

Written with emotional depth, wit and acuity - White Houses by Amy Bloom - is a fictional re-creation of the

likely romance between first lady Eleanor NATIONAL BESTSELLER Roosevelt and journalist Lorena Hickok based on research that included the 1980 release of nearly 3,000 letters between the 2 women. "I never envied a wife or a husband, until I met Eleanor. Then, I would have traded everything I ever had, every limo ride, every skinny dip, every byline and carefree stroll, for what Franklin had, polio and all." Lorena Hickok met Eleanor Roosevelt in 1932 while reporting



on Franklin Roosevelt's first presidential campaign. Having grown up worse than poor in South Dakota and having reinvented herself as the most prominent woman reporter in America, "Hick," as she was known to her friends and admirers, was not quite instantly charmed by the idealistic, patrician Eleanor. Strong sympathies soon emerged, however, and over time matured into a lasting love and a life that Hick never expected to have. By seeing the Roosevelt era through the most unlikely of outsiders-turned insider, a hidden chapter of East Wing history is brought to life. # SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

The Basketball Diaries (1995) is the urban classic coming-of-age story about sex, drugs, and basketball directed by Scott Kalvert, starring Leonardo DiCaprio, Lorraine Bracco, James Madio, and Mark Wahlberg. The film is an adaptation of Jim Carroll's autobiographical work of the same name, telling the story of Carroll's teenage years as a promising high school basketball player and writer who developed an addiction to heroin with his misguided friends.

(James Dennis Carroll (1949 – 2009) grew up to become a renowned poet and punk rocker. But in this memoir of the mid-1960s, set during his coming-of-age from 12 to 15, he was a rebellious teenager making a place and a name for himself on the unforgiving streets of New York City. During these years, he



chronicled his experiences, and the result is a diary of unparalleled candor that conveys his alternately hilarious and terrifying teenage existence.)
As a member of a seemingly unbeatable high school basketball squad, Jim's life centers around the basketball court and the court becomes a metaphor for the world in his mind. A best friend who is dying of leukemia, a coach who makes sexual advances to Jim and takes unacceptable liberties with the boys on his team, teenage sexual angst, and an unhealthy appetite for

heroin -- all of these begin to encroach on young Jim's dream of becoming a basketball star. Soon, the dark streets of New York become a refuge from his mother's mounting concern for her son. He can't go home and his only escape from the reality of the streets is heroin for which he steals, robs *and prostitutes himself*. Only with the help of Reggie, an older neighborhood friend with whom Jim "picked up a game" now and then, is he able to begin the long journey back to sanity.

The journey ends with Jim's incarceration in Riker's Island for four crimes: assault, robbery, resistance of arrest, and possession of narcotics. After Jim spends months in prison and ceases his drug use, he gets released, changes his life, and performs poetry drawn from his diaries.

Two Interesting Notes: (1) After the 1997 Heath High School shooting, activist Jack Thompson brought this film into a \$33 million lawsuit in 1999 claiming that the film's plot caused 14-year-old Michael Carneal to shoot members of a prayer group. The case was dismissed in 2001. (2) The film became controversial in the aftermath of the Columbine High School massacre and the Heath High School shooting when critics noted similarities between these shooting attacks and a dream sequence in the film in which the protagonist wears a black trench-coat and shoots six classmates in his school classroom. The film has been specifically named in lawsuits brought by the relatives of murder victims.

The film runs 102 minutes and will be screened on Monday, April 15th at 4:00pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center.

#### **STROKE**

In June 2001, I awoke one morning with severe vertigo and vomiting. I was rushed to the emergency room and initially it was thought I had an ear infection most commonly seen in extreme vertigo. The vomiting continued for 23 hours and finally stopped. I was released from the hospital but that evening I developed blurry vision in my right eye and weakness in my right arm. STROKE. There are many different signs of a stroke or as the medical profession calls it Cerebrovascular accident (CVA). Actor Luke Perry recently died of a stroke.

Hippocrates described these attacks as "apoplexies", which he attributed to a "stagnation of the bodily humors". The Greek physician Galen of Pergamon made the first true association between apoplexy and blood flow to the brain. The word "stroke" itself comes from non-medical people from the notion of a stroke from the hand of God, implying they were a punishment for some evil-doing. Today a CVA is a cessation of blood flow to part of the brain, resulting in a wide variety of unfortunate neurological deficits.

#### **Risk Factors**

The following are risk factors of a stroke: family history of a stroke, Hispanic or African American decent, high blood pressure (Hypertension), smoking, quivering of the top part of the heart (Atrial Fibrillation), Type II diabetes, abnormal increase in platelets or red blood cells (Polycythemia), or when the heart is unable to pump blood efficiently (Cardiomyopathy).

#### **Types of Strokes**

**Ischemic Stroke** - (87%) This happens when blood flow through the artery that supplies oxygen-rich blood to the brain becomes blocked. Blood clots often cause the blockages that lead to ischemic strokes.

**Hemorrhagic Stroke** - when an artery in the brain leaks blood or breaks open. The leaked blood puts too much pressure on brain cells, which damages them.

**Transient Ischemic Attack** (TIA) – a "mini-stroke." Due to blood flow to the brain that is blocked for only a short time—usually no more than 5 minutes.

#### **Signs and Symptoms**

#### Signs of a Stroke

The National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke notes these major signs of stroke:

- 1. Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arms or legs.
- 2. Sudden confusion or trouble speaking or understanding others.
- 3. Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- 4. Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, or loss of balance or coordination.
- 5. Sudden severe headache with no known cause.

If you think if you or someone is having a stroke, you should call **9-1-1 immediately.** Time is precious.

#### Treatment

From the moment a stroke occurs, the clock is ticking. Stroke treatment is heavily dependent on the speed of interventional medicine, and there is a very small window of opportunity to reverse what damage may have occurred, ideally within <u>one hour and not more than three hours.</u>

#### Prevention

I know a stroke is terrifying to all of us. Controlling those risk factors described which includes a healthy diet, limit alcohol, and healthy weight, taking your medication for your high blood pressure, diabetes, heart and physical activity. Fortunately, my stroke affects resolved in six weeks BUT I still can have another stroke.


