
SAGE TURNS 25 YEARS OLD THIS YEAR



The SAGE of South Florida story began in 1992 when Ed Jones was asked by the Sunshine Cathedral to lead a task force to explore expanding programs for seniors at the church. Mr. Jones soon discovered that there was a community-wide need for senior LGBT programs in Broward County. After consulting with the SAGE of New York organization, he organized a "kick-off" luncheon at the Garden Restaurant on May 21, 1994 to determine interest in establishing a SAGE affiliate. The luncheon was a success - 159 tickets were sold.

On June 20, 1994, a single "PAGE" was printed to chart the progress of the organization and recount what occurred at the initial luncheon. A second luncheon was held one month later on July 24th, 1994, at Tropical Acres Restaurant. Attendance exceeded 250. S.A.G.E. of Broward County was officially in business. Committees were formed, activities were planned, and Articles of incorporation were filed. And, in August, 1994, the inaugural issue of this newsletter, *The SAGE*, was published. By 2003, the impact of SAGE extended beyond the boundaries of Broward County. In May of that year, our name was officially changed to *SAGE of South Florida*.



A Single Man is a 2009 American film based on the novel of the same name by Christopher Isherwood. It is directed by Tom Ford and stars Colin Firth, who was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Actor for his portrayal of George Falconer, a depressed gay British university professor living in Southern California in 1962. It also stars Julianne Moore and Matthew Goode.

On November 30, 1962, George Falconer (*Colin Firth*), a middle-aged English college professor living in Los Angeles, dreams that he encounters the body of his longtime partner, Jim (*Matthew Goode*), at the scene of the car accident that took Jim's life eight months earlier. He bends down to kiss his dead lover. After awakening, George delivers a voiceover discussing the pain and depression he has endured since Jim's death and his intention to commit suicide that evening.



George receives a phone call from his dearest friend, Charley (Julianne Moore), who projects lightheartedness despite her also being miserable. George goes about his day putting his affairs in order and focusing on the beauty of isolated events, believing he is seeing things for the last time. At times, he recalls his sixteen-year-long relationship with Jim.

During the school day, George comes into contact with a student, Kenny Potter, who shows interest in George and disregards conventional boundaries of student-professor discussion. George also forms an unexpected connection with a Spanish male prostitute, Carlos. That evening George meets Charley for dinner. Though they initially reminisce and amuse themselves by dancing, Charley's desire for a deeper relationship with George and her failure to understand his relationship with Jim angers George.


George goes to a bar and discovers that Kenny has followed him. They get a round of drinks, go skinny dipping, and then return to George's house and continue drinking. George passes out and wakes up in bed with Kenny asleep in another room.

Joints

Osteoarthritis (OA) becomes a big factor in our lives as we get older. (OA) is the most common chronic condition of the joints, affecting approximately 27 million Americans. OA can affect any joint, but it occurs most often in knees, hips, lower back and neck, small joints of the fingers and the bases of the thumb and big toe.

A firm, rubbery material called cartilage covers the end of each bone. Cartilage provides a smooth, gliding surface for joint motion, acts as a cushion between the bones and synovial fluid is the lubricant. OA develops when the cartilage breaks down, causing pain, swelling and problems moving the joint.

Treatment

Joint pain can be kept under control with some life style changes, taking non-narcotic pain relievers such as Tylenol and maybe physical therapy.

Joint Replacement

HealthinAging.org suggests the following: If you answer "yes" to the following questions, you may benefit from joint replacement surgery:

Does joint pain make it hard for you to sleep?

Is the pain keeping you from doing things you want to do, like visit friends, or travel? Do everyday activities, such as standing from a sitting position, or walking upstairs, hurt?

Items to discuss about surgery with your Health Practitioner

- 1. Discuss your symptoms and options.
- 2. Learn about the surgery benefits risks, recovery time, pain management and post-op therapy.
- 3. Ask about less invasive surgery, such as laparoscopic surgery (small incision).
- 4. Inform your health practitioner about your prescription medications including over the counter pills, vitamins, herbs and other remedies.
- 5. Smoke? Quit before surgery. Smoking slows the healing and recovery process.
- 6. Exercise (Yeah, THAT word comes up again). Strengthening your arms and upper body before surgery will make it easier to use a walker or crutches.
- 7. Eat right. Seniors do not eat enough protein and you may be asked to take nutritional supplements before and after surgery.
- 8. Lose excess weight. Obesity can lengthen recovery
- 9. Make arrangements for recovery. Ask for assistance from friends, relatives, and home assistance providers.
- 10. Make physical therapy your top priority. Those who obtained therapy have less post-op pain and better recovery from surgery.

Always prepare yourself to ask questions from your health care provider for better outcomes from treatment. Now, you can take that ballroom dancing course at The Pride Center. Cha cha cha.

Interesting note about director Tom Ford. He was born on August 27, 1961, in Austin, Texas. While studying architecture at the Paris campus of the Parsons School of Design, Ford decided to switch to fashion. He became women's wear Designer for Gucci in 1990 and Creative Director in 1994. Under Ford's direction, Gucci's annual sales grew to \$3 billion. Since resigning from Gucci in 2005, Ford has launched his own fashion brand and he also directed Colin Firth in the film The Single Man.


