



Save The Date: **Saturday, April 22nd**, by popular demand, we return to **Anthony's Clam Bar and Grill**.



#### **A Silent Quiet Act**

We do not talk about it and we are silent when we hear of someone who commits it. The act is suicide. Yes, it is sad and those who contemplate it are going down the rabbit hole and cannot see any alternatives for their pain. Afterward, we are left with a one-word question, WHY? There is help and we who are the families and friends left behind need to be knowledgeable of the signs and symptoms before the act is committed.

#### **Senior Facts**

- U.S. Senior total population is 12%, but we account for 18% of the suicides.
- Seniors plan suicide more carefully and use more lethal methods. Men use guns and women use pills.
- One in four seniors will succeed in suicide while comparison one in 200 youths.
- Men over 65 have a 20% rate while for those over 90 years it's 34%.

#### **Reasons for Senior Suicide**

1. Loneliness. 2. Grief over lost loved ones. 3. Loss of the ability to do self-care and daily activities. 4. Chronic illness and pain. 5. Cognitive Impairment. 6. Financial problems. All of which leads to depression and then the rabbit hole.

#### **Warning Signs**

The most obvious warning sign is an intent to commit suicide. The most important question to ask after they state they want to kill themselves is:

#### Do You Have a Plan?

If they do have a plan, ask what is their plan. A plan is the highest risk for suicide. Your next step is to obtain help. Contact **The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline (988)** which can serve as a valuable resource for helping you determine the next steps. This may make the individual angry at you but anger is better than attending their funeral.

Other signs of suicidal ideation include: depression; prior suicide attempt; hopelessness; loss of interest in activities they used to enjoy; giving away beloved items or changing their will; excessive risk-taking; avoiding social activities; neglecting self-care, medical regimens, and grooming; exhibiting a preoccupation with death; inflexible personality exhibiting difficulty to change; personality change; substance abuse; access to firearms or prescriptive pain medications; or lacking concern for personal safety.

#### **Five Action Steps**

The National Suicide Prevention Lifelines suggest these steps to assist you with someone who is thinking about suicide:

Ask. "Are you thinking about suicide?" and "How can I help you?" initiate a conversation in a supportive and unbiased way. Be sure to listen carefully to their answers and acknowledge their emotional pain. Help the person stay focused on all the reasons why they should want to keep living.

**Be there.** Be physically present to avoid isolation and provide a sense of connectedness. If a face-to-face visit is not possible call, text, or video call. Be sure not to make any promises that you are unable to keep.

**Keep them safe.** Find out if the person has already made any attempts on their life. Do they have access to guns or dangerous medications for their planned method of self-harm? Learning the answers to these questions can help you understand whether this individual is in immediate danger.

Help them connect. If a senior in your life is thinking about suicide, it's important for them to establish support systems they can rely on now and in future moments of crisis. This includes resources available in their local community. Find out if the at-risk person is currently seeing a mental health counselor. If not, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) offers a searchable, confidential directory of mental health providers across the U.S.

**Follow up.** Research has shown that following up can reduce suicide-related deaths in high-risk populations. Once you've had an initial conversation with the vulnerable person and helped them establish a support network, make sure to check-in. This can be done with a quick phone call, text message, or even a card. Ask if there is anything else you can do to help them get through this difficult time. The simple act of reaching out and showing you care can truly mean the difference between life and death.

All Medicare plans cover mental health services. We are our own community to help each other. Attend SAGE social events and keep alive and living well.
