

SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

Strobing lights and dark rooms; drag queens on counters; first kisses; last call: the gay bar has long been a place of solidarity and sexual expression—whatever your scene, whoever you are seeking. But in urban centers around the world, they are closing, a cultural demolition that has Jeremy Atherton Lin wondering: What was the gay bar? How have they shaped

him? And could this spell the end of gay identity as we know it?

In Gay Bar: Why We Went Out, the author embarks upon a transatlantic tour of the hangouts that marked his life, with each club, pub, and dive revealing itself to be a palimpsest of queer history. In prose as exuberant as a hit of poppers and dazzling as a disco ball, he time-travels from Hollywood nights in the 1970s to a warren of cruising tunnels built beneath London in the 1770s; from chichi bars in the aftermath of AIDS to today's fluid queer spaces; through gloryholes, into Crisco-slicked dungeons and down San Francisco alleys. He charts police raids and riots, posing and passing out—and a chance encounter one restless night that would change his life forever.

The journey that emerges is a stylish and nuanced inquiry into the connection between place and identity—a tale of liberation, but one that invites us to go beyond the simplified Stonewall mythology and enter lesser-known battlefields in the struggle to carve out a territory. Elegiac, randy, and sparkling with wry wit, Gay Bar is at once a serious critical inquiry, a love story and an epic night out to remember. "Gay bars are not about arriving," he writes. "The best ones were always a departure."

One of the New York Times Critics' Top Books of 2021, the SAGE Book Club will be discussing this bygone era in gay culture via Zoom on Saturday, May 14 from 11am to 12 noon.

Heartburn vs Heart Attack

The symptoms of heartburn or a heart attack may overlap and can be mistaken for each other and can have serious consequences. There are more than eight million emergency room visits for chest pain each year and more than half are actually heartburn. So, how do we know the difference?

Heartburn

Heartburn has many names such as acid indigestion, acid reflux, and gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD). Heartburn occurs when your stomach acid flows into your esophagus (close to your heart) and causes chest pain that moves up to your neck and throat. As we age, we become less concerned between the symptoms and the damage to our esophagus. This increases as we get into our 70s and 80s. The causes of heartburn in seniors can be due to the following: aging esophagus valve by the stomach, weight gain, medications (especially blood pressure and anti-depressants), and a hiatal hernia, which causes the upper stomach to push up into the chest cavity.

Heart Attack

A heart attack occurs when one of your coronary arteries that supplies blood to your heart is blocked. The blockage obstructs the flow of blood and oxygen to the heart and your heart tells you with pain that it is dying. Past heart research was performed on white men and now we are aware that our ladies may have different symptoms than men. Ladies may experience the following: pain in the arms, neck or jaw, cold sweat, unusual fatigue, feelings of fullness, indigestion or choking, nausea or vomiting, lightheadedness, dizziness, extreme weakness or anxiety. **Diabetics** should seek medical attention for even slight chest or stomach pain or discomfort.

Common symptoms

Heart attack

- Tightness, pressure, squeezing, stabbing, or dull pain most often in the center of the chest
- Pain that spreads to the shoulder, neck, or arms
- Irregular or rapid heartbeat
- Cold sweat or clammy skin
- Lightheadedness, weakness, or dizziness
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea, indigestion, and sometimes vomiting
- The appearance of symptoms with physical exertion or extreme stress

Heartburn (GERD)

- Burning chest pain that begins at the breastbone
- A sensation that food is coming back into your mouth
- Bitter or acidic taste at the back of your throat
- Pain that worsens when you lie down or bend over
- The appearance of symptoms after a large or spicy meal

If left untreated, heartburn can cause inflammation and narrowing of the esophagus, respiratory problems, chronic cough, and possibly cancer. If you have more than two episodes per week, especially with difficulty swallowing, weight loss or anemia, see your health care practitioner (PCP).

Of course, if you have heart attack chest pain symptoms, call 911 immediately. My father had a heart attack and drove himself from home to the hospital. Do NOT drive if you have symptoms, you may become unconscious or the severe pain will impede your driving. Stay safe!
