


IN MEMORIAM

The E/R or not the E/R --- THAT is the question

A nurse's emergency room stories are always revealing about the public. "It was 3am and I'd been on duty in the Emergency Room since 8am. I was exhausted. A well-dressed man came in with his 8-year-old, healthy-looking, son. I asked him what was the problem. He said, "Well, I was at a wedding and it occurred to me that my son is a little short. Can you give him something right now to make him taller?" Let's face it this is not an emergency, but when should you go to the emergency room, urgent care, walk-in clinic or your doctor's office?

When to go? Symptoms that are best evaluated in an emergency room include:

Chest pain or difficulty breathing Serious burns

Fainting/change in mental state Weakness/numbness on one side

Head or eye injury Concussion/confusion Pneumonia Uncontrolled bleeding

Fever with a rash Seizures

Severe cuts that may require stitches Facial lacerations

Vaginal bleeding with pregnancy Severe cold or flu symptoms

Progressive confusion or slurred speech Mental health or emotional health emergency

Broken bones (especially protruding from the skin) and dislocated joints

The Urgent Care Center

This type of care is designed to handle less serious illnesses and medical situations. If you cannot get to see your practitioner for a same-day appointment you can consider an urgent care center. These are conditions that are not life-threatening but should be treated within 24 hours.

Types of conditions treated in Urgent Care clinics

Fever without a rash Back or muscle pain **Bronchitis** Cuts and minor burns Moderate flu-like symptoms Diarrhea

Earache Skin conditions Sprains or joint pain Sinus infections Upper respiratory infection Dehydration

Vomiting **Urinary tract infections**

Small cuts that may require stitches Allergies especially worse during certain seasons

Walk-in CLINICS as at Walgreens, CVS, Wal Mart, etc.

Painful urination Rashes without fever

Mild flu-like symptoms Cough and congestion symptoms

Sore throat Ear pain Eye redness, discharge or itchiness Sports physical

Vaccinations

If you have to use any of these facilities make sure you bring a list or the actual bottles of all your medications (prescribed, over the counter, and herbs). Also, a list of medication allergies, previous surgeries and information from other practitioners. An easy way to keep all this information readily available is on your smartphone. Check your health insurance carriers for coverage for these facilities. Many times, it may cost you less.
