SAGE Book Group Begins 25th Year

The **SAGE Book Group** will soon be celebrating the start of its 25th year – the longest-running SAGE-sponsored activity in South Florida.

Initially called “The Book Bunch”, the group first met in September of 1995 to discuss **John Berendt’s *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil***. Moderated by **Bob Tomasulo** and **Wayne Draper** – both of whom went on to later serve terms as president of SAGE – the group’s early meetings were held at the Pride Center when it was located on Oakland Park Blvd. Later venues included the Pride Center when it moved to Andrews Avenue, Borders Books on Sunrise (members were granted a 25% discount if they purchased their books through Borders) and even a coffee shop or two. In recent years the group’s 2nd Saturday of the month gatherings have found a home at the Stonewall National Museum and Archives on Sunrise.

An important focus for any reading circle is how the books are selected. In the case of the SAGE group, book candidates have always been put forth for consideration by the members themselves. At present, suggested book titles are added to a list that is then voted upon every few months. Most of the books nominated are by contemporary writers, but effort is made to at times include notable classics such as **Gore Vidal’s *The City and the Pillar***, **John Rechy’s *City of Night*** and even, recently and memorably, that tough old chestnut, ***Our Lady of the Flowers* by Jean Genet**. Selections have always spanned the gamut with novels, gay history, biographies and memoirs all finding their place and lending variety - the caveat being that the book must be of interest to the gay community and available in paperback; a guideline put in place at the group’s inception.



An average gathering sees between 10 to 14 people in attendance and discussion has always been conversational in nature and thoughtful. Within such perimeters, however, there still exists a lively exchange of ideas, opinions and observations due to the varied backgrounds of the membership. At its best, this mix can bring an unexpected insight as aspects of a book are suddenly seen from a perspective that had not been previously considered. Additionally, there are times when the discussion focuses on how members themselves personally relate to something touched upon in the selected book. This sharing of book-related, individual observation is invaluable because experiences and reactions not normally voiced are spoken of – perhaps for the first time – and what is said can be illuminating both to the speaker and to the listener. This sort of intellectual exchange builds bridges that contribute to a sense of shared identity and camaraderie.

Although instruction has begun and enrollment is closed, watch for announcements of future course offerings.

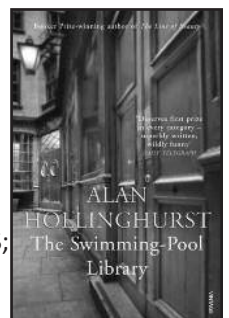

Alan Hollinghurst's 1988 debut novel - ***The Swimming Pool Library*** - is set in the pre-AIDS summer of 1983, "the last summer of its kind there was ever to be".

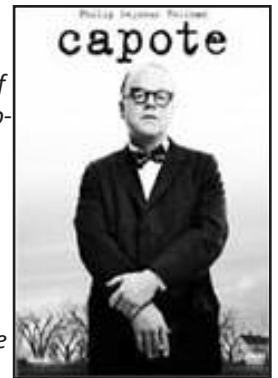
SEE YOU AT THE MOVIES

In celebration of **Truman Capote**, born on September 30, 1924 and died on August 25, 1984, at the age of 59, **SAGE** of South Florida presents **Capote** (2005) written by **Dan Futterman** and based on the book “Capote” by **Gerald Clarke**, directed by **Bennett Miller**, and starring **Philip Seymour Hoffman**, **Clifton Collins Jr.**, and **Catherine Keener**.

Famed writer Truman Capote, southern born and bred but now part of the New York City social circle, is growing weary of his current assignment of writing autobiographical type pieces for the New Yorker magazine. After reading a newspaper article about the just occurred November 14, 1959, cold blooded murders of the Clutter family in their rural Kansas home, Truman feels compelled to write about that event as his next article. While researching for his novel ‘In Cold Blood,’ Capote forms a relationship with one of the killers, Perry Smith, who is on death row.



Capote is a film of uncommon strength and insight about a man whose great achievement requires the surrender of his self-respect. Philip Seymour Hoffman’s precise, uncanny performance as Capote doesn’t imitate the author so much as channel him, as a man whose peculiarities mask great intelligence and deep wounds.

As the story opens Capote is a well-known writer (of *Breakfast at Tiffany’s*, among others), a popular guest on talk shows, a man whose small stature, large ego and affectations of speech and appearance make him an outsider wherever he goes. Trying to win the confidence of a young girl in Kansas, he tells her: “Ever since I was a child, folks have thought they had me pegged, because of the way I am, the way I talk.” Could anyone be less like Truman Capote than Perry Smith? Yet they were both mistreated and passed around as children, had issues with distant and remote mothers, and had secret fantasies. “It’s like Perry and I grew up in the same house, and one day he went out the back door and I went out the front.”

Perry Smith, played by Clifton Collins Jr. is a haunted, repressed man in constant pain, who chews aspirin by the handful and yet shelters a certain poetry; his drawings and journal move Capote, who sees him as a man who was born a victim and deserves, not forgiveness, but pity. Capote tells Perry Smith during one of many visits to his cell, “The world will see you as a monster. I don’t want that.” Capote’s lover, Jack Dunphy, thinks Capote is using Perry. He also thinks he fell in love with Perry.

Capote will be shown on **Monday, August 19th at 4:00 pm** in **Room 204 of The Pride Center**. Run time is 114 minutes.

CHF IS NOT DOA

A diagnosis of Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) does not mean you are going to be labeled DOA (Dead on Arrival). People are living productive lives with CHF. Heart failure doesn't mean that the heart has literally failed or is about to stop working. Rather, it means that the heart muscle has become less able to contract over time or has a mechanical problem that limits its ability to fill with blood. The heart can't keep up with the body's demand, and blood returns to the heart faster than it can be pumped out—it becomes congested or backed up as I-95, 24/7. This pumping problem means that not enough oxygen-rich blood can get to the body's other organs. There are many types (right or left) and stages of CHF. More than 5 million people in the United States have CHF. African-Americans are at increased risk of congestive heart failure. It's the most common diagnosis in hospitalized patients over age 65.



Symptoms

Some of the symptoms are: shortness of breath (dyspnea) when you exert yourself or when you lie down, cough with pink foam mucus, fatigue and weakness, swelling (edema) in your legs, ankles and feet, rapid or irregular heartbeat, swelling of your abdomen (ascites) and very rapid weight gain from fluid buildup. If you experience any of these see your health practitioner or emergency room **immediately**. Do NOT Procrastinate!!!!

Diagnosis

The following tests are done to determine CHF: Electrocardiogram (EKG), chest X-ray, BNP (B-type natriuretic peptide) blood test which determines via a hormone that is a marker of severity and prognosis of heart failure, echocardiogram, Holter Monitor, and exercise stress test.

Treatment

There's no cure for heart failure. Treatment aims to relieve symptoms with lifestyle changes, medications and some surgical procedures. The exact plan depends on the stage and type of heart failure, underlying conditions and the individual patient.

Prevention

The key to preventing CHF is to reduce your risk factors. Lifestyle changes you can make to help prevent heart failure include: not smoking, controlling your high blood pressure and diabetes, staying physically active, eating healthy foods, maintaining a healthy weight and reducing and managing stress.

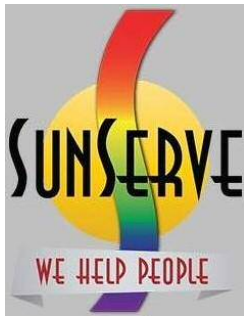

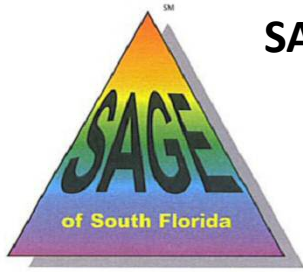

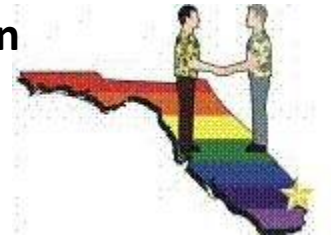
