The SAGE Computer Club has changed!

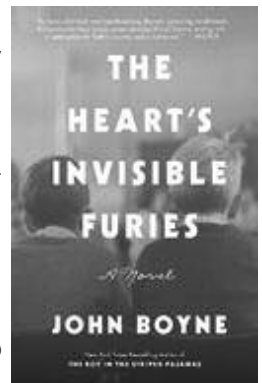

John Boyne's epic novel – *The Heart's Invisible Furies* – covers the life of a gay Irishman, Cyril Avery, in the latter half of the twentieth century from the time of his birth and adoption to his later decline and eventual death in the present day. With the skill of a craftsman, Boyne shifts his story from a 1940s homophobic Ireland dominated by the Catholic Church and staunchly conservative lawmakers to a liberal Amsterdam of sex trafficking and liberation, to a New York City overwhelmed by the AIDS epidemic and then back again to a now-more-tolerant Ireland. Dickensian in scope, the story has all the trappings of a nineteenth century novel with its elaborate plot points, its twists and turns of fate and coincidence, and its ribald characterizations.

SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

In honor of **Transgender Day of Remembrance**, celebrated just last month on November 20th, SAGE of South Florida presents **The Danish Girl**, starring **Eddie Redmayne**.

The Danish Girl is a 2015 romantic drama film directed by **Tom Hooper**, based on the 2000 novel of the same name by **David Ebershoff**. A fictitious love story loosely inspired by the lives of Danish artists **Lili Elbe** and **Gerda Wegener**. Lili and Gerda's marriage and work evolve as they navigate Lili's groundbreaking journey as a transgender pioneer.



Lili Ilse Elvenes (28 December 1882 – 13 September 1931), better known as **Lili Elbe**, was a Danish transgender woman and one of the first identifiable recipients of sex reassignment surgery. Elbe was born **Einar Magnus Andreas Wegener** and was a successful painter under that name. During this time, she also presented as Lili (sometimes spelled Lily) and was publicly introduced as Einar's sister. After successfully transitioning in 1930, she changed her legal name to Lili Ilse Elvenes and stopped painting altogether. She died from complications involving a uterus transplant. Her autobiography, 'Man into Woman,' was posthumously published in 1933.

Gerda Marie Fredrikke Wegener (née **Gottlieb**; 15 March 1886 – 28 July 1940) was a Danish illustrator and painter. Her artwork largely contains images of fashionable women in the style of art nouveau and later art deco.



Copenhagen, Denmark, 1926. Einar Wegener (played by Eddie Redmayne) and his wife Gerda (**Alicia Vikander**) are a happily married couple. One day Einar poses for a portrait by Gerda while wearing a dress. This is initially done as a lark, as is the later attendance at a party dressed as a woman. However, Einar soon discovers that she is, in fact, a woman and over time prefers being Lili. At first, she and Gerda try to have her situation "cured" but this leads nowhere (other than to too many doctors trying to have Lili locked up as a pervert and/or lunatic).

Turn Blue to Pink

The holidays are here and this can be a difficult time of the year for seniors. The year my husband died I knew I could not be home Christmas day. There were too many memories of friends, dinners and laughter. So, I looked for a place where Christmas is not in the spotlight, and I found it - Las Vegas. I left Christmas Eve and returned New Year's Day (cheap flights those days, too). It helped.

Senior holiday "blues" can be triggered by many events, such as: Being alone, lost loved ones, unrealistic holiday expectations, better past holidays, loss of a cherished home, and coping with poor health.

I researched some ideas to make your holidays a more- lively pink than sad blue.

- ❖ Simple home decorations. My husband had a lighted ceramic Christmas tree. Every year he went into the closet, unwrapped it, plugged it in and stated, "I'm done."
- ❖ Start new traditions. Check out your local community centers, homeless shelters, and see what they need. Can you help by baking, volunteering time or just talking to those who are unfortunate? Being present is a wonderful gift.
- ❖ Go to senior's holiday events at senior centers or organizations. Learn about others. Go to a place of worship that is not your own and listen and participate in other traditions.
- ❖ Minimize the sad holiday triggers by planning events to create alternatives and make them bearable.
- ❖ Discuss your feelings and needs with others. Do not be Braveheart and have the attitude, "I can do this and nobody needs to learn I am weak." You may be surprised that others share your same sad feelings. Talk, talk, talk, and heal, heal, heal.
- ❖ Find or start a senior discussion group and share your happy holiday memories.
- ❖ If you cook, make your specialty and donate your goody delights to others.
- ❖ Exercise. Yes. THAT word pops up again. Simple (Mall walk?) easy activity that has been approved by your health practitioner. You will be surprised how it helps your mood.
- ❖ Monitor your holiday goodie intake. Too much sugary foods and alcohol can dampen spirits.
- ❖ If you are able, take a part-time seasonal job. It gets you out of the house and puts extra bucks in your stocking.
- ❖ If you are homebound, invite acquaintances (who may become good friends) for something as simple as tea and small little snacks. Can't or unable to cook? Contact your favorite restaurant and use Uber for delivery. Publix will deliver items for your little soiree.

I hope some of these ideas will be helpful. The second year without my husband, I took out all the decorations. Yes, I cried but realized that I had to cry to get over the loss and recover. After the holidays I gave many of the decorations to family, friends, housekeepers or donated them to organizations. Now, I have just simple decorations.

Only YOU can make your holidays merry (Mary?). Do not count on others. Have a good one. HO HO-ski (Polish Santa).

Her voyage of self-discovery will ultimately lead to her undergoing the first ever sex-change operation.

As Lili's continued existence presenting as male becomes too much to bear, she starts to seek help from psychologists, but none yields any result, and in one instance, almost leads her into being committed to an asylum. Eventually, Lili and Gerda meet Dr. Kurt Warnekros. Dr. Warnekros explains that he has met several people like her, who are physically male but identify as female, and proposes a new, innovative and controversial solution: male to female sex reassignment surgery. This would entail a two-part procedure that involves first removing Lili's external genitalia and then, after a period of recovery, fashioning a vagina. He warns Lili and Gerda that it is a very dangerous operation that has never been attempted before, and Lili would be one of the first to undergo it. Lili immediately agrees and, soon after, travels to Germany to begin the surgery.

"The Danish Girl" runs two hours and will be shown on **Monday, December 17, 2018 at 4:00pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center.**
