STONEWALL 50

Friday night! After a long work week in Midtown Manhattan, it was time for a little night life. It had been eight years since he had fled South Florida for New York. His mother had threatened him with a gun. She'd rather have her son dead than be a queer.

He was out with his friends in Greenwich Village, taking in the sights and sounds of the evening. It was now an hour past midnight when they ventured down the street and entered the bar at Number 53.



They pulled open the heavy wooden door and entered the long, dark, gloomy space. It was crowded, smoky, and noisy. They didn't like the atmosphere. They left and walked over to the little park across the street. Christopher Park. Now, what? Should they find another bar or just call it a night and go home?

Suddenly, screams pierced the air. A crowd formed in front of the bar at Number 53. Mounted police arrived. Then came the police cars. People were shouting and chanting and throwing things. Drag queens hurled their high heels at their oppressors, the men in blue. The young man from South Florida, standing across the street from the Stonewall Inn during the early morning hours of June 28, 1969, had just become an eye witness to history.

Before the Stonewall Riots, there had been stirrings for Gay Power and Gay Liberation. (After all, it was the Sixties, man!) But, the "raid and uprising" is acknowledged as the "catalyst that launched the modern LGBT civil rights movement" according to the Proclamation issued by President Barack Obama on June 24, 2016, which established Christopher Park as part of the Stonewall National Monument.

The LGBT community has achieved so much in the past 50 years. We can safely associate and organize without fear of persecution or prosecution. In 1994, when members of the South Florida LGBT community decided to exercise their right to associate and organize, they created what is today our SAGE of South Florida. And, 25 years later, SAGE continues to provide social and educational programs for the senior gay community. 2019 is indeed a year for all of us to celebrate!

By the way, remember that young man who stood witness on the night of June 28, 1969? He eventually returned to South Florida, and was grudgingly accepted by his mother. After retiring, he found a purpose devoting his time and talent to our community, and especially to SAGE of South Florida. His name is Carl Barton, the Vice President of SAGE.



GET READY TO 'FLIP YOUR WIG' - With 'TOOTSIE'

Now you can see the unpredictable laugh-out-loud comedy — The original 1982 motion picture, *Tootsie* - starring **Dustin Hoffman, Jessica Lange, Teri Garr, Dabney Coleman, Charles Durning, Bill Murray** and **Geena Davis** in director **Sydney Pollack's** heart-filled classic that heralded a new era of Hollywood wig-flipping, and set a new standard for unpredictable laugh-out-loud comedy.


Michael Dorsey (Dustin Hoffman) is a talented actor, but his demanding nature and stubborn temperament have antagonized every producer in New York. Now his agent insists no one will hire him. But Michael needs money, eight thousand dollars to be exact, and to earn it, he's willing to play the role of a lifetime.

Notes: The movie title – *Tootsie* – was named after Dustin Hoffman's mother's pet name for him. He was her *Tootsie-Wootsie*!

The film was a major critical and financial success, the second most profitable film of 1982, and was nominated

for ten Academy Awards including Best Picture. Jessica Lange was the only winner, for Best Supporting Actress. The additional nominations included Best Actor (Dustin Hoffman), Best Supporting Actress (Teri Garr), Best Director, Best Original Screenplay, Best Cinematography, Best Song ('It Must Be You'), Best Editing and Best Sound.

In 1998, the Library of Congress deemed the film "culturally, histori-



cally, or aesthetically significant" and selected it for preservation in the National Film Registry.

Notes: *Tootsie*, the musical adaptation of the hit **1982**Dustin Hoffman comedy, opened on Broadway at the Marquis Theatre on April 23, 2019 to great reviews. The show received ten Tony Award nominations including Best Musical, Best Director, Best Leading Actor, Best Featured Actress, Best Featured Actor, Best Book, Best Score, Best Choreography, Best Orchestrations and Best Costume Design. (*The 73rd Annual Tony Awards will be held on June 9, 2019, to recognize achievement in Broadway productions during the 2018–19 season.*)

Tootsie runs 116 minutes and will be shown on Monday, June 17th at 4:00pm in Room 204 of The Pride Center.

What is this Glut of Gluten?

Gluten-free this, and gluten-free that, what is this gluten all about? During the past few years gluten-free products have exploded in our grocery stores, restaurants and advertising. Why?

Gluten is proteins found in wheat, rye, and barley. Gluten helps foods maintain their shape, acting as the glue that holds food together. Gluten in wheat is found in breads, baked goods, soups, pasta, cereals, sauces, salad dressings and roux. Gluten in rye is found in pumpernickel and cereals. Gluten in barley is found in malt (malted barley flour, malted milk and milkshakes, malt vinegar) food coloring, soups, beer and Brewer's Yeast.

The small "c"

The "c" is for celiac disease, an autoimmune disorder. Gluten in this disease triggers immune system activity that damages the lining of the small intestine. Over time this damage prevents the absorption of nutrients from food. Therefore, those who have this disease are the only individuals who must have a gluten-free diet. One in every 133 people has celiac disease in the U.S., approximately 2.4 million people. Estimates are that almost 2 million do not know they have the disease. So, the abundance of gluten-free products is a boom for those who have the disease.

Signs and symptom of Celiac Disease

There are more than 200 known celiac disease symptoms which may occur in the digestive system or other parts of the body. Some people develop celiac disease as a child, others as an adult. The reason for this is still unknown.

Diagnosis and Treatment

Celiac disease is difficult to diagnose because it affects people differently and may take time to diagnose. The only treatment is a gluten-free diet with supplements.

Myths

There are many myths and problems for those without this disease adhering to a gluten-free diet. Removing gluten from your diet changes your overall intake of fiber, vitamins and other nutrients. Therefore, regardless of your reasons for following a gluten-free diet, it's important to know how it can affect your overall nutritional needs. There is not enough clinical evidence to determine the accuracy of the following claims about the diet's results: weight loss, overall improved health and improved gastrointestinal health. Some gluten-free foods also have higher fat and sugar contents than the gluten-containing food being replaced. Gluten-free foods cost more than gluten foods. This is a good money maker for advertisers to those without celiac disease to increase their profits.

Talk to your health care practitioner or dietitian about foods that would provide healthy, nutrient-rich alternatives



Robert Mapplethorpe photographed flowers, children, celebs (Warhol, Capote, the young Arnold Schwarzenegger) and himself in high contrast black-and-white that commanded attention. But what made him infamous and iconic were his portraits of nudes, often reduced to body parts. A year after his death, a retrospective of his work at the Contemporary Arts Center in Cincinnati was charged with obscenity simply for displaying his so-called "dirty pictures" creating a debate that shook the art world and a cultural war that is still raging.
