SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The SAGE January movie is *Lost Horizon*. When it came out in 1937, the depression was in the rear-view mirror, but there were ominous signals ahead, which resulted in World War II. Audiences during this time gravitated to motion pictures that had uplifting themes. This movie was an example of what results from a novel (by the same name) that was full of intrigue, Hollywood glitz & a star studded cast.

Although the subject matter is fictional, the film accurately portrays what was happening in China during the 1930's with invasions and rapid social changes. The opening

caption refers to "white people" involved in a massive relocation effort. Robert Conway (portrayed by British actor, **Ronald Colman**) is a diplomat who aspires to be a major political figure & this mission would get him the publicity. As the plane is departing for a safer destination, a variety of individuals of different backgrounds hurriedly embark, which provides for a memorable experience.



After many hours in flight, the passengers become weary and demand an explanation. These inquiries were greeted with the pilot wielding a pistol at them. Miraculously, they remain calm, until they sense that the plane is taking a hard landing on top of a mountain. What the party discovers is that the hijacking was planned, but the pilot's heart attack & subsequent crash were not anticipated.

Conrad & the others are greeted by a group who convinces them to proceed thru the snowdrifts to their settlement. They hike down a valley to Shangri-La, whose climate is just like Florida's. The folks whom they encounter when entering this place are just as affable as the rescuers. The residents possess the secret to living a long, stress-free life. After receiving lavish treatment, the visitors generally have a positive reaction towards this fantasy land. One individual tries to spread doubt about how genuine this place really is. Conrad requests a meeting with their leader, The High Lama (Sam Jaffe), who claims to be well over 100 years old.

He is enchanted with this sage and conveys this to his fellow refugees. At this point, some become homesick and utter complaints, such as not having radio reception. Conrad finds their antipathy towards Shangri-La to be quite off-putting. When he becomes romantically involved with a native-born damsel (Jane Wyatt), Conrad's views about this land are cemented.

BROADWAY CARES/EQUITY FIGHTS AIDS DISPLAY at STONEWALL NATIONAL MUSEUM

Stonewall National Museum – Wilton Manors, located at 2157 Wilton Drive, Wilton Manors, is currently exhibiting items describing the history of "Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS" including a framed program of the first fundraiser, A modest Vaudeville, which was produced and performed by the touring company of "42nd Street," in San Francisco (1985). The exhibit includes framed letters from the "42nd Street" company to Actors' Equity Association (1988); Actors' Equity's response; a notice in the BC/EFA's program from then-president of Actors' Equity, Ms. Colleen Dewhurst and a letter of appreciation from Tom Viola, Executive Director of "Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS." (In 2018 BC/EFA provided \$231,000 in grants to 23 agencies in Florida, including three in Wilton Manors: Latinos Salud; Pet Project for Pets, and Poverello Center.) Archival items are on loan from SAGE of South Florida Board Member, Michael Vita, and are on display until January 20, 2019.
