# NOTES FROM THE MEN'S DROP-IN



Baldwin's Giovanni's Room. While inhabiting this beautiful natural world far removed from society and its constraints, Ludwik and Janusz fall deeply in love; but the passion they share is utterly unthinkable in their repressive communist and Catholic society. Once they return to Warsaw, the charismatic Janusz guickly rises in the political ranks of the party and is rewarded with a highly-coveted position in the ministry. Unable to ignore rising food prices and the stark economic disparity around them, Ludwik is instead drawn toward impulsive acts of protest. Their secret love and personal and political differences slowly begin to tear them apart as both men struggle to survive in a regime on the brink of collapse. Shifting from the intoxication of first love to the quiet melancholy of growing up and growing apart -Swimming in the Dark, by Tomasz Jedrowski -- is a potent blend of romance, post-war politics, intrigue, and history. ## **Get da Right Vac Facts, Jack!**

OY! So, why the OY!? Vaccine **mis**information is floating around like oxygen. Recently, someone emailed post-vaccine facts and the source was **National Geographic.** Granted, **National Geographic** is a reputable organization about geography but I would not say it was about medical science. This article did not even have a listed author. We have to be careful of what and where we read information. This is not easy because we want information and want to tell loved ones. People will believe a complete stranger's word of mouth information more than their medical professionals' and then relate this misinformation to others. Medical professionals know, after their many years of education and experience, that the most difficult people to give medical information is to?????? their parents. Parents see them as "little Gene" not "Nurse Gene." My mother would never listen to me and subsequently lost both her legs due to diabetes. OY!

So, whom do you trust? Reputable science professionals in this pandemic are our most trusted resource and they are at The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Are they infallible? No, but they will correct themselves with scientifically researched facts. We have to trust them. The news media's goal is to give you up-to-the-minute information but it is not always correct. They are out to make money and they want your viewership, enticing you with misleading headlines. The news commercials are always using the words TRUST US and WE are with you. NOT SO. I will not say anything about politicians, especially Governors.

The CDC recommends the Immunization Action Coalition approach for evaluating online health information:

- Who is writing the information online? Wikipedia is NOT reliable. Why? Anyone can change the information.
- Check the "About Us" section. Who is promoting the site?
- Is an original information source stated? if not, is it plagiarism?
- Peer-reviewed have similar health professionals reviewed this information?
- Check the information date. Is it recent? The pandemic information can change in a very short period of time.
- If asked, never reply with personal information such as birthdate, medical history and social security number.

You can also use the time-tested journalism guide to writing and evaluating. Did the article answer the following: "who," "what," "where," when," "why" and "how"? It just takes a little time to check what you are reading before disseminating it to others.

I hope you have received your vaccination and if not, you are trying to obtain an appointment. It will get easier with another vaccine and more organization in distribution. Once you are vaccinated the CDC still recommends the following until they announce it is safe to stop:

Wear a mask over your nose and mouth Stay at least 6 feet away from others Avoid crowds Avoid poorly ventilated spaces Wash your hands often.

Please do not listen to politicians but, rather, listen to science professionals. Stay safe and properly informed. Someone told me a great idea is to take a phone picture of your Vac Card. Wallets are lost or stolen but your phone information is always saved somewhere for easy access.
