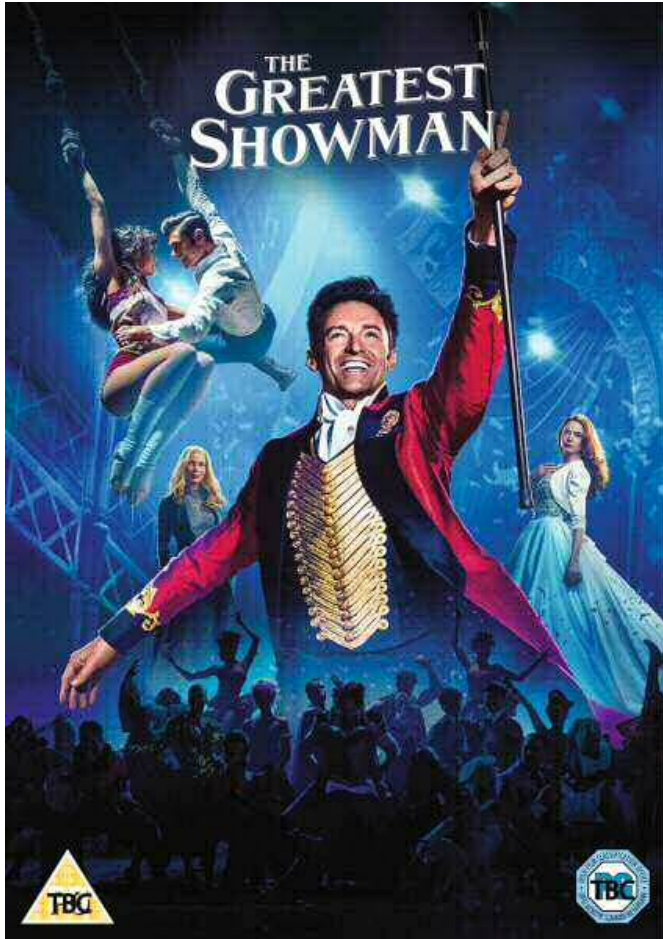

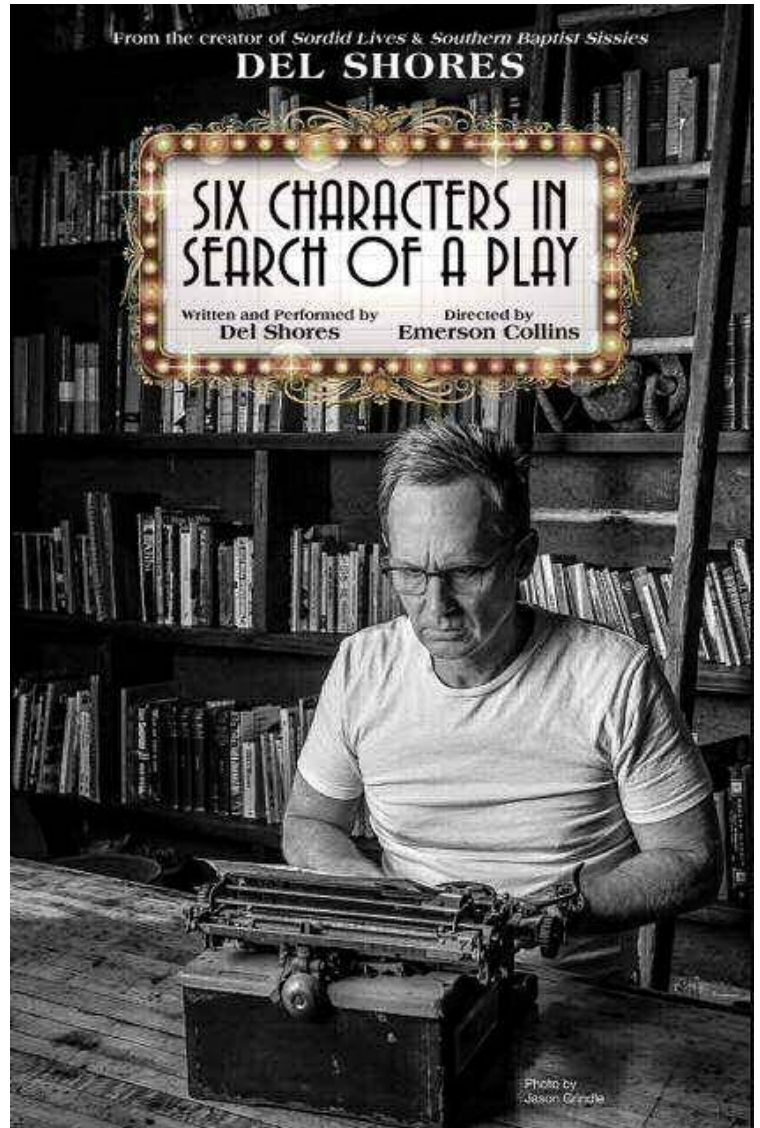
